A dead tree in the front yard of the parsonage was removed by order of the insurance company. Plans were made for the fall festival in October and the homeless Shelter meal in September. Jackie did mention we owe \$12,000 in assessments for the rest of the year and it was decided to share this with the congregation at an upcoming town hall. New security cameras were installed at the church.

Joint Board Meeting Summary: The board met on September, 19th. They discussed plans between boards. They decided that for our anniversary celebration that the church should go out for dinner or have a meal catered, so the women's board does not have to work that night. Doug Miller will research catering vs. going out. Plans are still being discussed about potential directory or t-shirt options. A town hall was scheduled on Sept. 25th to inform the congregation about anniversary planning, the assessments, upcoming events, and to seek feedback with regards to changes in security protocols.
