### Agriculture

Entries close in this department at 4:00 PM Thursday, July 18, 2024.

All products of the soil must have been grown by the exhibitor during the present year, except as otherwise stated, if found, otherwise he will forfeit all premiums.

**Sheaves** should be 3 inches in diameter at center band.

**Apples** and other fruits should be free from disease and mechanical injury. The color should extend well down in the basal end. Missing stems should be scored against.

**Potatoes** should be free of injury, disease, and uniform for the variety. They should be true to variety entered and uniform in type, quality and size.

**Onions** The skin should not be broken and the outer skins must not be removed. The neck should be small and dry.

- 1. To avoid waste, a small piece of each pastry will be placed on a smaller plate to leave for the duration of the fair; you may pick up your larger baked goods on Friday, July 21, 2023
- 2. CANNED GOODS---Include recipe, method of canning and processing time. When canning tomatoes, to ensure safe activity in whole, crushed or juiced tomatoes, for a quart use 2 tablespoons lemon juice or ½ teaspoon citric acid per quart.
- 3. BAKING---Please do not use any mixes, except for DIVISION 43B and 44B.
- 4. Entries close at 4:00 PM Thursday, July 20, 2023.
- 5. The Judging of perishables will start at 5:00 pm Thursday, July 20, 2023
- 6. All entries must be on heavy paper plates and covered with a plastic bag nothing is to be displayed in a pan.
- 7. A recipe card must be included to be eligible for judging.
- 8. All exhibits must be the products of the exhibitor and all canned goods must have been prepared in the current year.
- 9. All canned goods must be exhibited in standard canning quart and pint jars-except jams and jellies. (All entries exhibited in other containers will be rejected.)
- 10. NO HIGH MOISTURE PRODUCTS—such as cheese cake. No cakes baked in sealed jar.
- 11. Canned goods that are sealed will not be opened, except jellies and jams. **NO ZINC OR GLASS LIDS will be accepted**. Jellies must be sealed. (NO PARAFFIN)
- 12. The judge will award premiums only to articles entirely finished. When there is only one article in a class, a premium will be awarded only if the article is deserving of a premium.

All entries must be accompanied by a 5"x 8" or smaller card with the history or story of the item.
