- 8) Bridge Paint: Been talking with Caltrans about this as the paint is very much past it's use-by date.... Turns out it will take quite a long time. First step is to get it assessed for lead based paint or not. If so, it will require a much more intricate operation to thoroughly strip ALL the paint off and contain it.

In any case, there can't be any maintenance work done in the area until the local construction is completed. This is because the contractor is given complete control over the area so that work does not inadvertently step or intrude on each other. That means that nothing can really be done on the bridge until late next spring -and even then, it will have to go on the list after everything else that is already on the local list.... So realistically, it will be about a year, unfortunately.

Meantime, I am working with the Caltrans rep to make sure the lead analysis gets done and then once they know what kind of work it will be, to get it on the maintenance list ASAP. Keep in touch!
