### Canadian Rockies Train Trip

There is some interest in WOW members taking a scenic Canadian Rockies train trip. To have a successful event, we need to start planning in the near future for a trip next year. It turns out that this is a big task. Not being a travel agent or playing one on tv, I found that there is a lot of research and planning involved. Our own Val Laser is helping in gathering trip information and trips that our members may be interested in doing. She is also taking into consideration, the routes and the economics of a trip, which can be formidable, as well as dates.

### October 21<sup>st</sup> Trip to Catalina Island

There is a possibility for members to get off their rockers and have a fun day out, going to Catalina. There is a ferry that leaves Dana Point to and from Catalina almost every day of the year. The ferry leaves Dana Point at 9:30AM and 2:45PM. The ferry leaves Avalon at 11:45AM and 5:00PM. The ride is about 1.5 hours each way. The cost is about \$90 round trip transportation for seniors (55 and older).

For a day trip you could spend about 5 hours on the island to do what you want. If you want to stay longer, there are a number of hotels on the island.

The intent is for those members that want to go to meet at Dana Point at 9:00 or so with their ticket to go and return. We would go over as a group. However, since there are many things to do and different interests, everyone would choose what they might like to do while on the island. Perhaps a few could do the same thing. If you plan to do a paid event, you should acquire your tickets before you start your trip, to ensure you get to do what you want. Depending on how long you want to stay, you might return with others. As I understand it, some are planning on staying at least one night. Obviously, they would be on their own.

The date of October 21<sup>st</sup>, a Monday, is the date of choice for those that are anticipating going on this trip.
