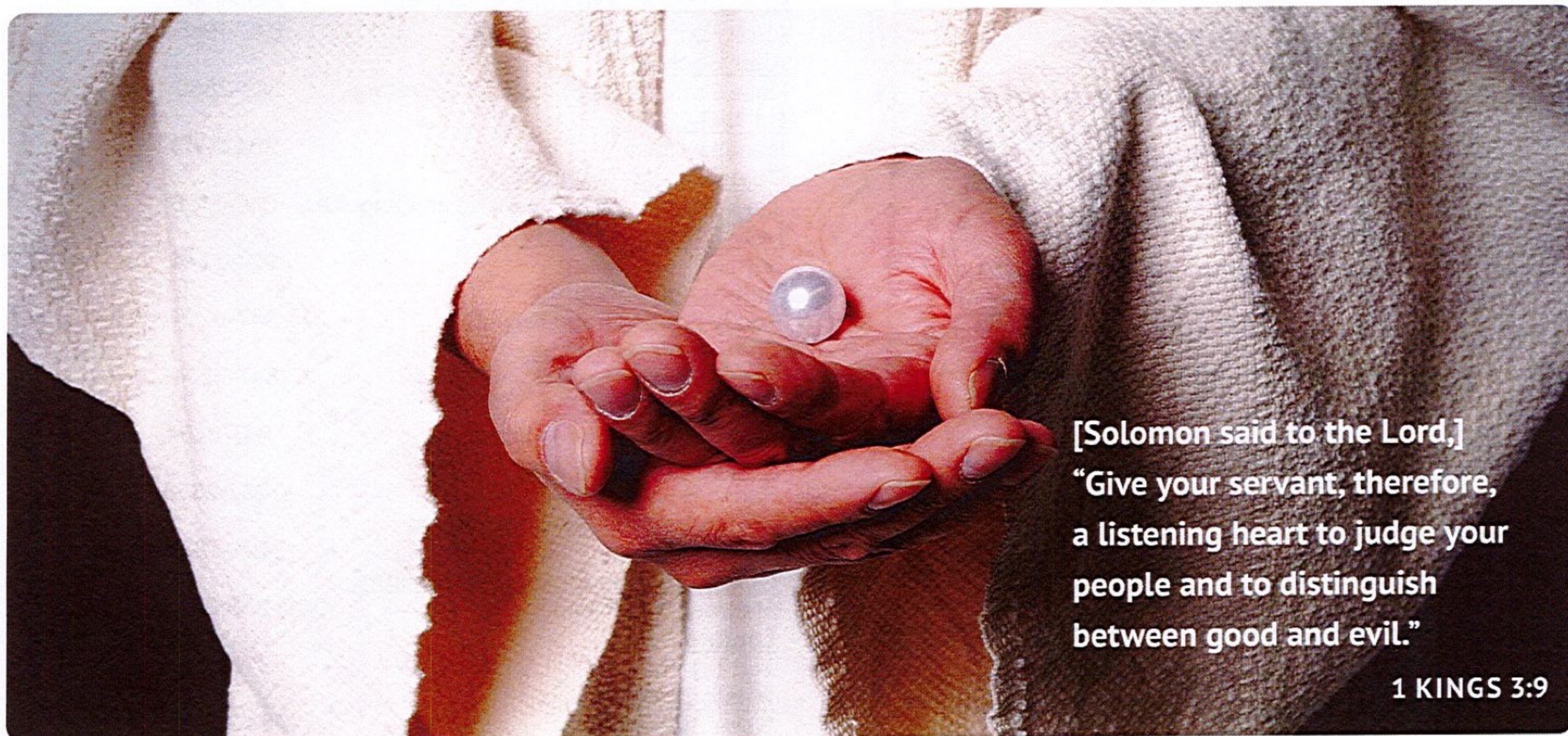

## What Image of the Kingdom Will You Serve Up?

Jesus' favorite thing to talk about was a mystery he called the kingdom of God, referred to in the Gospel of Matthew as the kingdom of heaven. He was not the first to speak of it. The prophets before him spoke often of God's dream for the world. They wanted all to know what it would look like when God reigns here on earth as God already reigns in the heavens. But Jesus added to that teaching by offering vivid new images of what God's reign is like. Matthew 13 is filled with such snapshots. The kingdom of heaven will be like a mustard seed, a pearl, a measure of leaven, a hidden treasure. It will be like a sower casting out seed, a wheat harvest, a net that catches many fish.

