CSJ Christopher Columbus Award "Discovering The Truth"

Over the past few decades many myths and falsehoods have been spoken about Christopher Columbus. Today these falsehoods are being repeated on social media and in our classrooms at the detriment of Columbus and Americans who celebrate Columbus Day.

ASSIGNMENT:

This award is open to students in grades 11-12 and who are children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews of lodge members in good standing. The student must select one of the many anti-Columbus myths being repeated today and prove it wrong using reputable sources.

Here are some common myths that can be proven false:

- 1. Columbus thought little of the natives and abused them.
- 2. Columbus committed genocide.
- 3. Columbus brought slavery and imperialism to the New World.
- 4. Columbus' goals were gold and slavery.
- 5. Columbus cut off the hands of natives who did not provide their share of gold.
- 6. Columbus was happy and willing to institute the practice of encomiendas.
- 7. Columbus engaged in sex trafficking.
- 8. Columbus raped native women and/or ordered his men to rape.
- 9. Columbus was short-tempered, heartless, narcissistic, ruthless and vindictive.
- 10. Columbus was a racist.
- 11. Columbus didn't discover anything.
- 12. Columbus was sent back to Spain in chains for abusing the Indians.

You can choose a topic from the above list or a new Columbus defamatory myth you wish to disprove.

You can disprove the myth in one of two ways:

- 1) **Essay**: Write a 500 (minimum) word essay stating what anti-Columbus falsehood is being repeated today on social media or in our classrooms and prove why it is wrong.
 - a) The completed assignment must be typed (handwritten submission will not be accepted) and submitted on time in order to be considered for the contest. A copy of the scoring rubric for the contest is available below.
 - b) A separate page should contain the bibliography of resources used and referenced in your essay.
 - c) The essay should be emailed to the CSJ: (CSJP3Chair @ gmail.com
 - d) A scanned copy of the application form must also be emailed to the CSJ: CSJD3Chrice gmill com

- 2) Video: Compose a 3-minute (minimum) video stating what anti-Columbus falsehood is being repeated today on social media or in our classrooms and prove why it is wrong.
 - a) The video can be as creative as you want it to be and contain visuals, animations, and graphics that help prove your point.
 - b) In the video you should reference resources that help prove your point
 - c) The final 5 seconds of the video should show a bibliography of resources used.
 - d) Video files can be big so if you can't email it, you can upload the video to your google drive and make it shareable with: CSJD3Chaic@gmail.com

e) A link to the video should be emailed to the CSJ: CSJD3Chriv@gmqil.com

f) A scanned copy of the application form must also be emailed to the CSJ: CSJD3Chriv@gmqil.com

The deadline for these submissions is June 1, 2025. The scoring rubric for this contest is available below. Awards will be distributed as follows: 1st Place: \$1000, 2nd Place \$500, and 3rd place \$300
