

Meet your **Helper**

A fresh perspective on **Holy Spirit**.

‘Do you not know that **you are a temple of God,**
and that **the Spirit of God dwells in you?**’

1 Corinthians 3:16 NASB

“But **the Helper**, the **Holy Spirit** whom the Father will send in My name,
He will teach you all things *and* remind you of all that I said to you.”

John 14:25 NASB

“Helper.”

The purest Greek context for the term is specifically: One who has been summoned to come beside us. One who gives us courage and boldness.

An **Advocate**, called to our aid. A **Tutor**. An **Instructor**. An Olympic trainer, *one who trains for a race*.

Attributes of the **Helper**.

He is Eternal.

He has always been, He is, and He will always be. He was present at Creation.

Genesis 1:2 NASB: “The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.”

He is our Teacher.

John 4:25 NASB: “But the Helper, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and remind you of all that I said to you.”

He is the **SUPER...** to your *natural*.

Ephesians 3:20 NASB: “Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we may ask or think, according to the power that dwells within us,”

In the presence of God, the smallest effort yields the biggest, and most favorable result.

John 21: 3–6 NASB is a perfect example.

He is the *source* of all Creativity.

1 Corinthians 2:9 NASB: “Things which eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and which have not entered in the heart of man, all that God has prepared for those who love Him. For to us God revealed then through His Spirit, for the Spirit searches all things, even the depths of God.”

The Helper is needed so the “on earth as it is in Heaven” could be fulfilled.

We find an example of this in Exodus 31:1–5 NASB.

The Lord *filled* Bezalel with **His Spirit** and *empowered him for his assignment* of building the tabernacle of meeting and its artifacts according to the pattern that God showed Moses in the mountain.

There are ideas and concepts in Heaven
yet to be released on the earth and we can only access it through the wisdom of Holy Spirit.

The Helper empowers us to rule.

He is looking for those who would yield so they can become agents of change and culture shifters.

Psalms 110:2 NASB: “The Lord shall send the rod of Your strength out of Zion. Rule in the midst of Your enemies!”

If we allow him to... the Helper will empower us with heavenly strategy to expand Our Father’s Kingdom and fulfill the mandate disciple nations.

Joseph.

Genesis 41:38 NASB: “Then Pharaoh said to his servants, ‘*Can we find a man like this, in whom is a divine Spirit?*’”

Joseph the slave’s surrender to God’s Spirit as he interpreted the ruler’s dream took him from the pit right to the palace; the Holy Spirit empowered him to rule with the assignment to safeguard the future generations of the sons of Abraham.

Daniel.

Daniel 5:11a NASB: “The queen entered the banquet hall because of the words of the kings and his nobles; the queen spoke and said, “O king, live forever! Do not let your thought alarm you or your face be pale. There is a man in your kingdom in whom is a spirit of the holy gods; and in the days of your father, illumination, insight, and wisdom like the wisdom of the gods were found in him.

Daniel 5:12 NASB: “This was because an extraordinary spirit, knowledge and insight, interpretation of dreams, explanation of enigmas and solving of difficult problems were found in this Daniel, whom the king named Belshazzar. Let Daniel be summoned, and he will declare the interpretation.”

Daniel the statesman’s surrender to the Spirit of God gave way to an impeccable reputation of receiving complex strategies for problem solving through the counsel of the Lord, that sustained the survival of the Jewish people in Babylon until their return to Jerusalem 70 years later.

The Spirit of God empowered Daniel for his assignment.
