Greetings Schoenbrunn Family,

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas! The Christmas season is finally upon us and there is so much to be grateful for. A year ago, COVID-19 cases were spiking across the the country, and an in-person worship service was not possible. This year we will be able to have a traditional Moravian Christmas Eve Candlelight and lovefeast service at 7 p.m. We will have one service and we will have overflow seating in the fellowship Hall. Seating capacity in the sanctuary is limited.

We will also have our lovefeast service at Schoenbrunn Village at 2 p.m. on Sunday, December 5th and we will have our CEC Christmas program during worship on Sunday, December 19th. God is good and there is much to salute this Christmas season! Psalm 145:9 said, The Lord is good to all, and His tender mercies are over all His works."

Christmas is such a busy season. If we are lucky we have finally gotten most of our Christmas presents picked out by Black Friday. It can be an anxious process during the holidays to try to remember everything we need to do and every person we would like to have a gift for. Please, take some time this Christmas season to think about a Christmas present for the church. We would really appreciate a donation to the furnace fund if you are able. We have already raised \$3,9000 and would love to raise at least \$10,000. Any gift goes a long way!

The trustees will be sending a proposal to Church Council for furnace and air conditioning renovations this winter/ spring. We want to take care of this issue before an emergency forces us to do so. This proposal will include 4 new furnaces, an AC Unit, and 3 split air-conditioning units for air-conditioning for the fellowship hall. We were fortunate to be a \$5,000 recipient of a Larger Life grant. With \$10,000 in congregational fundraising, other donations, and funds from the Denzer Trust we are hoping to make these repairs without needing to loan any money. Will you help us reach our goal?

The board discussed a proposal to send to the joint board and church council for furnace and air conditioning replacements and additions. Paula Drumm will be the board nominating committee representative and Rick Swaldo will be the lay appointment.

Joint Board Meeting Summary: The board had a special meeting after worship on November 7th to discuss COVID -19 protocols. The board voted to return to optional masks in worship beginning November 28th, but they still

will be requiring people to wear them when they sing. The board will keep monitoring the situation and make changes when necessary. The board will be meeting on December 13th to send a budget to church council and discuss agenda items for council.
