## From the Oval Workbench

How many of you got that government letter that started out "Greetings". I never did but I'm sure many of you did, and to those I say, Thank you for your service!!

This chapter, a few tips I've learned over the sixty plus years in this hobby. First, and I just learned this from Ken Bagdon, your friendly WaWa has some wonderful coffee stirrers made of, I think, bamboo. They're about 9" long and best of all have a cross section approximating an airfoil!! So, if you're not building down to the last 1/10 of a gram, they might be useful as struts, etc. With nitro-cellulose glue getting hard to get, try this. For a test run use a large jar lid and fill it with nitrate or butyrate clear dope. Allow it to sit for a while as the thinner bit evaporates. Once it gets to the viscosity you like, VOILA!!!, glue!! Now you just need to find a way to dispense it. Celluloid. Don't know about you but my local "hobby shop" carries clear plastic thick enough to replace the windows in your home. So many years ago, I discovered that you could take your old film negatives, (remember them?) I bet you have a box full of old photos with negatives in the attic!!). Anyway, just soak the old negatives in bleach for a few minutes and all the color comes off leaving a nice clear piece of celluloid!

As you probably know, our April contest has been cancelled. When checking the weather early in the week, we realized our only option was to cancel. We didn't want to, but forecast winds are for 20 ro25mph w/gusts on Saturday as high as 35mph. Sunday 12 to15. The fields Are striped or under construction, The fields that are left are only good for up 8-10 mph. canceling was the only choice.
