Trail Supervisor Report

We'll soon be out enjoying our well groomed trails and it's never too early to start thinking Safety First. It's inevitable that sooner or later you'll be sharing the trail with grooming equipment. It's important to respect the work that our operators do to smooth and restore the trails to a safe condition. Please follow these quidelines when approaching a grooming machine:

 Always yield to grooming equipment. Slow down when approaching or overtaking the machine. It only travels between 5 to 8 miles per hour.



- When approaching an oncoming groomer, do so with caution and move over to the far right of the trail. This equipment is very wide and may take up most or all of the width of the trail. It's possible you may need to stop on the very far edge or off of narrow winding trail sections.
- When overtaking equipment from the rear, slow down and assess the situation. If there is good sight distance and clear trail ahead, pass the groomer with caution. Many times the groomer will move to the side. when possible, and slow or stop so you can pass.

Club News

First of all I'd like to Last March at the Board of thank Travis, Robert Director's meeting, a motion passed to purchase a 2018 Pisten Bully 400 Trail. This was a demo machine from the groomer show in St. Germain and was purchased at a discounted price.



Several operators test drove the machine and overwhelmingly gave their stamp of approval. They felt that the much heavier Dubie drag, also purchased last year, would do a better job of grooming when pulled behind this machine, which has a significant upgrade in horsepower.

Also this past fall, an agreement was reached with the Willow Region Sportsman's Snowmobile Club to help them maintain and groom their trails. As a result, one of our two Trail Bullies will be stored in their equipment shed.

By-Law Amendment

At the November meeting, the General Membership unanimously passed the By-Law and Policy amendments recommended by the Board of Directors last spring.

Our fiscal year will now begin May 1st and end April 30th. Items approved in the budget over \$500 no longer need to be approved a second time by the Board of Directors. Also, the President is now authorized to sign loan documents approved by the Board.

Trail Pass Information

Everyone who uses Wisconsin snowmobile trails must display a **Trail Pass Sticker** on the middle of their windshield (or in a highly visible location if there is no windshield). You may also ride with a receipt for up to three weeks after a trail pass is purchased.

To order your Trail Pass you must know the registration number of your snowmobile and to order the discounted pass through the AWSC, you also need to know your membership number (found on your yellow membership card or on the mailing label of the WSN magazine).
