For <u>Legislative Assembly</u> (small ballot paper), NSW voters need to number one box with their #1 preference; *however*, it is recommended to number <u>all</u> boxes in a preference order on small ballot paper. <u>Remember to use a pen not pencil</u>.

For <u>Legislative Council</u> (large ballot paper), NSW voters have a choice of either numbering *above the line* or *below the line*. If voting *above the line*, a voter must number at least one box with their number #1 preference; but it is recommended to number far more boxes; to help eliminate any possibility of ballot paper tampering and electoral fraud. If voting *below the line*, a voter must <u>number at least 15 boxes</u>, starting with a "1". Again, it's recommended to number far more boxes, because there are 21 vacancies in the Legislative Council (Upper House). Use a pen and not a pencil and mark your "1" with an angle at the top and a line across at the bottom. For the number "7" (if applicable), place a line across the middle, so that it can't be changed to a "1" or a "4". <u>Scrutineers</u> should be mindful that if they see any pencils or pens on electoral counters tables, then this should be raised with the <u>NSW Electoral Commission</u> supervisor-in-charge and the writing items removed. This is to help prevent any potential marking of formal ballot papers.
