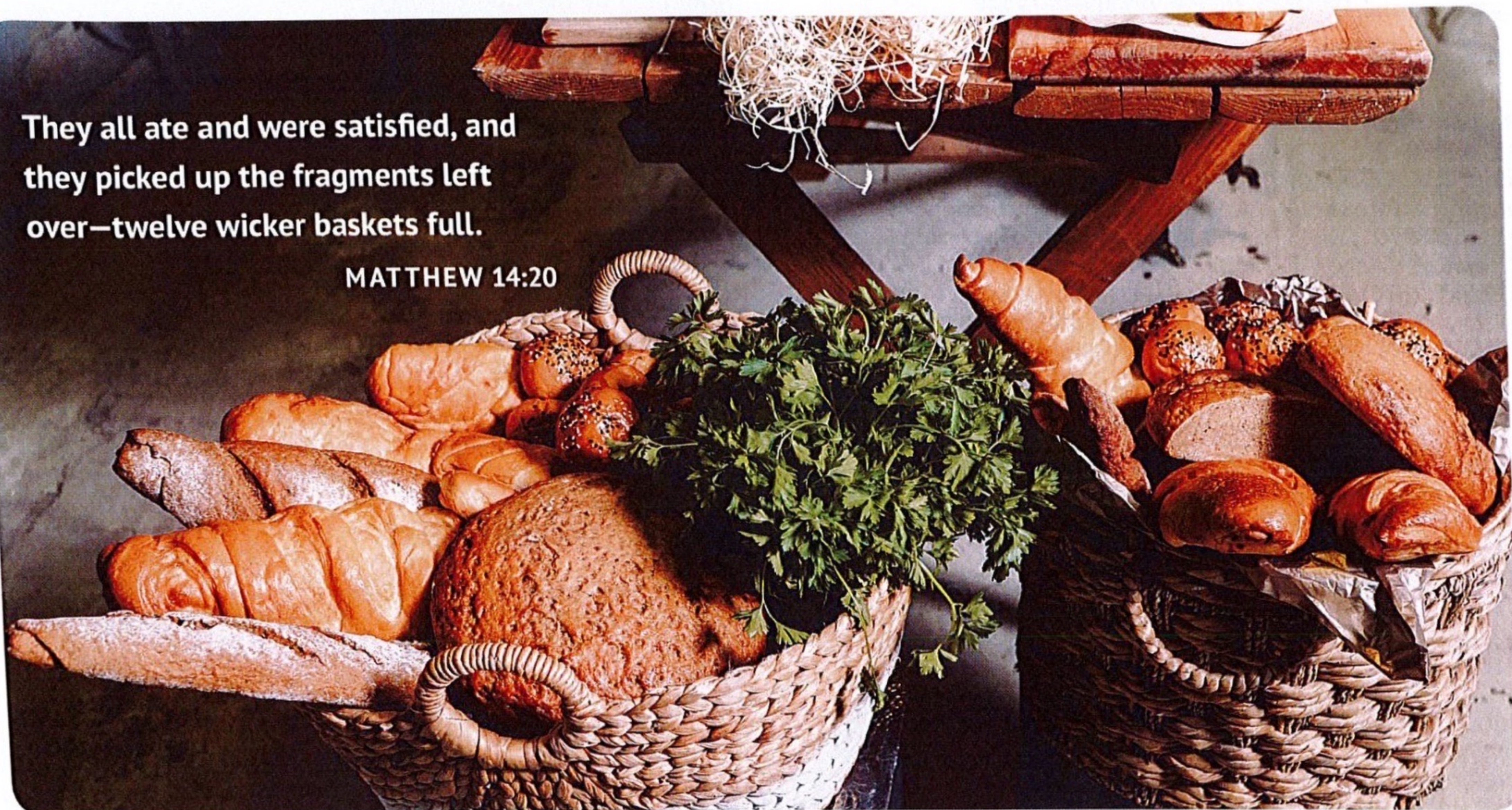

Seeing as God Sees

Even when the apostles think they have anticipated what is needed, they often come up short. Not a lack of preparation or a lack of talent, but something is missing, nonetheless. In the gospel, they announce to Jesus that there is not enough food to eat. The crowds are too massive. They are too far away from the resources they need. But Jesus is not concerned. He sees what they are incapable of seeing. He believes in ways they cannot even begin to comprehend.

