Board of Trustees - President's Corner Bruce Simeone

Welcome to Spring 2025. I am happy to say we all apparently survived Rain-Mageddon 2025, as I have heard it called. I am sure you, like I, have kept your eyes on the spillway. The rebuild and the "extending life repair work" absolutely performed outstandingly. That said, to answer many of your questions, it is not done. The work today of an epoxy layer as a base plus two additional layers of an epoxy-like cover has been completed. We went up the sides a couple of feet to pass the ONDR inspection and protect the spillway from a penetrating and undermining event like we just had. Unfortunately, we could not complete the rest due to the hours of effort necessary and the drastic temperature fall. We will finish the sides during 2025 when the appropriate weather pattern presents itself. Once the sides are completed, similar to the base, we will put a hardening coat over the entire spillway to complete the project.

With the passing of the Club House resolution, the Clubhouse Committee has begun to undertake the next steps of the project. That progress will be explained later in The Legend. For this article, and with that passing, the BOT was able to accept and sign all the Lake Committee charters and budgets they submitted. As you recall, we started this process in 2023 to obtain better fiduciary control of funds as required by ORC 5312. The process is working, and all Lake Committees are ready to go. Thank you all for your trust. We promise to do the right things right.

We discussed 2025 BOT challenges and work plans in the last open Board meeting. However, I thought it might be of use to lay it out again. That said, every year since 2021, I have challenged the BOT to a Lake Improvement Plan, and 2025 is no different. The work/improvement I have laid out and the BOT has accepted is as follows:

- 1. Successful rollout and execution of electronic voting.
- 2. A successful Club House vote so we can move on with the entire project execution from RFP, bidding, construction, and opening.
- 3. Complete the spillway work as mentioned above.
- 4. Rewrite and bring our Code of Regulations to a community vote so that it conforms to ORC 5312.
- 5. Rip Rap remaining coves to bring all coves up to standards.
- 6. Put a solid process in place to monitor, update, and share the Capital Asset Plan with the Community yearly. (By the way, to those who believe we have only a one-year plan, that could not be more inaccurate. We have a clear 30-year plan with a very detailed current-year maintenance work and a Lake Management Plan.)
- 7. Complete the work on the dredging sites to be able to begin to close out each site in our permit.
- 8. Complete the business definition, as all lakes are dealing with in Ohio, and ensure it is legally correct.
- 9. Begin the new design investigation for valve replacement. Ours has lived longer than even ONDR has experienced or expected. Of course, we must utilize an ODNR-approved company and process as they own the water.
- 10. Begin the process of determining how to tackle culverts that take water away from the lake. They have not been touched for over 55 years and are, in some cases, functioning poorly or not at all.

Finally, I want to thank Todd for his tireless service to the Community and the Board. He is a driving force as Treasurer. We will miss his outstanding ability to stay levelheaded, his late-night calls to keep me in control of my emotions, and, of course, obtaining the loan for the Dredging referendum.

I also want to thank Cindy for her ability to "keep a pulse" on the Community. She is outstanding when it comes to the sequence of presentations, her sense of fairness, and her deep and relentless pushing on topics that she feels are very important.

Clubhouse Update Clubhouse Committee

As you know by now, the clubhouse vote passed with strong support and the Clubhouse Team has been very busy since then. An aggressive timeline has been established to keep the project running full steam ahead, starting with the final design phase through to the construction phase. The finance team has also begun work with the lender to secure a construction loan based upon the funding created under the assessment. Here are some of the detailed highlights:

The Clubhouse Design Team decided to go with a design process, where the lake will hire a design firm to create all the architectural, mechanical and code compliant drawings and documentation for the Clubhouse Project. The team has completed the Design RFP, which has already been sent out to five interested firms. There will be a question-and-answer period at the end of the month for those interested, and their bids are due back in mid-May.

Once the design firm is selected, they will finalize all plans and drawings, which will then be used as an RFP for bidding the construction phase. The goal is to have the Construction RFP go out for competitive bid early in the fall, with the construction contractor selection process completed before year end.

In the meantime, several individuals with specific design, mechanical systems, construction and project management skills have volunteered to assist in evaluating and enhancing the design elements as they come in. If you have relevant experience in any of these areas and are interested in helping the team during either the design or implementation phases, we welcome your assistance! 

Boat Rules Reminder

All watercraft to be operated on the lake must

- be registered with Ohio and display a valid OH decal and the OH number on both sides of the boat,
- be registered with LLPOA and must display a current <u>LLPOA decal</u> on the stern,
- display the <u>Lot number</u> of the boat-owner on both sides of the boat, above the water line, near the stern, with 3-inch color contrasting numbers.

