As summer activity on the lake increases, please help keep our waterways safe and enjoyable for everyone by following these important reminders.

PWC Safety and Important Lake Reminders

Personal Watercraft (PWC) operators are asked to be courteous and mindful of other boaters, skiers, anglers, and lake residents. Please review the following important safety reminders:

PWC Operating Rules

1. Towing skiers, wakeboarders, tubers, kneeboarders, or any similar device behind a PWC is prohibited.
2. The speed limit on the open lake is 35 mph. All coves are designated No Wake zones.
3. PWC operation is prohibited after sunset, as PWCs are not equipped with navigation lights.
4. Official sunset times can be accessed by scanning the QR code to the right.
5. Do not follow directly behind or jump the wake of any vessel towing a skier, tuber, wakeboarder, or wake surfer.
6. Please observe the lake's counterclockwise traffic pattern.
7. Be mindful that the figure-eight operation creates excessive turbulence, reduces visibility, and makes navigation more difficult for nearby boaters.



Wake Awareness

Remember that no wake may be created within 150 feet of the marina, fuel dock, or launch ramp. Please be especially considerate when others are fueling, launching, loading, or unloading boats.

See something unsafe? Say something. If you witness unsafe or reckless operation on the lake, please submit a report using the Lake Safety Form on the Lake Lorelei website, located under “Association Info” or scan the QR code on the next page. Reporting safety concerns helps Lake Safety identify trends, address problem areas, and maintain a safe environment for all members and guests.

Need a Copy of the Rules?

A one-page summary of lake rules is available at both the marina (located on the counter near the entrance) and the office.

Ohio Boating Safety Reminder

No person shall operate a vessel, water skis, or similar device:

- Carelessly or heedlessly
- Without due caution
- In disregard of the rights or safety of any person, vessel, or property
- At a speed or in a manner that endangers any person, vessel, or property

No person shall operate or permit the operation of a vessel in an unsafe manner.

Examples of unsafe operation include:

- Becoming airborne or completely leaving the water while crossing another vessel's wake within 100 feet, or at an otherwise unsafe distance from the vessel creating the wake

- Operating at a speed or proximity to another vessel, skier, or person being towed that requires either operator to make an abrupt maneuver to avoid a collision
- Operating less than 200 feet directly behind a person who is water skiing, wakeboarding, wake surfing, knee boarding, tubing, or attempting to do the same.
- Weaving through congested traffic

All vessels must be operated in a reasonable and prudent manner at all times.

Thank you for helping make our lake a safe and enjoyable place for everyone.

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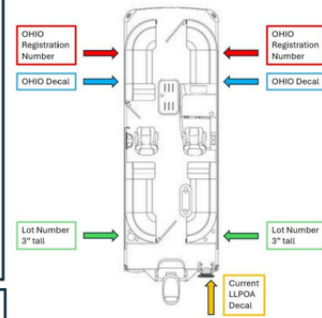
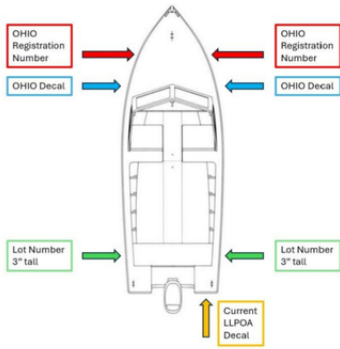
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Lake Lorelei Watercraft and Lake Rules

ALL WATERCRAFT

- **3" LLPOA Lot #1234 displayed on the left & rear near stern visible above water line**
- **Current Year LLPOA Registration Decal displayed on upper right back corner of watercraft**
- **All ID visible while on lift, docked and with cover on.**
- **Display Valid ODNR and LLPOA Identification**



WATER-SKI/OPEN ZONE

Maximum speed

- **35 MPH** Sunrise to Sunset
- **6 MPH** Sunset to Sunrise -Navigation lights required
- **NO PWC** operation after sunset
- All Watercraft Travel in a **COUNTERCLOCKWISE** Rotation to the shoreline

NO WAKE---IDLE SPEED

- Within 20 ft of shoreline&docks
- Within 20 ft of beaches and swimming areas
- Within 150 ft. of Marina Ramp and Gas pump
- NO WAKE IN ANY COVE
- **YELLOW FLAG = NO WAKE IN LAKE**
A "Wake" is defined as a track left by a watercraft in the water causing waves or swells

WAKE-SURFING

- **Prohibited** behind I/Os and Outboards
- **Prohibited 10AM-5PM** on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays (Memorial Day weekend through end of Labor Day weekend)

MULTI- TOWING PROHIBITED

- **10AM- 5PM on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays**
- Includes Skis, Tubes, Wakeboards, Kneeboards.
- **No towing from Jetskis**

LLPOA Boaters

Remember –things change on the lake at Sunset:

- Navigation Lights are required
- No tubing, skiing, or foiling
- No wake boarding, No wake surfing
- No WAKE – Speed limit drops to 6mph
- Watch out for wildlife (i.e. the ducks)

Red flags or a Red flashing light will indicate that the lake is closed to all members.



Yellow flags or a yellow flashing light will indicate that no watercraft may operate beyond a no wake speed.



Green flags or a Green flashing light will indicate that the lake is open.

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When a Favorite Tree Becomes a Problem

Few trees are more beautiful than a healthy Colorado blue spruce. Their distinctive blue needles and symmetrical shape have made them a favorite landscape tree for decades, and many of us have planted them, hoping they would become a permanent part of our property. Unfortunately, Colorado blue spruce has a problem: it's not well-suited to southwest Ohio.