In blessing the limited amount of food they scrounge up for him, Jesus reveals to them an abundance they were unable to see. Not only is there enough for all who have assembled, there is more than enough, beyond their wildest imaginings.

How did the apostles understand what they experienced this day? How did they react to the miraculous, overflowing abundance where there was once scarcity? How could there be something where there was nothing?

The real lesson of the gospel is not necessarily the miraculous. Rather, the real lesson of the gospel is found in the invitation to see, to hope, to anticipate that with God all is possible. Even when it seems like a dead end. Even when nothing adds up. Even when you come up short. ●

ENCOUNTERS WITH THE RISEN CHRIST !

The Sacrament of reconciliation is offered on First Friday and First Saturday after the 9 am Mass, Saturdays at 3 pm, and most any reasonable time by appointment. Your identity need not be known; your anonymity is respected.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is strongly encouraged by those seriously ill, the elderly, or those facing surgery. This sacrament of Our Lord's healing & comfort is usually available on the last weekend each month after every Mass, or by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage is a wonderful commitment to life and love, and the Church welcomes those who are called to this noble vocation. Christian marriage involves a couple's serious deliberation, prayer, and planning. The diocesan policy requires all engaged couples to contact the pastor at least 6 months before setting any wedding date.

The Sacrament of Baptism presupposes sufficient instruction according to the age of the candidate, and a desire to practice the faith. Expectant parents are encouraged to ask the Pastor for the Church's blessing for a safe and healthy delivery. Call the Church Office to schedule instruction and the service.

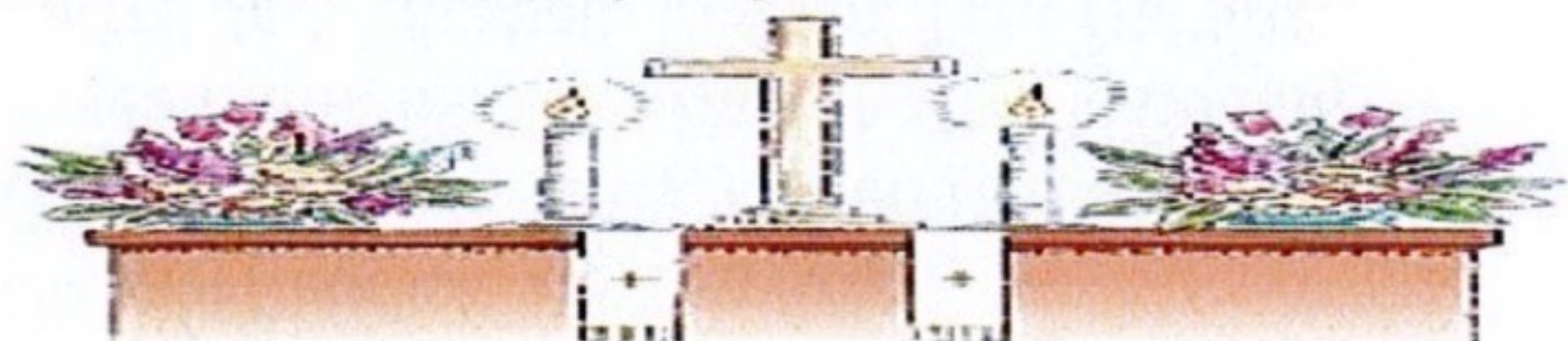

To Learn More About Temporal Punishment and Indulgences

Part 7

1. What is an indulgence?

An indulgence is the remission granted by the Church of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven. After sin has been healed by the medicine of the sacrament of Penance, the wounds left by sin must be healed by the further medicine of temporal punishment. An indulgence remits punishment. In other words it removes the need for the bitter medicine of suffering and substitutes an easier but more effective one to assist and even complete the healing process.. As a medicine to heal the soul, indulgences are better than our own acts of self-denial and the acceptance of suffering. But as fuel to make the fires of love grow--- which is much more important than mere healing---suffering is much better.

2. How many kinds of indulgences are there?

There are two kinds of indulgences, **plenary** and **partial**

3. What is a plenary indulgence?

A plenary indulgence is the remission of all the temporal punishment due to our sins. A plenary indulgence heals completely the damage to the soul done by sin so that there is no longer any need of temporal punishment.