Maximum length for pontoon – 26.00 feet

Maximum length for all other watercraft – 20.00 feet.

No person under the age of 16 shall operate any motorized watercraft, except that a person between the ages of 12 and 15 years of age may operate a motorized watercraft if a supervising person of 18 years or older is aboard.

Towing skiers, wakeboarders or any device such as a tube, surfboard, or similar device is prohibited from all Personal watercraft.

After sunset, all boats must operate at or below no wake speed.

Wake Surfing Rule Change

The board has been reviewing our boating rules to enhance members' safety and overall enjoyment on the water. With this goal in mind, we have updated the rules for wake surfing, effective immediately:

- On Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, wake surfing and wake foiling are permitted only between noon and 5 PM.
- On all other days, wake surfing and wake foiling are permitted from sunrise to sunset.
- These activities are strictly prohibited behind watercraft with inboard/outboard (stern drive) or outboard motors.

Lake Life: The Misunderstood Opossum Lee Duncan

If there were a contest for the most unfairly maligned animal in North America, the opossum would be a strong contender. With their beady eyes, naked tails, and tendency to show up at night, they're often met with fear or disgust. But here at Lake Lorelei—and across much of the eastern U.S.—these quiet little creatures are not only harmless, but they're also actually helpful.

The Virginia opossum, our local species, is North America's only native marsupial. Like kangaroos and koalas, female opossums carry their babies in a pouch. Later, the young ride around on her back—a charming, if slightly chaotic, sight. Opossums are omnivores and scavengers, eating fruit, insects, small rodents, carrion, and even leftovers from your compost bin. Unappetizing as that may sound, it's incredibly useful. Opossums help clean up the environment and reduce disease spread by removing decaying matter from the landscape.

One of the most surprising things about opossums is how many ticks they eat. A single opossum may consume thousands in a season, helping reduce the spread of Lyme and other tick-borne diseases. Some studies estimate they kill over 90% of the ticks that try to bite them. They're like slow-moving, nocturnal pest control.

And despite their strange appearance, opossums are not aggressive and rarely dangerous. In fact, it's extremely rare for them to carry rabies. Their body temperature is too low for the virus to survive easily. If you see one baring its teeth or hissing, it's bluffing. Most often, they'll just run away or dramatically "play

possum" until the threat is gone.

In Newport, Kentucky, where we have a house, there's a local man who rescues injured or orphaned opossums and nurses them back to health. He walks them in a baby stroller through the neighborhood, and they're surprisingly friendly and cute. They even use a litter box in his home! Seeing them up close like that really changes your perspective: it's hard to fear an animal that's snuggled up in a stroller like a kitten in a onesie.

Here at the lake, we might spot one ambling through the woods at dusk or hear it rustling through leaves at night. They're not looking for



trouble—just a meal and a place to curl up. If you encounter one, give it a little space and let it go about its business.

Opossums may not win many beauty contests, but they're gentle, beneficial neighbors. If we take the time to understand them, we might even come to appreciate their oddball charm. At the very least, let's give these misunderstood marsupials a break—they're doing more good than most people realize. They may not be glamorous, but opossums are quietly awesome. In fact, I'd say they're **opawesome!**

Water Quality Committee Kathy Haberer

Happy Spring from the Water Quality Committee (WQC)

As of the printing of this article, I hope that spring is finally here, the rains have moved on, and that the sun is shining brightly! It's that wonderful time of the year here at Lake Lorelei, where we get to enjoy the water and the charm of this lake community.

For those of you who are new to the community and the various committees, the purpose of the Water Quality Committee is to collect data that will tell us about the quality of the water, study best practices of water quality improvement efforts, and educate the community. Being a member of WQC provides an opportunity to learn more about our lake and the lakes that feed into it.

As the lawnmowers begin to roll out and everyone spiffs up their yards, here are a few tips from the WQC and Brown County Soil and Water. First, as you mow your grass, if you are along the lake, make your first pass so the cuttings go back into the grass rather than the lake. If you employ a service to do this job, please let them know about this practice for lawn maintenance. Next, the native vegetation along the edge of the water serves a purpose. This vegetation will absorb nutrients that feed Cyanobacteria, which is the bad algae. Do not use any chemical fertilizers. Look for natural, lake-friendly ways to fertilize the grass. It's best to avoid fertilizing in the spring, but if you must fertilize in the spring, use small amounts of a soluble form of nitrogen, a "lake friendly" or slow-release nitrogen after spring runoff and rains. Several low-level applications are better than a single, large application. Do not apply fertilizers adjacent to seawalls or close to the shoreline. Lastly, we encourage everyone to help move the water around, Either using a jet-ski, kayak, or by boat. Move that water around to prevent algae growth.