At the end of this litany, however, Jesus offers an image of what he expects of those who have received his teaching about the Kingdom. They are to be like “the head of a household who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old” (Matthew 13:52). It sounds as if Jesus' disciples are to act like hosts of a banquet, setting the table with stories from across time to feed their guests with whatever words and images would best help them grasp the mystery of this kingdom. They are to continue Jesus' work of developing new ways to illumine a mystery that is in the end too great for words. ●

### ENCOUNTERS WITH THE RISEN CHRIST !

**The Sacrament of reconciliation** is offered on First Friday and First Saturday after the 9 am Mass, Saturdays at 3 pm, and most any reasonable time by appointment. Your identity need not be known; your anonymity is respected.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is strongly encouraged by those seriously ill, the elderly, or those facing surgery. This sacrament of Our Lord's healing & comfort is usually available on the last weekend each month after every Mass, or by appointment.

**The Sacrament of Marriage** is a wonderful commitment to life and love, and the Church welcomes those who are called to this noble vocation. Christian marriage involves a couple's serious deliberation, prayer, and planning. The diocesan policy requires all engaged couples to contact the pastor at least 6 months before setting any wedding date.

**The Sacrament of Baptism** presupposes sufficient instruction according to the age of the candidate, and a desire to practice the faith. Expectant parents are encouraged to ask the Pastor for the Church's blessing for a safe and healthy delivery. Call the Church Office to schedule instruction and the service.

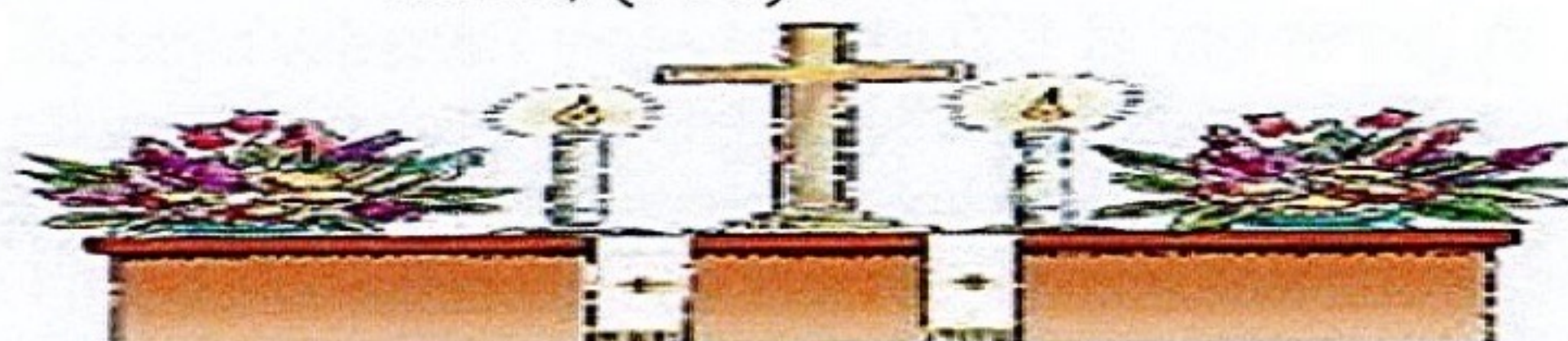

## **To Learn More About Confession**

### **Part 6b**

#### **1. What kinds of punishment are due to sin?**

Two kinds of punishment are due to sin: the eternal punishment of hell, due to unforgiven mortal sins, and temporal punishment, lasting only for a time, due to venial sins and also to mortal sins after they have been forgiven. Eternal punishment is God's angry punishment, which balances the scales of justice upset by sin. This punishment is reserved for those in hell, since they refused to let God correct them on earth. Temporal punishment is God's loving, corrective punishment. This punishment is given either on earth or in purgatory.

#### **2. Does the sacrament of Penance, worthily received, always take away all punishment?**

The sacrament of Penance, worthily received, always takes away all eternal punishment; but it does not always take away all temporal punishment.

