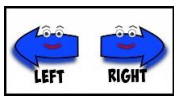




Tasmania 2024 State Election

CANDIDATE RATING LIST (Legislative Assembly) 5 Divisions

(Please use this information at your own discretion and vote wisely - YOUR VOTE. YOUR CHOICE.)

This is a discretionary rating list of 7 preferred Candidates for each of the 5 Divisions (**BASS, BRADDON, CLARK, FRANKLIN, LYONS**), based on support for good family-friendly values, civil ability, skills and experience. 35 Candidates were selected through researching their online profiles, viewing political party websites, election news sites, social media pages and other relevant websites. Also, a good balance of males and females was considered for the chosen 35 Candidates (7 in each of the 5 Divisions).

For Tasmanians voting in their own Division (Legislative Assembly) using the ballot paper issued by the Tasmanian Electoral Commission, **Voters MUST** number a minimum of 7 boxes starting with their preferred choice at #1, then 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7. However, it is recommended Voters number *all* boxes on the ballot. Members in Legislative Assembly (Lower House) who voted for/against Euthanasia

Tasmanian Parliament Hansard recorded on Thursday, 4th March, 2021 (page 131), 16 “Ayes” and 6 “Noes”. 5 Liberal, 8 Labor, 2 Greens and 1 Independent = 16 “Ayes” who voted *for* euthanasia “End-of-Life Choices Bill (Voluntary Assisted Dying) Bill 2020. There were 6 “Noes” (Liberals) from the listed Members of the Legislative Assembly in 5 Divisions, who voted *against* euthanasia. 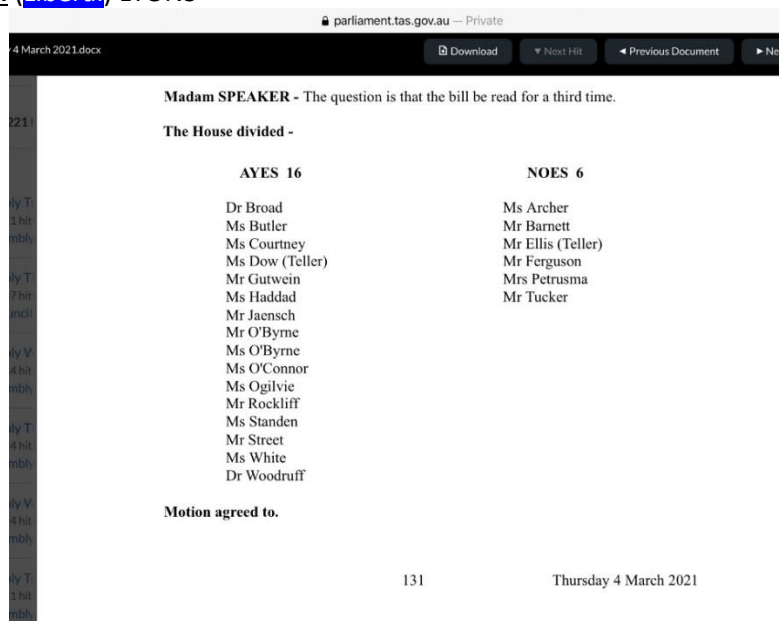

Robson Rotation "is a process of rotating candidate names within each column so that the advantage of appearing at the top of the column or directly below another popular candidate are shared equally between candidates. Neil Robson, a former member of the House of Assembly, introduced the process to the Tasmanian Parliament in 1979."