4. What is a partial indulgence?

A partial indulgence is the remission of part of the temporal punishment due to our sins. A partial indulgence hastens the healing process. A 300 days indulgence, for example, has the healing power of 300 days in-bodily penance, such as was customary in the early church.

5. How does the Church by means of indulgences remit the temporal punishment due to sin?

The Church by means of indulgences remits the temporal punishment due to sin by applying to us from her spiritual treasury part of the infinite satisfaction of Jesus Christ and of the superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints. The satisfaction of Jesus Christ means the power of His Precious Blood to make up for our sins and to heal all the wounds left by sin. This is the spiritual treasury of the Church. Two times a year the Church remits our sins: 1) Divine Mercy Sunday and 2) On November 2nd by visiting a cemetery and fulfilling all obligations.

6. What is the superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints?

The superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints is that which they gained during their lifetime but did not need, and which the Church applies to their fellow members of the communion of saints. Mingled with the Precious Blood of Christ in the treasury of the Church are the sorrows of Mary and the sufferings of the saints as they bore their crosses after Christ. These were the healthy members of the Mystical Body of Christ who were able to help sinners, the sick members. We can draw on this treasury and we can also contribute to it. The sufferings we bear through love can help others.

7. What must we do to gain an indulgence for ourselves?

To gain an indulgence for ourselves we must be in the state of grace, have at least a general intention of gaining the indulgence, and perform the works required by the Church. To gain a plenary indulgence we must be free from all sin, since an indulgence applies only to the healing of wounds left by sin, not to the healing of sin itself. We must also be free from any intention to commit sin or to stay in an occasion of sin.

8. Can we gain indulgences for others?

We cannot gain indulgences for other living persons, but we can gain them for the souls in purgatory, since the Church makes most indulgences applicable to them. Living persons are in a position to help themselves, but the souls in purgatory are not.

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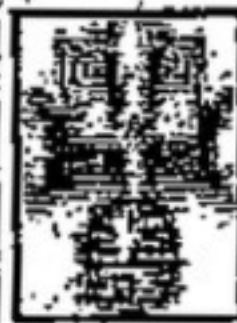

