

January is Glaucoma Awareness Month

Urgent News: Division of Insurance Bulletin

On January 16, Division of Insurance (DOI) released 3 new bulletins:

<u>Bulletin 2024-01 – "Using Standard Prior Authorization Forms when Reviewing Requests for Applied Behavioral Analysis Services"</u>

Issued to inform insurance carriers and providers of the new standardized prior authorization form to be used when requesting Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) services

<u>Bulletin 2024-02 – "Content of Behavioral Health Wellness Examinations according to Chapter 177 of the Acts of 2022 ("Chapter 177")</u>

Chapter 177 amended Massachusetts law to require that individual or group insured health coverage issued in the commonwealth shall provide coverage for an annual mental health wellness examination. The exam may be performed by a primary care provider or a licensed behavioral health clinician. This bulletin expands on the requirement and provides information on the content of an exam, the coding, and the implementation plans that carriers must submit to the DOI. By February 15, carriers are expected to update their consumer materials to advise covered members about the availability of these exams without cost sharing and to advise providers on billing and reimbursement.

<u>Bulletin 2024-03 – "Step Therapy Protocols Pursuant to Chapter 254 of the Acts of 2022</u> ("Chapter 254")

Step therapy is defined as a "utilization management policy or program that establishes the specific sequence in which a prescription drug for a specified medical condition is covered by a carrier." This bulletin applies to fully insured Massachusetts licensed carriers that provide coverage for prescription drugs and outlines the process to request an exception to step therapy protocols. Exceptions may be requested when the drug required under the step therapy protocol is contraindicated, expected to be ineffective, has previously been tried and was ineffective and thus discontinued, or the patient is stable on a prescription drug prescribed by their provider and switching drugs will likely cause an adverse reaction. The exception request must be acted on not more than 3 business days following the receipt of all information or within 24 hours for urgent situations. Carriers are expected to forward implementation plans to the DOI by February 15th.
