OMMC Pilgrimage toward Racial Justice and Healing

On Saturday, April 18, 2026, nine participants from four Ohio Moravian congregations (Dover First, Schoenbrunn, Sharon, and Redeemer) traveled to the National Afro-American Museum & Cultural Center in Wilberforce, Ohio. We spent about two and a half hours at the site, enjoying a guided tour by the Museum Education Specialist and then exploring on our own.

We learned that this is the oldest national Afro-American museum in the country and is home to over 10,000 artifacts and artworks. The main gallery walks through history from pre-Civil War to today, highlighting the contributions of Black people to industry, education, music, art, and more. Another exhibit, "Queens of the Heartland," was a timeline filled with the many and varied accomplishments of Black women living, learning, working, and creating art in Ohio. We also learned about Black history and education in Wilberforce, Ohio, including the founding of Wilberforce University, one of three historically Black universities founded before the Civil War.

Other exhibits focused on the Black experience during World War II, bringing in details from the American Revolutionary War, the Civil War, World War I, and the Great Depression, and African art removed to the United States and the ongoing discussion surrounding repatriation of art and artifacts.

All of this led to some great discussion and wondering at lunch and on the drive home about Black history in America, how we can promote the value of diversity (especially for those of us who live in less-diverse areas), and the importance of funding and access to sites like this one that share stories of Black Americans that may be missing from our national dialogue and education systems.

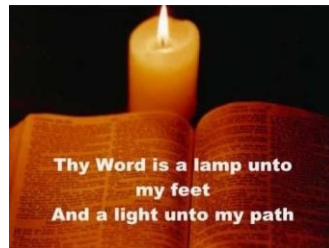
