December is a very special and magical time of the year in Italy as they celebrate a number of significant Festas and Saint days all across the region. It all starts on December 4th when Italy celebrates St. Barbara. That day is significant as St Barbara is the patron Saint of the Italian Navy, and is especially celebrated in Paterno, Sicily. On December 6th, Italy celebrates St. Nicholas Day which in Italy is the patron Saint of the poor, with traditions like children leaving out letters and shoes for gifts like candy. It has also been said that in some areas of Italy unmarried women may



perform special rituals to find a spouse. This tradition is primarily celebrated in Bari, Puglia and Molfetta. On December 7th, St. Ambrogio is celebrated primarily in Milan. The Feast day basically kicks off the City's Christmas Season and includes many religious services and cultural events. December 8th is when we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. This Feast day celebrates the Immaculate Conception of the blessed Virgin Mary, 9 months before the Feast of the Nativity of Mary. On December 13th they celebrate the Feast of Santa Lucia. St Lucy in Italy is a figure like Father Christmas who brings gifts to children which is also celebrated in the south of Italy like Sicily. Then of course on December 24th, Christmas Eve is celebrated which is called Vigilia di Natale. Also on Christmas Eve Italians celebrate Babbo Natale when he brings gifts for children under the Christmas Tree either by calling him Santa Claus or Babbo Natale. This day is then followed by Christmas Day on December 25th. It's a very religious day for Christians as we celebrate the birth of Jesus and it's also seen as the salvation and a foundation for the Christian faith. On December 26th we celebrate the Feast of Santo Stefano. This day in Italy is a public holiday that honors St. Stephen as the first Christian martyr and one of the first deacon of the Church. On December 31st, New Year's Eve Italians celebrate St. Sylvester which is know as La Festa di Silvestro. The holiday honors Pope Sylvester I, who died on that day 335 AD, and his legacy is celebrated with feasting, fireworks and Church services. Then on January 6th, Italians across the region celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany with a National public holiday.



Epiphany marks the end of the Christmas period and commemorates the 12th day of Christmas when the 3 Wise Men arrived at the manger bearing gifts for baby Jesus.

In closing, Brother Frank and I would like to wish you and your family a very Merry Christmas, and a Safe, Healthy and Happy New Year These are special days we should enjoy with family and friends and reflect on just how blessed we are to share time with our love ones. I also would like to mention that our Lodge is very fortunate that we can give back. In December we are making the following donations to two worthy charities. We recently presented a check in the amount of \$2,500.00 to an organization called *Friends* of Karen. Friends of Karen is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that provides comprehensive support to families with a child diagnosed with life threatening illness such as Cancer.
