There has been a delay in getting our Window re-caulked in the Prayer Garden area do to the new leak of the roof above the Sanctuary. This leak has been taken care of, and so far we have not seen any other leaks, Praise God! The cost of fixing the roof was \$4900.

We are planning on Tri-State Glass to re-caulk the windows in the Prayer Garden area. This is a much-needed project, the cost for this part of the project will be \$1470.00. We would like to reach out, and ask if it is laid on your heart to help in the area, it would be greatly appreciated.

Our Elevator continued to cause us concern these past couple of months, as the phone was not working which is a requirement to keep our privileges to use the elevator in our facility. Praise God a new phone line has been run from the Elevator to the Pastor's office, and the phone is now in working order. This was done at a cost of \$1200. It is amazing how hard it is to find someone to run phone lines these days, but thanks to Sam Detwiler, he was able to find someone to do the work.

We do have new renters in the parsonage as of March 25. Praise God!

### THE COST OF OBEDIENCE

God has rules/boundaries/requirements for His family.

I get that. Raising two sons, we had those in our small family too.

They were essential to facilitate the smooth, cohesive, healthy, safe functioning of this small nucleus of people living together.

Bottom line was "My house, my rules."

Who gets to decide how things run?

The one responsible for the nucleus.

Do we like all the requirements all the time? No. But as we grow & mature, we understand how necessary they are. We start to observe what goes 'wrong' when we disregard them. But another interesting thing happens... we start to understand the need for boundaries & rules & we grasp the benefits & rewards that come to all of us as a result.

The gift of salvation, the opportunity for me to have a close & intimate relationship with the Creator of the Universe, the God of gods, the King of kings, came at a price. It cost Jesus his life. His obedience came at a cost. It cost him His own will & wants - perhaps wealth, adoration, recognition. It cost Him a future with his earthly family. It cost him the opportunity for marriage & children of His own. It cost Him physically when He was tired, emotional, anguished & depleted. It cost Him unimaginable pain when He knew he could call it all off with a word. It cost Him bearing the filth & shame, the hurt & rage of fallen people. It cost Him allowing every guilt & penalty to be poured on Him so He could pay the ransom for our souls.

He set the highest example of Obedience.

What does obedience cost me?

Luke 9v23: New International Version. (NIV)

"Then he said to them all: 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves & take up their cross daily & follow me.'."

Luke 14:25-33 Good News Translation (GNT)

The Cost of Being a Disciple

25 Once when large crowds of people were going along with Jesus, he turned and said to them, 26 "Those who come to me cannot be my disciples unless they love me more than they love father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and themselves as well. 27 Those who do not carry their own cross and come after me cannot be my disciples. 28 If one of you is planning to build a tower, you sit down first and figure out what it will cost, to see if you have enough money to finish the job. 29 If you don't, you will not be

able to finish the tower after laying the foundation; and all who see what happened will make fun of you. 30 'You began to build but can't finish the job!' they will say. 31 If a king goes out with ten thousand men to fight another king who comes against him with twenty thousand men, he will sit down first and decide if he is strong enough to face that other king. 32 If he isn't, he will send messengers to meet the other king to ask for terms of peace while he is still a long way off. 33 In the same way," concluded Jesus, "none of you can be my disciple unless you give up everything you have."

Can that be true? Is this REALLY what Jesus asks of me to be his follower, his protégé, his disciple, his adopted sister? I mean *Whaaaaaaat*? Isn't that too radical? Too extreme?

That means giving up my free will. It means submitting and surrendering to an 'unknown' path. Shouldn't I be master of my own destiny? Captain of my soul? This teaching goes against everything I've been conditioned to do and be since I could start stringing sentences together.

"If you can dream it, you can achieve it!"

"If it's to be, it's up to me!"

"Dream the impossible, dream big!"

"You can be anything you set your mind to being!"

Why on earth would Jesus say this is what we need to do to follow him? And by the way, what's in it for us?

In essence, that's all He says. No promises, no lures, no carrots dangling from a string. "Either give up everything and follow me, or don't."

Persuade me, Jesus. Give me something to hold on to, to know this will be worth it!. Sometimes eternity with You seems like an eternity away. I've gotta make it through today. I've gotta make it through THIS life first...

In Sunday School we are working through the book 'Not a Fan' by Kyle Idleman. The question that came up in today's reading and discussion was 'What has following Jesus cost you? How has following Jesus interfered with your life?

Allow me to share with you what happened when I made the decision to follow Him – when I took that step towards Him in blind faith & submitted my will and my way over to His leading and direction...

He gave me a family – a spiritual family - bigger than I could have ever imagined. He brought people into my life who brought so much joy! They walked alongside me - to test me, to challenge me, to help me carry a load, to teach me to give, to teach me

to love and forgive.

He opened my eyes to how much He's around me and how He takes delight in surprising me with little gifts throughout each day – no matter what circumstances surround me. He sees me. He hears me. He knows me. And if I stay tuned in to Him, I see how involved He is – even down to the innermost thoughts I have.

When I heed His direction & leading, He raises me up to shine better than I ever did when I did things in my own strength.

He didn't take away the hard things, or the sad things, or the heartbreaking things, but He gets into the trenches - right alongside me - and helps me navigate through them. He softens my heart in the process and molds me, shapes me, matures me. And He grows His wisdom in me.

He heals my soul. He works ever so gently to peel away my defences to reach the deepest hurts & then He tenderly calls me to look at them. He has all the time in the world, so He has no need to rush this process. He'll go as far as I am able, allowing me to rest awhile & then come back to continue the healing journey.

And through walking with Him long enough, I see His steadfastness, His loyalty, His faithfulness, His absolute commitment to me.

I begin to understand amazing Grace. I begin to understand unrelenting, unending Love. And I understand how important it is for others to experience Him too!

As I learn to let go of all that I want to fix, manage & control, I am starting to understand that to lose my life, for His sake, will help me find it...