#### **3. Why does God require temporal punishment for sin?**

God requires temporal punishment for sin to satisfy His justice, to teach us the great evil of sin, and to warn us not to sin again. The wound caused by sin in the will is healed by the medicine of the sacrament of Penance. But there are also wounds in the other power of the soul. These are healed by the further medicine of temporal punishment. Temporal punishment repairs all the damage done to the soul by sin.

#### **4. Where do we pay the debt of our temporal punishment?**

We pay the debt of our temporal punishment either in this life or in purgatory.

#### **5. What are the chief means of satisfying the debt of our temporal punishment, besides the penance imposed after confession?**

Besides the penance imposed after confession, the chief means of satisfying the debt of our temporal punishment are: prayer, attending Mass, fasting, almsgiving, the works of mercy, the patient endurance of sufferings, and indulgences. The secret of healing the effects of sin quickly is love of the Cross. Our Lord tells us to take up our cross daily. But what is our cross? Our cross is everything that happens to us during the day that we do not like. When these things happen to us, it is a sign of God's love. He is sending crosses to heal the wounds of our soul. Crosses heal us quickly if we accept them and love them the way Our Lord did. We must pray for help to recognize and love the crosses God sends us each day.

#### **6. Before entering the confessional, how should we prepare ourselves for a good confession?**

Before entering the confessional, we should prepare ourselves for a good confession by taking sufficient time not only to examine our conscience but, especially, to excite in our hearts sincere sorrow for our sins and a firm purpose not to commit them again. Never enter the confessional without at least a few minutes (at least 5) of preparation.

#### **7. How should we begin our confession?**

We should begin our confession in this manner: entering the confessional we make the sign of the cross as say to the priest: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned"; and then we tell how long it has been since our last confession.

#### **8. After telling the time of our last confession, what do we confess?**

If we have committed any mortal sins since our last confession, we must confess them, and also any that we have forgotten in previous confessions, telling the nature and number of each; we may also confess any venial sins we wish to mention. (For example: "I missed Mass once. I was disobedient ten times. I told lies 5 times. I was unkind eight times)."



**9. What should we do if we cannot remember the exact number of our mortal sins?**

If we cannot remember the exact number of our mortal sins, we should tell the number as nearly as possible, or say how often we have committed the sins in a day, a week, a month, or a year.

**10. What should we do when we have committed no mortal sin since our last confession?**

When we have committed no mortal sin since our last confession, we should confess our venial sins or some sin told in a previous confession, for which we are again sorry, in order that the priest may give us absolution.

**11. How should we end our confession?**

We should end our confession by saying: "I am sorry for these and all the sins of my past life, especially for ...; and then it is well to tell one or several of the sins which we have previously confessed and for which we are particularly sorry. After telling our sins, at the end, we say, "For these and all my other sins, which I cannot remember or call to mind. I am truly sorry for my sins."

**12. What should we do after confessing our sins?**

After confessing our sins, we should answer truthfully any question the priest asks, seek advice if we feel that we need any, listen carefully to the spiritual instruction and counsel of the priest, and accept the penance he gives us.

**13. What should we do when the priest is giving us absolution?**

When the priest is giving us absolution, we should say from our heart the act of contrition in a tone to be heard by him. Remember that you are telling Our Lord you are sorry you have hurt Him. Be sure to mean what you are saying.