Most (I dare say ALL) of the blue spruces around Lake Lorelei are suffering from a fungal disease known as needlecast. If you've noticed these trees with dead lower branches, thinning foliage, or bare limbs that never seem to recover, needlecast is usually the culprit. The disease causes the tree to lose older needles year after year until only the tips of the branches remain green.

The result is a tree that becomes thinner and less attractive with each passing season. Once significant portions of a tree have lost their needles, those branches won't recover. While fungicide treatments can sometimes slow the disease, they must be repeated regularly and are expensive. For most trees, treatment isn't practical.

What concerns me even more is that needlecast is no longer limited to blue spruce. Over the past few years, I've noticed it spreading to some nearby Norway spruces growing near infected blue spruces. The Norway spruce is fast-growing and beautiful, and is probably the most popular and impressive spruce growing in our region. It's generally more resistant and better adapted to our climate, but no tree benefits from being surrounded by a constant source of fungal spores.

Responsible arborists now discourage planting Colorado blue spruce in southwest Ohio, because the combination of humidity and fungal disease pressure makes long-term success nearly impossible. In contrast, species such as the aforementioned Norway spruce, eastern redcedar, eastern white pine, bald cypress, and native hardwoods are generally much better adapted to our region.

For that reason, property owners with infected blue spruces should seriously consider removal and replacement rather than treatment—or, as is often the case, simply watching the tree continue to decline. While removing a diseased tree will not eliminate needlecast in our area, it can reduce disease pressure and help protect nearby healthy trees.

Perhaps the most frustrating aspect of this disease is that many of these trees were planted decades ago, when they looked healthy and promising. Unfortunately, as our understanding of the disease has improved, so has the realization that this tree is fighting an uphill battle in our climate.

Remember: sometimes the best way to save a tree is to choose a different tree! If your blue spruce is struggling (and I'm sure that it is...), don't *pine* over it for too long.

Summary from our monthly testing (April-June 2026)

The good news:

The lake is behaving normally for early summer. The water near the surface is clear and has plenty of oxygen for fish and other aquatic life. Surface temperatures warmed from about **62°F in early April to 77°F by mid-June.**

What's changing:

As the lake warmed, it separated into two layers:

A **warm upper layer** (top 15 feet)

A **cooler lower layer** (below about 20 feet)

Once these layers form, they don't mix very well.

Why this matters:

The deep water is losing oxygen because fresh oxygen from the surface can't easily reach it. By mid-June, oxygen levels below 20 feet were **too low for most fish and aquatic insects.** A sulfur ("rotten egg") smell was detected in deep water, which is a sign that oxygen has been largely depleted there.

Why this matters:

The deep water is losing oxygen because fresh oxygen from the surface can't easily reach it. Algae activity:

Algae growth appears to be increasing as the water warms.

This isn't unusual for summer, but it is causing: Higher oxygen levels near the surface during the day.

Higher pH (water becoming more alkaline).

Water chemistry:

pH levels have risen above the recommended range, reaching nearly **10** at the surface by June.

This is likely due to algae using carbon dioxide during photosynthesis.

Bottom Line

The lake's surface waters remain in good condition and continue to support fish and recreation. However, the deeper water has become oxygen-poor and is beginning to develop low-oxygen (anaerobic) conditions. Increased algae activity is also evident. These are common summer patterns, but the deep-water oxygen loss should continue to be monitored throughout the summer to see whether conditions worsen or improve.

Simple Takeaway for Residents

If you're swimming, boating, or fishing near the surface, conditions are generally good. Continued monthly monitoring will show whether algae growth and oxygen depletion become more significant later in the summer.

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Rocket Community Wellness Center Project Update

The Rocket Community Wellness Center project is entering its final months of construction and is quickly approaching completion.

For those who may not be aware, Fayetteville-Perry Local School District successfully applied for and was awarded a highly competitive Appalachian Ohio Facilities Construction Commission grant totaling more than \$10.8 million. This transformational project was designed to enhance the overall health and well-being of our students, staff, and community members.

The Rocket Community Wellness Center project is entering its final months of construction and is quickly approaching completion.

For those who may not be aware, Fayetteville-Perry Local School District successfully applied for and was awarded a highly competitive Appalachian Ohio Facilities Construction Commission grant totaling more than \$10.8 million. This transformational project was designed to enhance the overall health and well-being of our students, staff, and community members.

Construction continues to make significant progress. Exterior trim work is approximately 98% complete, and exterior lighting installation is currently underway. Landscaping crews are scheduled to mobilize on June 15, 2026, beginning work around the retention pond and then progressing throughout the project site.

Inside the facility, epoxy flooring in the restrooms is being completed. Plumbing fixtures and accessories have arrived and will be installed once the flooring has fully cured. The final painting is underway, and the indoor turf installation is scheduled to begin on June 15, 2026. Door hardware installation will follow the completion of painting.

The propane tanks have been filled, and the HVAC system has been started and is operational. The Fitness Room is expected to be completed by mid-July and will provide opportunities for individuals of all ages—from school-aged students to senior citizens—to improve their health and wellness. **All staff and community members will have the opportunity to apply for a membership and take advantage of the Wellness Center's many amenities and services.**

Final inspections are scheduled for the week of June 22, 2026. During July, our community partners, ACRMC Family Medicine and Pierson's Pharmacy, are expected to begin preparing their spaces and setting up operations within the facility.

We are excited to announce that a **Ribbon Cutting Ceremony is planned for Monday, August 17th, 2026, at 3:00 pm.** We encourage all community members to attend, tour the facility, and learn more about the many opportunities the Rocket Community Wellness Center will provide.