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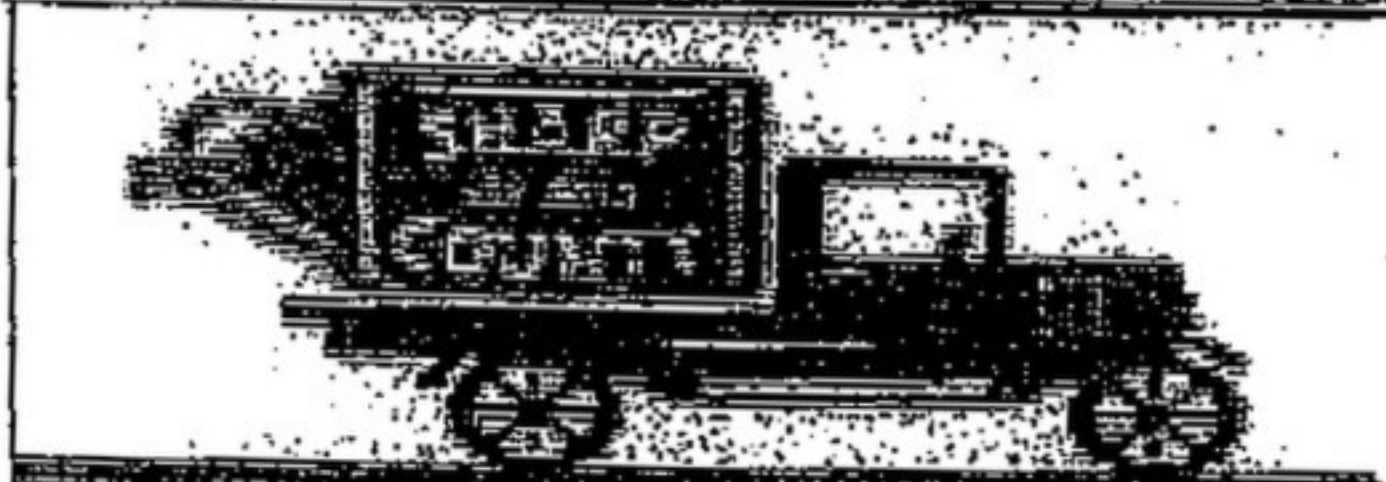
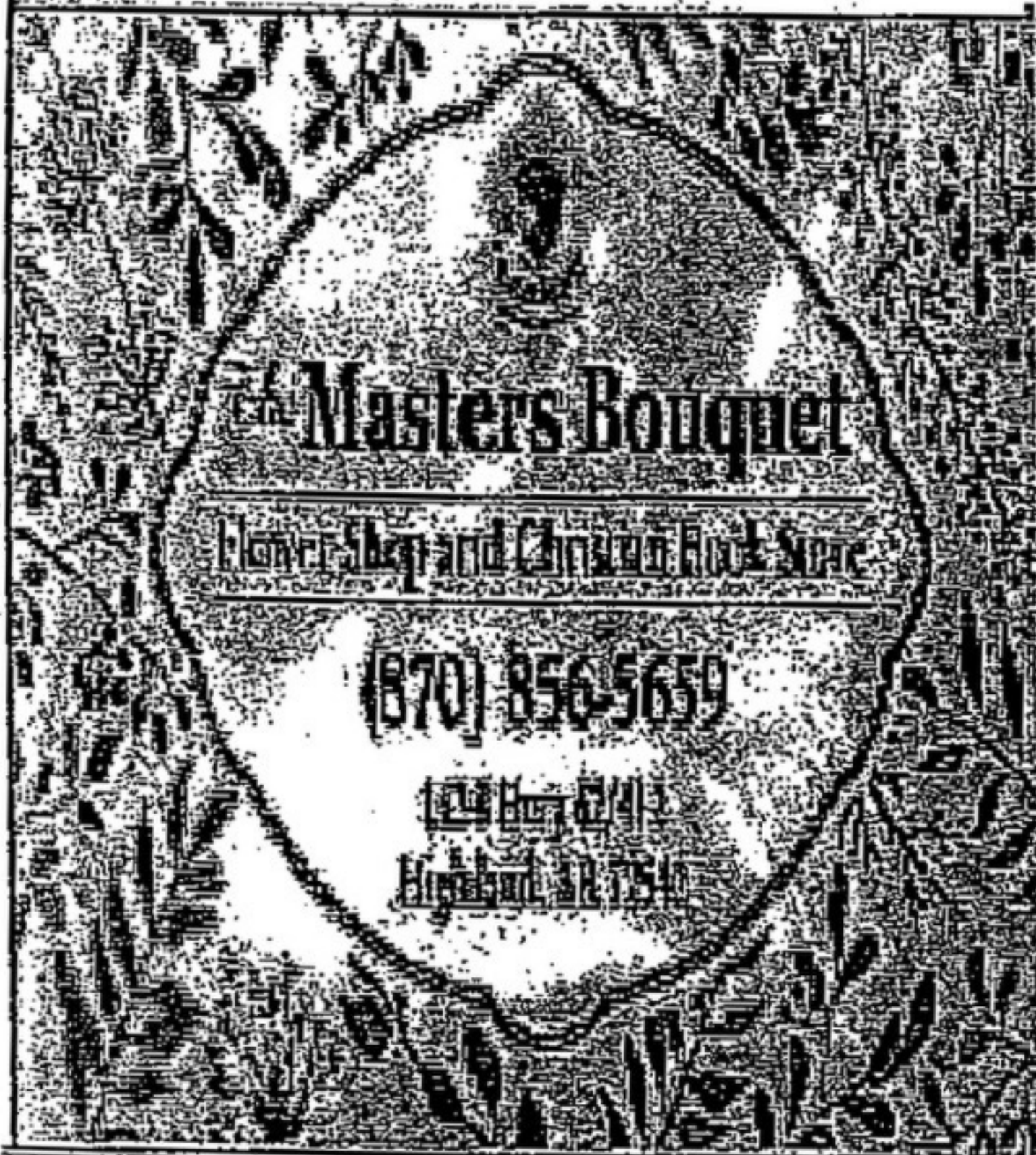

Dear Padre,

Jesus gave his disciples both bread and wine and said, "Do this in memory of me." But our priest decided that we cannot receive from the cup at Communion. Does he have the right to deny his parishioners the Precious Blood?

