The board is delighted to share that all assessments have been paid in full for the year. Well done!! The board is hoping to emphasize the furnace fund in the final quarter of the year. We are hoping to hear back from the Larger Life Foundation about our grant by November. A list of maintenance items were set up for the parsonage after last month's walk-through. An update on the lightbulb replacements was given. The board was also notified the property owner at 140 22nd St. SE is applying for annexation into the city of New Philadelphia.

Joint Board Meeting Summary: The board met on Wednesday, September 22nd via Zoom. They communicated activities between boards and discussed COVID-19 protocols. The board feels mandatory masks are working for the congregation given the high rise in cases locally. Pastor Ben will check in monthly to see if any changes need to be made. The board approved signing a letter to the PEC asking if congregations could determine to decide if Synod could be held virtually in 2022.
