Community News – Covid

All members of the public are reminded that new Covid Protection Measures are in place:

- Face coverings are required by law in most indoor settings
- Office workers who can work from home should do so.
- Certain venues and events will be required by law to check that all visitors aged 18 years or over are fully vaccinated, have proof of a negative test in the last 48 hours, or have an exemption.

NHS Covid App

Using the NHS COVID-19 app helps stop the spread of the virus by informing you that you have been in close contact with someone who has since tested positive for COVID-19, even if you do not know each other.

You can also use it to check in to venues with an NHS QR code and receive advice if there has been an outbreak.

The app is free and easy to use and doing so can help you protect your loved ones and others.

2022 Campaigns - Protect your phone

With lots of people receiving new Phones for Christmas its important to protect yourself from being a victim of mobile theft.



Don't leave your phone, iPad, tablet or camera unattended, out of your sight or left on a table – thieves can grab a phone from a table in seconds.

Always be aware of your mobile and your whereabouts and act accordingly. And when you've finished using it, put it away.

Ensure you retain a record of your phone's IMEI number. This is a 15-digit unique number which can be obtained by keying in *#06#. You need this information if the phone is lost or stolen. And don't keep a note of it on your phone as it defeats the object.

December 2021 Crime Update

Bebington Ward - Monthly Update

Burglary:

There were 6 incidents of burglaries and attempted burglaries in the Ward received during December. The incidents occurred around Erfurt Avenue, Woodhey Road, Violet Croft, Bracken Lane, Lough Green and Friars Close.

One of these incidents involved parcels being left by a courier in an insecure location and these were subsequently stolen.

In the majority of the reports the would-be burglars were disturbed and left empty handed but not before they had caused damage in their attempts to access properties.

A Local Business was also subjected to a confrontational burglary. It was later discovered this was one of 3 carried out by the same group of criminals.

Theft from Local Shops:

In the run up to Christmas there was an increase in reports of shop lifting from local shops. While we don't usually report this type of Crime on the Newsletter, it's important that members of the public are aware that this type of crime is happening in their area and to remain vigilant. If you see something suspicious report it to the shop or to the Police.

Theft of Motor Vehicle

There was a report of theft of a bike, from a member of the public who had attended a local venue.