"The diocesan bishop may lay down norms for the distribution of Communion under both kinds for his own diocese, which must be observed" (*Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion Under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America*, 24). (Also see *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 283.) After the COVID-19 pandemic, many parishes did not resume Communion under both kinds. Some opted instead to make the Precious Blood available only on major solemnities. However, "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds" (*GIRM* 281). "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do...partake of the chalice (cf. no. 283), so that even by means of the signs Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated" (*GIRM* 85). Still, pastors "should instruct the Christian faithful...that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and hence...those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation" (*GIRM* 282). ●



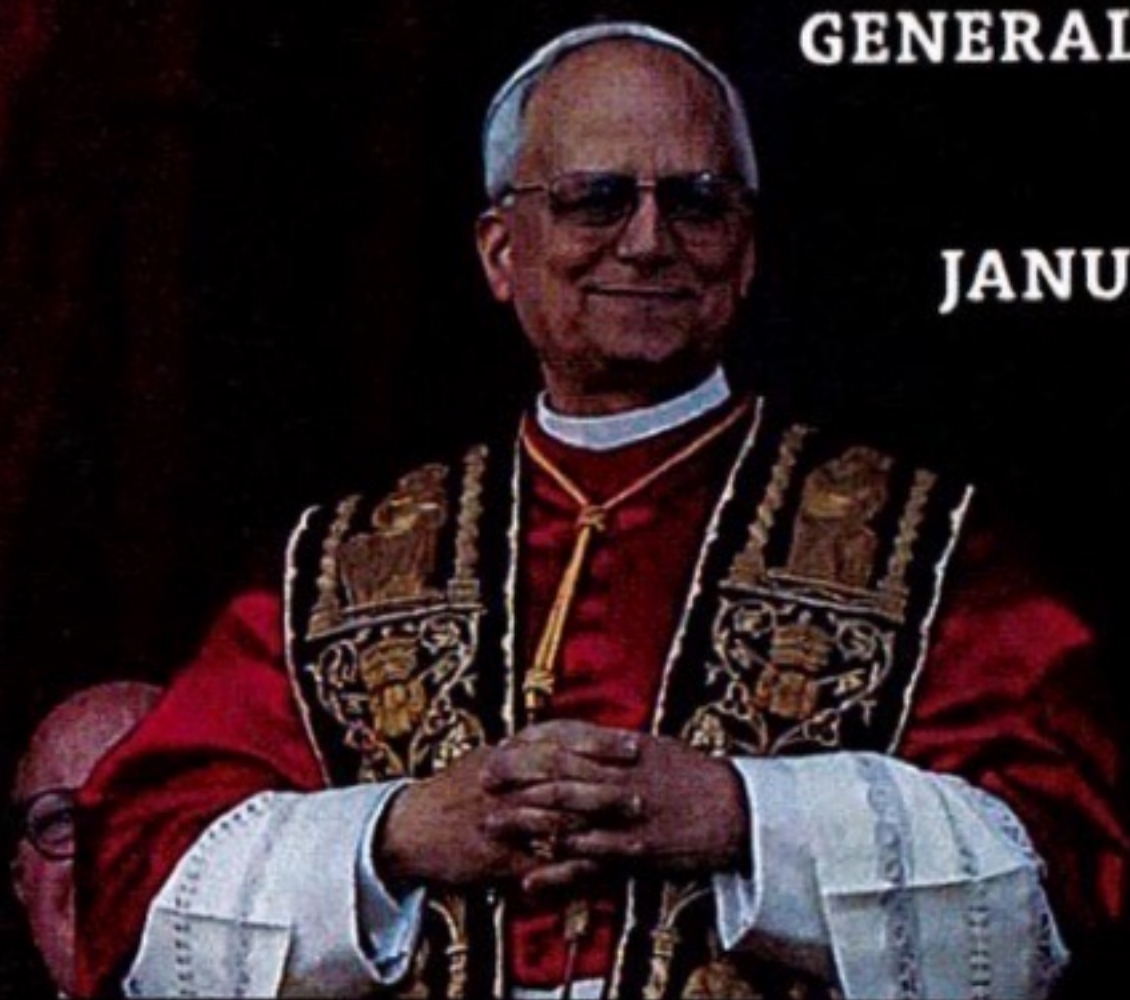
