2) What we and the city can do:

- Parking Spaces: If you can, park your cars in any available public
 parking spot both on our local streets AND out on PCH. The longer
 people have to walk, the more disperse it will all be and will certainly help
 keep our streets functional as well as limit the amount of stuff that is
 brought down
- Police Vehicles: There will be a decoy police unit placed probably on Dumond as well as a tow truck placed maybe by the stairs.
- **Dumond:** We will try some traffic cones at the top of Dumond that will let traffic through but tend to work in conjunction with the "No Vehicular Beach Access" signs to discourage traffic on that dead end street.
- Parking Patrol: Parking and Traffic focused police will be paying attention.

• **Police:** There are extra police on hand if needed but they will really try to keep a low keyed presence unless needed. They will be prepared to deal with anything that crosses boundaries of property or codes.

This whole incident runs counter to getting traction to that request so the best offense is really to just be helpful to people trying to find their way around and be respectful to all regardless.
