# Victoria Senate - 2022 Federal Election

## Personal' Rating Guide for VIC Senate White Ballot Paper <mark>(above the line)</mark>

Visit AEC: https://www.aec.gov.au/election/candidates.htm Click 'Show all candidates', 'Vic' and 'Senate candidates' to view the entire list of <u>VIC Senate Candidates</u>.

This '<u>personal</u>' rating guide, shows **26** VIC Senate Groups **1** to **26** (above the line); with Morgan C Jonas <u>first</u> (Group R # 1) and then Labor <u>last</u> (Group K # 26). The guide is based on freedom-friendly minor parties/ groups (pro-life &/or pro-liberty), candidates backgrounds, skills, civic experience/ ability, social values, policies, analysis of 'How-to-Vote' preferences and candidate answers on **Reignite Democracy Australia** '*Federal Candidate Survey - 2022*'. https://www.reignitedemocracyaustralia.com.au/myvc/

For any changes to the order shown, please use the column (on the right), '**Own Pref #**' and then re-number in *your* preference order. When voting via a postal application or attending a polling location, use your <u>own pen</u> (biro) and preferably not a pencil (if possible). For a 'formal' ballot paper, you must number 6 squares (<u>above the line</u>) on the **WHITE** Ballot Paper (Senate), starting with "1" for your choice. If a voter chooses to **number ALL boxes** (squares) <u>above the line</u>, then this ensures their vote is not wasted. If any boxes are left blank, there's a risk e.g. a dishonest counter may number an empty box, rendering the ballot paper informal (unlikely but possible).

For any **VIC Voters (Electors)** who *prefer* to number squares for *individual* Senate candidates, <u>below the line</u> – you must consecutively number at least 12 boxes (1 to 12). It is however, strongly advised to number *more* than 12 boxes (*below the line*). To ensure a 'formal' ballot paper, an elector <u>cannot</u> number boxes which are BOTH above and below the line. Electors **must choose** to vote <u>either</u> above or below the line, on the white ballot paper.

### **Recommendations:**

- 1. For a 'rated' listing of **79 VIC Senate candidates (***below the line***)**, visit website https://votewisely.godaddysites.com/
- Go to webpage 'SENATE RATING GUIDES' and download VIC Senate BTL pdf showing 79 candidates and review the <u>below the</u> <u>line</u> order. If needed, use the column 'Own Pref #' and renumber to suit your own preference order (1-79).
- Once satisfied with either the list of 1 to 26 (above the line) OR, the list from 1 to 79 (below the line), keep a copy for voting.
- 4. When numbering the Senate white ballot paper, take your time <u>carefully</u> and <u>accurately</u> in your *own* preference order.

For your first choice, on your white ballot paper, try to avoid writing your number "1" using a lower case "|"; as this could potentially (fraudulently) be changed to a 4 or a 7. Instead of "|", use  $\mathbf{I}$  (in pen). For numbering a square with a "7", put a small horizontal line across 7, like this  $\mathbf{T}$ . If you make a mistake on your ballot paper,  $\underline{DO}$  **NOT** put a line through it and write the correct information beside it. Just ask for a fresh ballot paper. Choose your *own* candidates (Groups/ Parties/ Independents) for the **VIC Senate** *either* above or below the line, on the **WHITE** ballot paper, in *your* preference order.