**14. What should we do after leaving the confessional?**

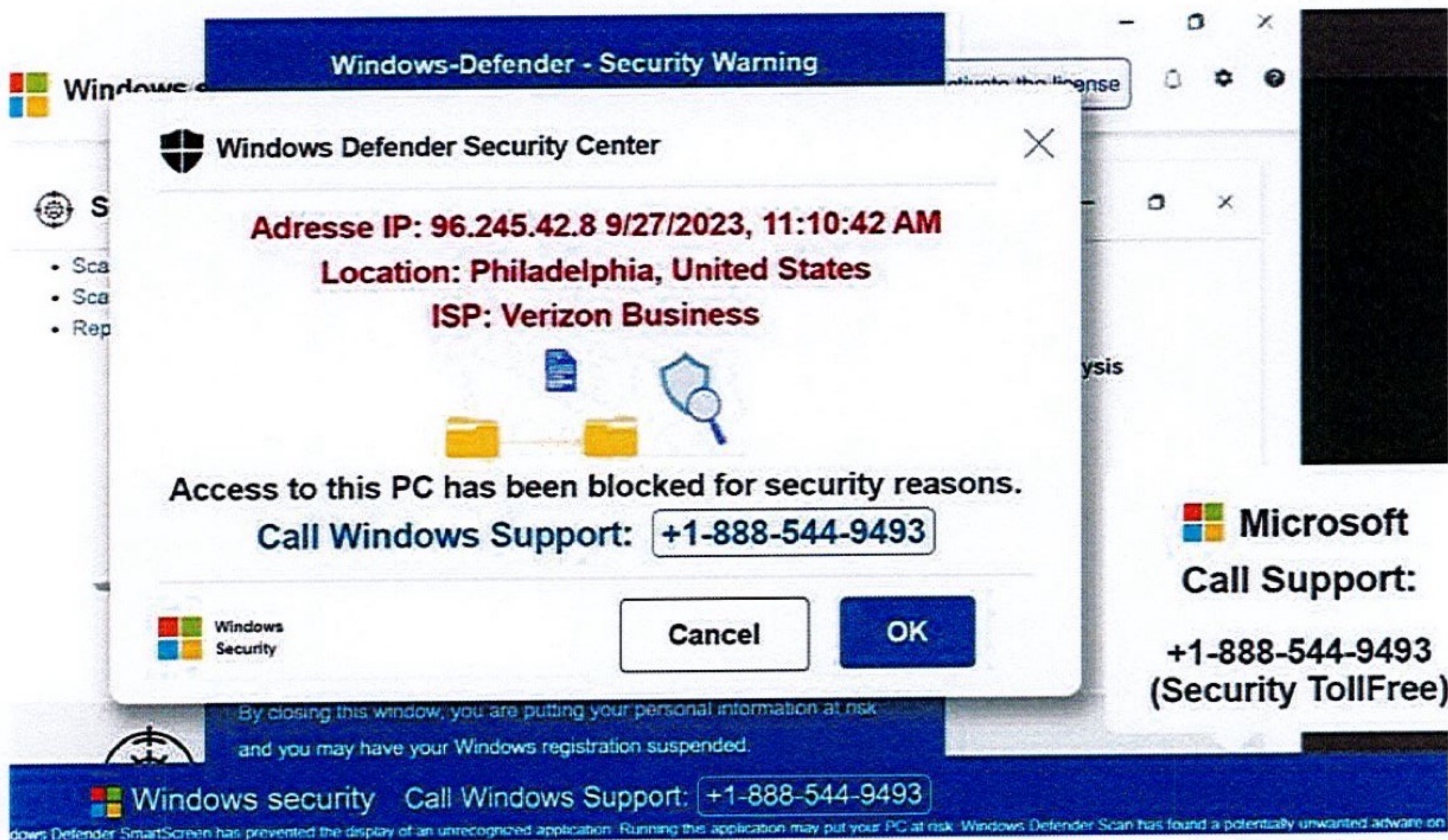
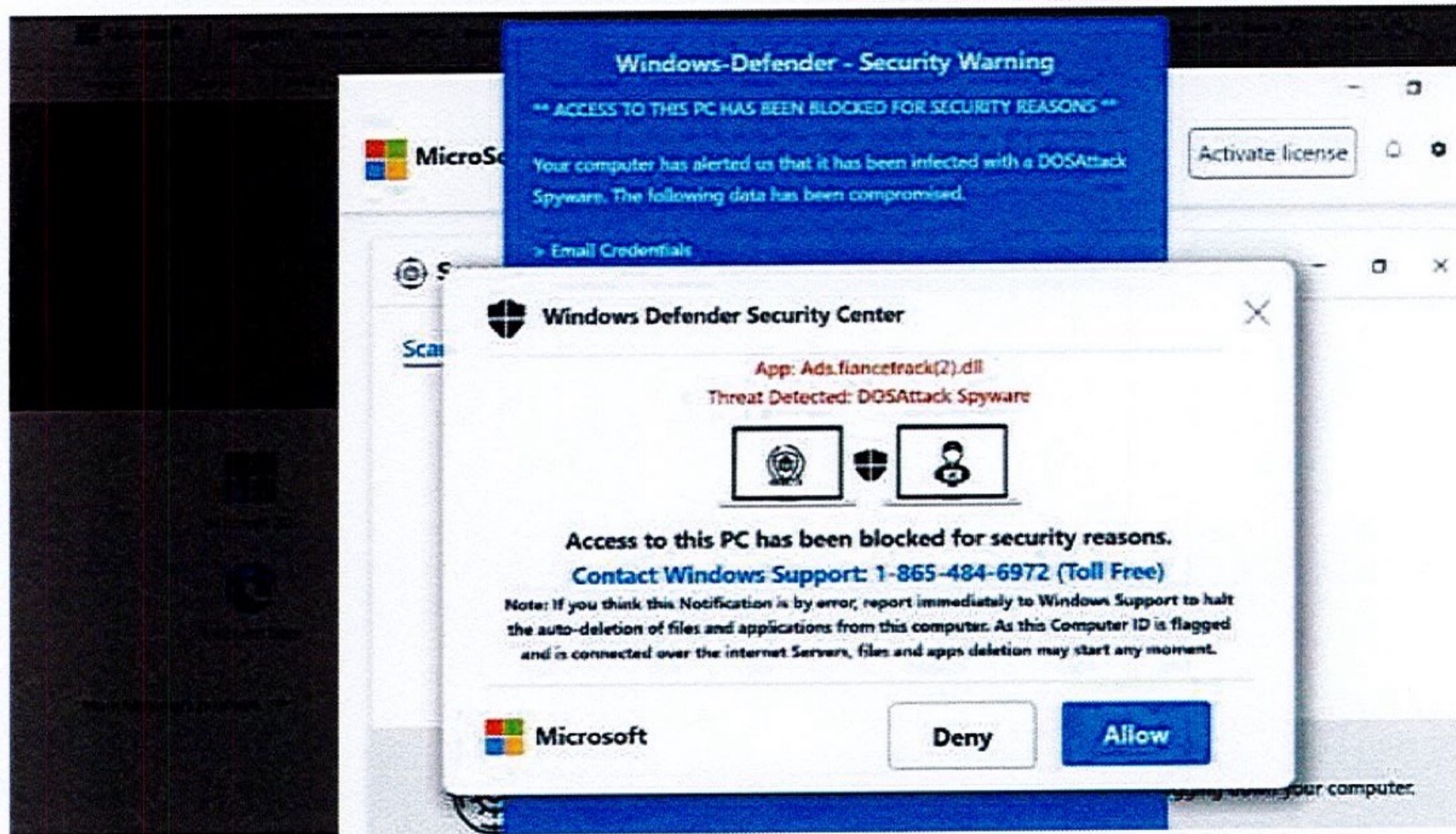
After leaving the confessional we should return thanks to God for the sacrament we have received, beg Our Lord to supply for the imperfections of our confession, and promptly and devoutly perform our penance. Always spend a few minutes in thanksgiving after Our Lord has healed your soul. Thank Him from the bottom of your heart for all He went through in His Passion, since His sufferings paid the price for this medicine of the Sacrament of Penance. Think over what you can do to improve.

