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Clubhouse Rebuild Project Update

The CRP continues to be on schedule. The Design Phase was completed in October, and a complete set of drawings was submitted to the County to obtain the required permits.

Eight contractors expressed interest in building our project; the Project Team held meetings and on-site reviews with them to ensure they understood the project. Several builders were impressed with how clean the building was and how much we had cleared out and opened up. Bids were sent to all of them with a due date of December 12. Four builders submitted bids by the due date, and the Project Team reviewed these bids in December.



A decision is expected in early January. The Team has also been actively working with lenders. We are confident we will have a good bank that will provide us with the funds needed to complete the project. One bank we met with shared how organized the LLPOA was and how in control our finances were. The CRP Lead Team is anxious to get the construction started in 2026, with an expected construction period of about 12 months.

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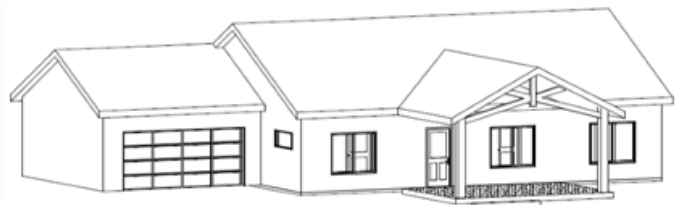
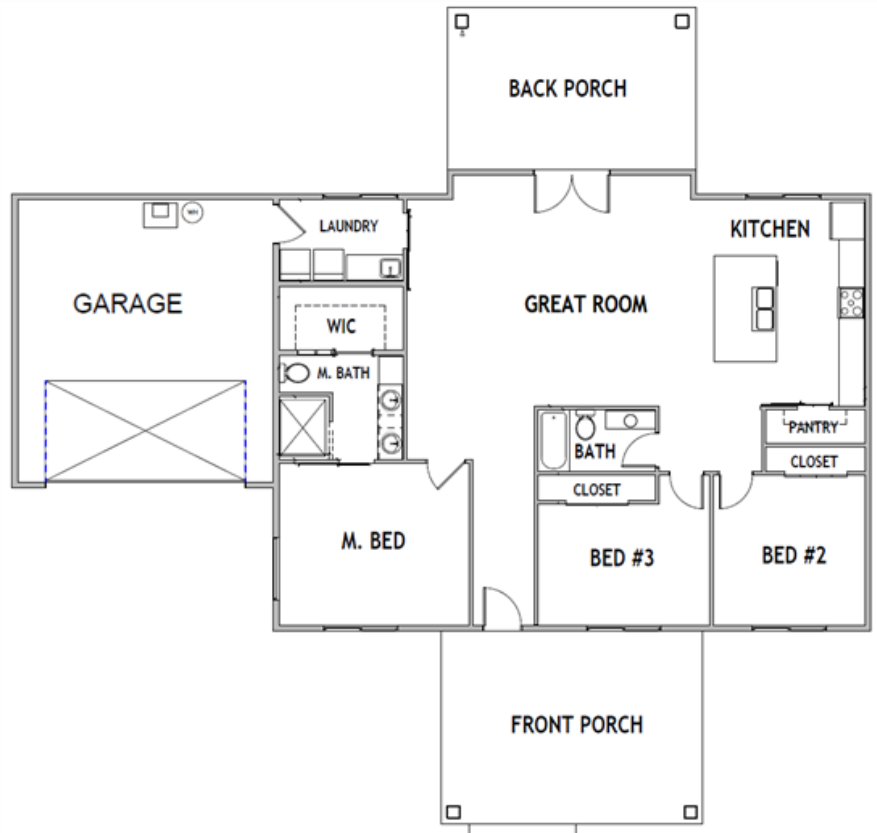


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Getting to a Better Future With a Long-Range Improvement Plan

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Built for the Bang

The other morning, I heard a familiar TAT-TAT-TAT outside, and when I looked, I noticed a downy woodpecker (one of the most common woodpeckers in our area) working a tree in our backyard. Not flitting in and out, not sampling and moving on – but methodically tapping, pausing, listening, then tapping again. It’s a sound I’ve heard all my life, but standing there with a cup of coffee, it struck me how improbable the whole thing really is.

This little bird was making breakfast by slamming its face into solid wood. Repeatedly. On purpose. If you or I tried this, we’d be unconscious by our third “tat”. So how do woodpeckers do it? The short answer is they’re built for it – head to tail.



Start with the skull. A woodpecker’s brain sits snugly inside, cushioned by specialized bone that helps absorb shock. There’s very little room for the brain to rattle around, which dramatically reduces the forces that cause concussions in mammals. Their beaks are straight, strong, and chisel-like, designed to distribute impact forces evenly instead of bending or twisting on contact.

Then there’s the tongue – a piece of equipment so odd it feels like it belongs in a cartoon. A woodpecker’s tongue can be far longer than its beak, and instead of stopping at the throat, it wraps around the skull like a biological seatbelt. The tip is barbed and sticky, perfect for spearing ants, beetle larvae, and other insects hiding deep inside tree tunnels. That drumming we hear? It’s not random pounding – it’s targeted excavation.

Of course, hammering only works if you can stay put. Woodpeckers solve that problem with their feet and tail. Their toes are arranged two forward and two back, giving them a powerful grip on vertical surfaces. Add in stiff tail feathers pressed firmly against the tree, and you get a three-point brace – a living tripod that turns a rough tree trunk into a stable workbench.

All of this didn’t appear overnight. Woodpeckers are the product of millions of years of small improvements. Birds that pecked a little more efficiently found more food. Those with slightly stronger skulls avoided injury. Those with slightly longer tongues reached meals that others couldn’t. Over time, “slightly better” became “remarkably specialized.”

That downy woodpecker in our yard is also a reminder that many of our feathered friends don’t migrate south when winter comes. They stay as residents all year, adapting not by traveling but by specializing – learning every crevice, every insect-rich snag in their home territory.

There’s another detail worth appreciating: woodpeckers aren’t just feeding themselves. By drilling into dead and dying trees, they create cavities later used by bluebirds, chickadees, owls, and squirrels. What looks like destruction is actually the first step in recycling a tree back into the ecosystem.

So, the next time that drumming rings across the yard or echoes across the lake, pause for a moment to consider just what it is you’re hearing: A bird doing exactly what it’s shaped it to do – solving a problem most creatures would never attempt. They have really hammered out a niche – proof that evolution rewards persistence, even when it means banging your head against the problem. You could say woodpeckers have really *nailed* their career choice!

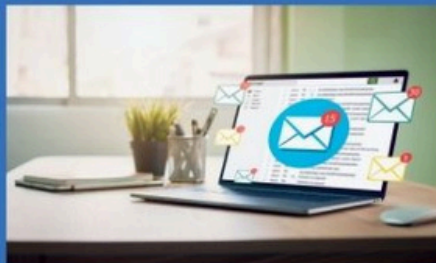

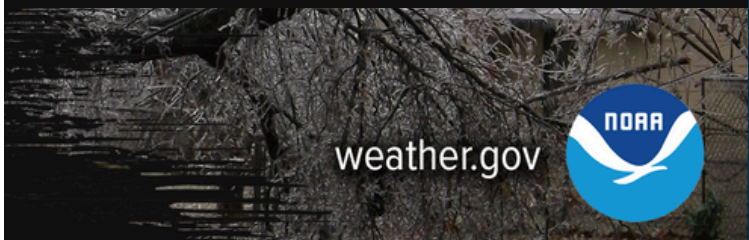
