RULES

- Judging of the Horse and Pony section is to commence at 9.30am.
- The timetable in the schedule is approximate and although the organisers will make every effort to maintain the timetable, the Committee reserves the right to make any alterations as it sees fit. The Committee reserves the right to limit class sizes if necessary.
- Please check the timetable and take into consideration that despite all efforts, some classes may clash. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be present on time for their classes.
- Rosettes will be awarded for 1st to 6th in the Horse and Pony classes, unless otherwise stated.
Prize money will be awarded as follows:
1st prize – 2 or more entries
2nd prize – 4 or more entries
3rd prize – 6 or more entries
Rosettes will be awarded to all competitors in the lead rein and first ridden classes.
- Horse and pony classes are open to Fillies, Mares and Geldings only, yearlings and above. **Colts or Stallions are not permitted.** Foals are not permitted to enter.
- Competitor numbers will be posted out for showing competitors. Numbers for late entries can be collected at the secretary's tent on the show day. SJ classes will not use competitor numbers.
- Paramedics will be in attendance to cover first aid. A contribution of £2 towards the cost is required per exhibitor.
- All riders of horses and ponies anywhere on the show field are required to wear head protection (hard hat) according to the current standards for head protection for equestrian activities: All PAS015, VG1, BS EN 1384: 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, Snell E2001, Snell E2-17, AS/NZS 3838 onwards. All children 16 years and under must also adhere to this rule when handling horses and ponies.
- No child under 3 years may compete in horse and pony classes.
- Horses and ponies competing must be covered by Third Party Public Liability Insurance and owners must ensure that the person attending an animal is competent in the handling of it.
- Animals are to be kept at walk in the wagon area and please adhere to the signage indicating pedestrian only areas.
- Online entries will only be refunded before the closing date. Postal entries will not be refunded.
- Only trophies as stated in the schedule will be awarded at the 2025 show, due to a trophy audit taking place.
- ALL box drivers are obliged to co-operate with the parking stewards.
- No lunging allowed.
- All equines must be accompanied by a legal and currently valid passport
- Please DO NOT leave your horse/pony unattended whilst tethered to your box.
- Equine flu - standard advice to our exhibitors is that vaccines must be up to date. Any animal though to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease will be asked to leave the showground immediately by the committee.
- A fall of horse and/or rider in any class will result in elimination.
- It is expected that these classes will be entered in the spirit in which they are intended. Exhibitors are accountable for the accuracy of the information provided on their entry form.

Set Recipe - Tea Loaf

170g sultanas	2 medium eggs lightly beaten
170g raisins	250g self-raising flour
1 orange zested	200g soft brown sugar
300ml hot strong Earl Grey or Lady Grey tea	butter for greasing, plus extra to serve

Method

Mix the sultanas, raisins and orange zest in a large mixing bowl. Pour over the tea and cover the bowl. Leave to sit for a minimum of 6 hours or ideally overnight to allow the dried fruit to soak up all the liquid. Heat the oven to 180C/160 fan/gas 4. Grease and line a 900g loaf tin. Add the eggs, flour and sugar to the soaked fruit, ensuring everything is well combined. Spoon the mixture into the tin and oven for 1 hour 30 mins or until firm to the touch. Leave to cool in the tin for 15 mins before transferring to a wire rack. Cut into thick slices and served with butter. To store, wrap tightly and keep in an airtight container for up to five days. The loaf will taste even better after a few days.