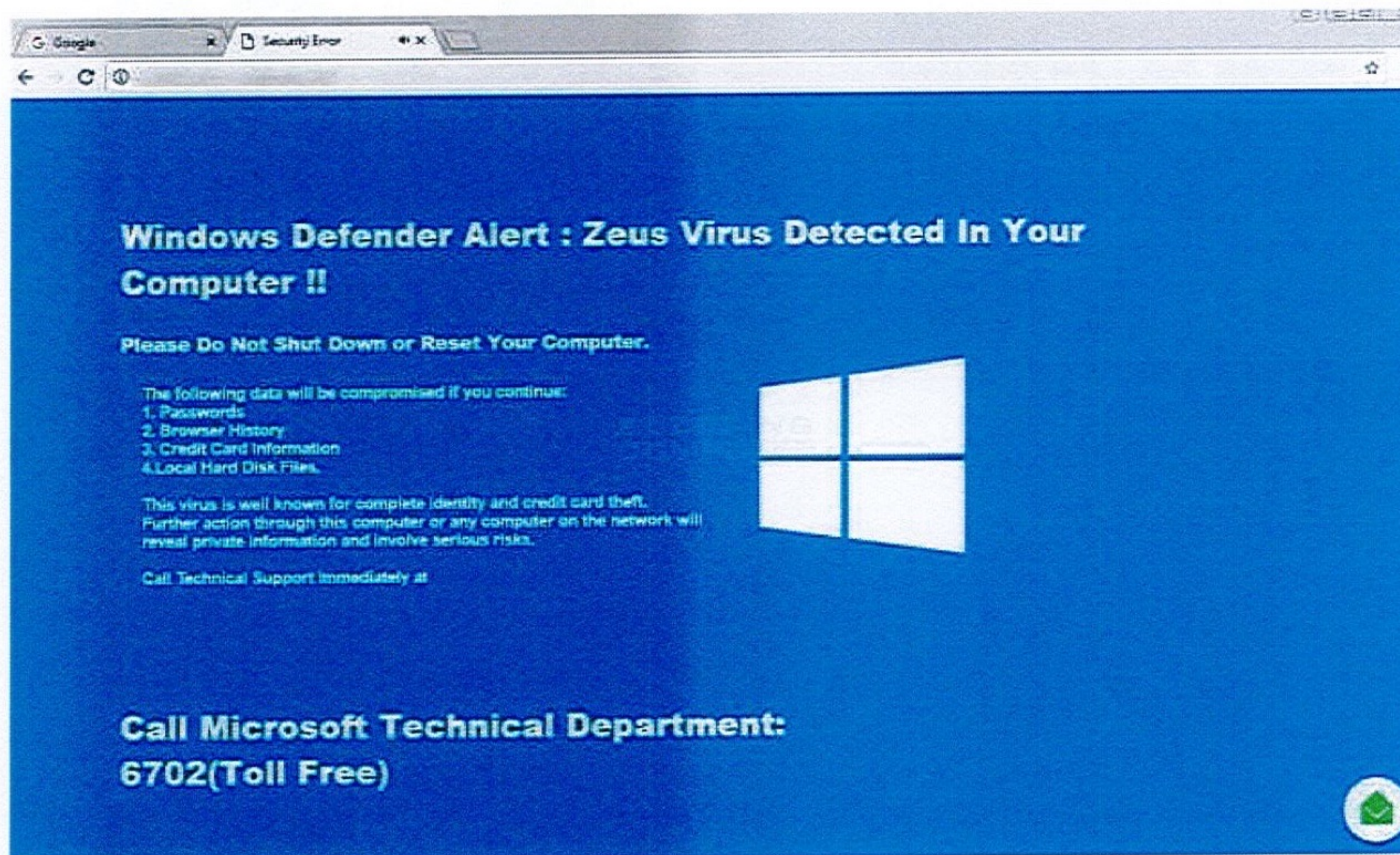


# Computer “Pop-Up Scams”

In these scams, a “Pop-Up window” will appear after different google searches are made, or after the computer is restarted (because the malware is already in place). The “Pop-Up windows” often look like something below.







It will ask you to click on the link or to call the Microsoft phone number that's listed.

Clicking on the link can give the scammers access to your computer and network information. And calling the Microsoft phone number that's listed (**which isn't legitimate**) will direct you to an individual who may direct you to withdraw cash and meet up for an exchange; to wire funds; to make deposits in cryptocurrency; or otherwise issue you threats and ultimatums.

The scams may also direct you to a "refund portal" or "refund processing" site—all of which may look legitimate, but which are remote access tools allowing the scammer to access your computer. Some of the more prominent bogus sites right now are: **TeamViewer; AnyDesk; Zoho Assist; LogMeIn Resolve; UltraViewer; ConnectWise; and GoToAssist.**

The guidance we've received from civil authorities is as follows: **If you see one of these "Microsoft Pop-Up windows,"**

1. **DO NOT click on anything and DO NOT call any numbers listed.**
2. **Immediately hold the power button until your computer completely shuts down.**
3. **Contact your IT professional to assist you with restarting your computer and scanning it for any viruses, malware, ransomware, etc.**
4. **If needed, notify local or federal law enforcement and/or the Attorney General Consumer Protection division (see also, <https://arkansasag.gov/divisions/public-protection/common-scams/>).**

