Good ole Summertime


Not so far this year! The weather has been wet and the winds off the scale. "The South Jersey Flying Circus" was cancelled on Saturday morning of the contest since only three contestants showed. The wind that morning was just below unflyable. Pat Ciambrello and Karl Seemuller were there and Da Prez showed up a bit later. Didn't take long for the wind to cross the line and for the rain to start. I left the field at 11:30. Sunday morning the wind was a little kinder. Andy Kovac and Bruce Forster flew. Once, again we were forced off the field come late morning.

This year I pushed the Flying Circus back into May, since the weather in April is tricky. The flying Circus is not a viable contest. Cut short in 2023 due to a heavy thunder storm. Canceled ahead of time due to high winds with 60 mph gust in 2024. Then 2025 canceled due to the lack of contestants caused by a very poor forecast. The contest coordinator would like to verry much discontinue the "South Jersey Flying Circus" (*This is where I ask what you want, so let me hear it*)
