Moravian Lovefeast Candle Service

The Christmas Eve Lovefeast Candle Service is a combination of two worship traditions within the Moravian Church. The service begins with a lovefeast. The lovefeast is a reminder of the "agape" meal mentioned in Acts 2 and Jude 12 as a common meal of celebration of the fellowship shared in our Lord Jesus Christ. It was first observed on August 13, 1727, following an unusual experience of the presence of the Holy Spirit as a celebration of Holy Communion in Berthelsdorf when Count Zinzendorf observed the brothers and sisters continuing to sing hymns, read scripture and pray together through the dinner hour. He provided some sandwiches and beverage as they continued to meet and thus the lovefeast was born.

The first Christmas Eve Candlelight Service was held in Marienborn, Germany, on December 24, 1747, and was a children's service directed by Johannes von Watteville. That service included the distribution of lighted tapers, trimmed with a bit of red ribbon to the children, and the singing of hymns which spoke of Christ, the Light of the world. He is the "Morning Star," shedding forth the light of truth and the light of his salvation. The custom was brought to America in 1756 with a similar service being held in Bethlehem.

The essential details of the service include the singing of Christmas hymns and carols, the message of Christmas from the scripture accounts, the serving of the lovefeast, the singing of "Morning Star", and the distribution of candles. Traditionally, beeswax candles are used because of their fragrance and the symbol of the purity of Christ. The red trimming symbolizes the shed blood of the Savior for all humankind.

Simple in Spirit, uncluttered in detail, and gentle in tone, this service has become one of the most beloved of all Moravian worship experiences and appeals to the childlike faith nature which all those who follow the Infant King must retain.

As we welcome you, we extend the best wishes of this holy season and invite you to join with us in saluting the newborn King. During the singing of the last hymn stanza in the bulletin, you are invited to hold your candle aloft, symbolic of your welcoming Christ into your heart and your intention to share the light of His love with others.

December 24, 2025

First Reader: Tonight/Today, we gather to remember with the prophet Isaiah:

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders, and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Great will be his authority, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this (Isaiah 9:6-7).

All: We gather to once again bask in the glory that visited a stable and a manger, shepherds watching their flocks, and a young couple cradling the newborn Messiah.

Second Reader: We light the Christ candle as a sign of the glory that came among us in unexpected places and to unexpected people, that we may be people who seek and follow the glory of the Christ child here and now.
