

Water Quality Committee Joe Heitker

The Lake Lorelei Water Quality Committee began testing in May 2013. The Committee continues monthly E. Coli, Dissolved Oxygen, Temperature, pH and Clarity testing to assure our lake is healthy for both wild-life, fish and most importantly boating and swimming.

Why is **E. Coli testing** important during the beach season? We test our beaches for E. coli bacteria bi-weekly for pathogens that might pose a human health risk. Sources of E. coli include wildlife excrement, leaking sanitary sewer systems, and pet waste (This is why we don't allow pets on the beach). This testing is important to assure us that our lake and beaches are safe for swimming. The reports are given to the Lake Director who will make decisions, when necessary, to notify the residence of any levels that are detected to be unsafe for recreation purposes and if needed closure of beaches when unsafe to swim. We are thankful to the WQ Volunteers who collect the samples and our board for budgeting for this testing at a certified lab. Fortunately, our lake has had a very good record. Let's continue to keep our lake healthy.

Once a month starting in March and continuing through October water samples are taken at 8 locations throughout the lake starting at the surface and going to the bottom. (25'deep at the dam). **Testing is done for DO (dissolved oxygen), temperature and pH levels.**

Why are we testing? Our testing is considered an important measure of water quality as it is a direct indicator of an aquatic resource's ability to support aquatic life.

Dissolved oxygen and temperature are two of the fundamental variables in lake and pond ecology. By measuring dissolved oxygen and temperature, we can gauge the overall condition (health) of the lake. Aquatic organisms need dissolved oxygen for their survival. While water temperature also directly influences aquatic organisms, it regulates dissolved oxygen concentrations within a lake.





Why Do Lakes Need Oxygen? Dissolved oxygen (DO) is the amount of oxygen in solution. Without oxygen, lakes could not support life. All organisms in a lake, from fish to insects to plankton, need oxygen for respiration. During respiration, organisms consume oxygen and give off carbon dioxide while absorbing food molecules to obtain energy for growth and maintenance. Since different organisms survive at different optimal oxygen levels, the amount of DO determines which organisms a lake can support. Higher oxygen contents are needed by some species, such as bass, crappie, and bluegill. Other species, like carp and catfish have adapted to survive under low oxygen conditions. Even plants respire at night when lack of sunlight prevents photosynthesis. Decomposition of dead plant and animal material also requires DO. In addition, DO concentration controls important chemical reactions in bottom sediments of lakes.

Oxygen is introduced into lakes in a variety of ways. Wind and wave action bring oxygen into waterbodies. Inflowing streams can also carry DO into lakes and ponds. In sunlight, aquatic plants and algae produce oxygen within aquatic ecosystems through photosynthesis. Aquatic plants and algae produce oxygen as a by-product of photosynthesis by day. But at night, they consume oxygen through respiration. groundwater inflow, and water temperature.

Water Clarity - Why is it important? Testing lake water for clarity is important because it can indicate the overall health of the lake ecosystem and reveal potential problems. Water clarity is often measured with a Secchi disk, which reflects the amount of suspended material in the water, including sediment, algae, and other particles. Reduced clarity can signal issues like excess nutrients, harmful algal blooms, or sediment pollution, which can negatively impact aquatic life and recreational uses.



As stated earlier, we are very fortunate that our testing continues to show that our lake is healthy. Thank You for keeping our lake healthy for wildlife, fish and most importantly boating and swimming

FUN FACTS: Did you know the average water temperature in our lake in March is in the low 50o's, in April the mid 50os, the mid 70os in May and June and will stay in the upper 70's and low 80's in July and August before dropping back down to the 60o's in October.

DO levels between 80 and 125% are excellent levels for most aquatic life. Our testing has shown that our DO levels in the first 15' of water throughout the lake fluctuate between 70 and 125%. As the water warms up the DO levels in the deeper water do drop below 70%. This is normal and why most catfish are caught in the deeper water in the summer. Lake Life: Lazarus Lizards Lee Duncan

If you're a full-time resident at Lake Lorelei, you won't see any "Lazarus Lizards" in your landscaping, but if you visit friends closer to town or go to a Reds game, you have a good chance of seeing a few. We definitely have them in our neighborhood in Newport, which means they made it across the mighty Ohio River — either by floating across on debris, or perhaps by dodging traffic on one of the many bridges spanning the river.

These quick lizards, properly called **European Wall Lizards** (Podarcis muralis), aren't native to our area. The fable goes that in 1951, young George Rau, part of the family that owned the old Lazarus department stores, was vacationing with the family in Italy when he became enthralled with the cute little reptiles and stowed ten of them away in a sock for the trip back to Cincinnati. When back home, George released his smuggled treasures into the backyard of his family's Hyde Park home. But here's the twist: according to genetic studies, of those original lizards, only three successfully reproduced. That means these lizards have gone through what's known as a "genetic bottleneck," and today's entire Lazarus Lizard population, now thriving across Cincinnati and beyond, descends from just those three lucky survivors.

Spotting a Lazarus Lizard isn't too hard once you know where to look. They're usually 6 to 8 inches long, including their tails — with slender bodies, brown or olive backs (often with stripes or speckles), and pale yellow or orange bellies. I consider them beautiful! They love sunny spots and stonework: think rock piles, retaining walls, patios, and old masonry. Sit quietly by a sunny wall and you might catch one basking or dashing out to nab an insect before slipping back into a crack at the first sign of danger.

Ecologically, these lizards have managed to coexist without stirring up much trouble. Unlike some invasive species that wreak havoc, the Lazarus Lizards mostly stick to urban and suburban niches, feeding on small insects and spiders. So far, they don't seem to be displacing native species or causing significant ecological harm, though scientists continue to monitor their spread. In turn, they can provide a meal for local birds of prey and sometimes a quick snack for my daughter's (former stray) doggie, Sansa, who fancies herself an apex predator.

Here are a few fun facts about our reptile immigrant friends:

- Lazarus Lizards can shed their tails if grabbed a defense mechanism known as autotomy. The wiggling tail distracts predators while the lizard makes its getaway. Unlike us — if we lose an arm, it's gone forever — he or she simply grows a new tail.
- It continues to expand its distribution range annually. It has established itself so well in southwest Ohio that it is now considered a naturalized species by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and is protected under state law — the only non-native species so designated.
- Males sometimes perform "push-up" displays in warm weather to show off or warn rivals.
- My six-year-old grandson, Ollie, is somewhat of a lizard-catching savant.

So next time you're out enjoying a sunny afternoon near a stone wall closer to town, keep your eyes peeled. After all, these little lizards have truly **scaled** new heights in Cincinnati!