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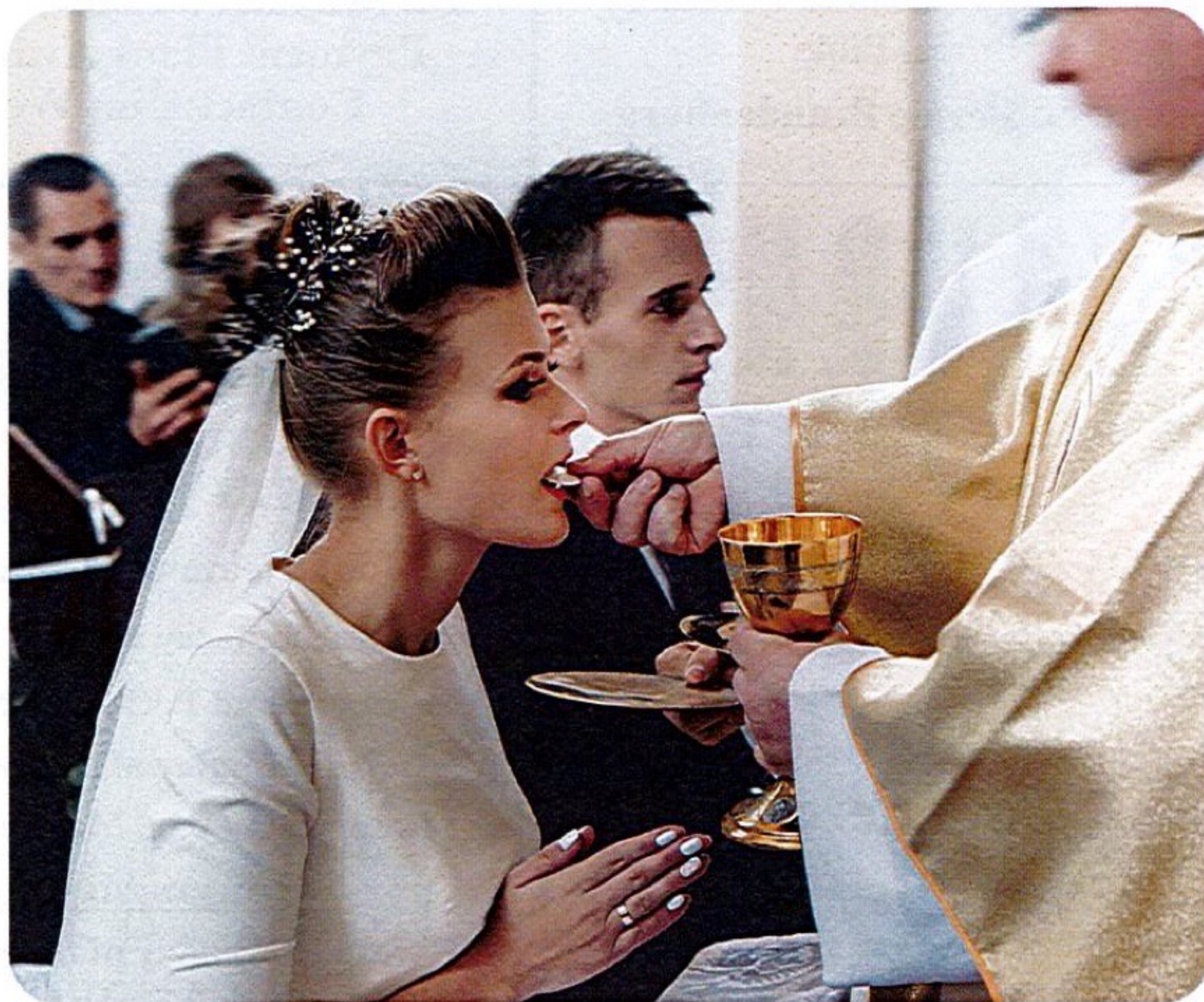


# Dear Padre,

*I'm in the OCIA program. My wife and I were married civilly. She goes to a non-denominational church but is not baptized. Someone said we would have to get our marriage "convalidated." Why? And what does that mean?*

*Convalidation* is a legal term, but it can also be understood as good pastoral practice and even more as a wise spiritual choice. Basically, from a legal point of reference, your marriage took place outside of the canonical structure of the Church.

It needs to be "regularized" and "documented" for you to move forward. Because your wife is not baptized, it cannot be a sacramental marriage, which requires baptism, but it can be made valid and recorded in official Church documentation. Such documentation is helpful, particularly if you have children and intend to raise them as Catholic. Also, if your wife ever decides to become a baptized Catholic, your marriage would automatically become a sacramental marriage when she is baptized. Nothing more is required of you. All in all, it is a good decision and a positive step in your spiritual journey. ●
