





People **Glory to you, Lord Christ**

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come.
Give us each day our daily bread.
And forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.
And do not bring us to the time of trial."

If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

ST. JOHN'S OUTDOOR FOOD PANTRY - For the past 4 weeks volunteer have been stocking the St. John's Pantry 6 days a week. High demand warrants this attention. We all know groceries are costing more. Added to this financial pressure the schools in the Sherwood cluster did not get their summer food grants renewed. Magruder is the only local school still providing the Montgomery County Summer Food Service Program. Families as well as the unhoused are using our food pantry as a resource.

We are in need of protein sources other than beans. We currently have plenty of canned beans of all kinds. We are in need of peanut butter, canned sardines, canned or foil packs of tuna and chicken; and Chef Boyardee spaghetti and ravioli fourteen-ounce cans with flip tops would also be appreciated.

The pantry is in need of fruits and some vegetables. Canned fruits and single serve fruit cups and applesauce, and raisins are hard to keep stocked. We currently have plenty of 15-ounce canned vegetables. Small 8.25-ounce vegetables with flip top lids are in demand. Pudding cups are also an item that goes quickly.

Thank you for any help you can give to feed our hungry neighbors.
