"Came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity."

He said: In the beginning I didn't quite get the second step. My sponsor and I read the chapter on it in the 12&12 but I was not able to fully realize the implication of "insanity". The word is used commonly as a way to denote many different things in our late 20th century lexicon. As time passed I gained time in a life without alcohol, but faith eluded me. Faith is an absolute necessity for Step 2.

As the years swept by I descended into the places alcoholism: common with divorce. unemployment, ever increasing mental illness. I began to visit the local psychiatric hospital. I witnessed much there. I encountered the so-called "bedevilments" described on page 52 of our basic text. The "promises" eluded me; not just the 9th Step ones we hear so often in meetings. Each step has promises. The obvious ones are perhaps the third, the fifth, the second step promise: "...restored us all to our right minds." ... "has come to all who have honestly sought Him", began to be able to be realized.

First I finally got a "real job", the one I never wanted. 50 hours a week on a construction site that was nearly 3 years behind schedule. OMG and the work was not easy but I realized I only had to do it for one day. Through it all I always went to AA meetings. I didn't take a drink either. I began to sponsor newcomers ...again. Slowly I rose out of my self-imposed nadir. By this time I was reaching double digit sobriety. My faith was growing day by day. Suddenly the italics "being convinced I was at step 3" seemed real. My place in the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous meant something. The traditions became part of my foundation in a group.

She said: Some of the funniest things I've ever heard were at meetings when AA'ers shared about their past thinking and capers which they had believed were perfectly normal and acceptable at the time. Lots of laughter ... and identifying.

I was so desperate to escape the insanity of the repetitive "Maybe this time it'll be different," but I didn't know how. So, as instructed, I asked this woman to be my sponsor – (she had THREE YEARS SOBER!!– I was impressed!!) – and bounced lots of questions off her. If she didn't have a prompt response, we searched AA literature for guidance, and she would bounce questions and ideas off HER sponsor.

I studied the AA publications and listened as others shared their stories and experiences of a Higher Power working in their lives. I was profoundly relieved that neither they nor the Big Book required me to jump through doctrinal hoops before I was accepted for membership.

I began to formulate what I wanted a Higher Power to be – not just a wish-granter, but began awakening to possibilities of an unlimited Relationship with a Power Greater than myself. That "I'm out of control" blurt probably began as a realization and acknowledgement, and HP brought me to folks who knew and would help.

Letting go of my old ideas allowed me to begin saying "gee, I hadn't thought of it that way" when presented with facts and new perspectives. It took a little while longer before I was comfortable saying "you might be right." I gradually became willing and open to change. **Letting go of** "old ideas" included what I interpreted from church sermons and Sunday School, was that

She Said (cont.) God was all-seeing, judgmental, and keeping score of my sins and shortcomings. They didn't preach it, but righteous Christians don't go to movies or dances, or yield to other worldly temptations.

"Old ideas" also meant letting go of my self-loathing – not measuring up, warped because of childhood abandonment, guilt from a slew of behaviors not socially acceptable – and started to forgive myself as I came to believe that a Power Greater Than Myself will restore me to sanity without reprobation.

I didn't know how to get "there" on my own. Listening as AA members shared their journeys back from insanity, working with my sponsor, reading the 12 Steps for directions, I realized a new way of living. It was a process as I incorporated the spiritual principles into thought and action. I began to want to be a channel or instrument, as in the prayer "Lord, make me a channel of thy Peace..." (12&12, p99)

Today when I become aware that I'm stuck on an obsessive emotion or idea, or compulsive behavior, I ask "Please relieve me of _____" and half an hour later I'm bebopping around and realize my perspective has changed. IT WORKS!!



February 1933:

Anne (Dr. Bob's wife) starts attending "Oxford Group" meetings. Dr. Bob will follow her into the program. Interesting to note – if both Bill W. and Dr. Bob had not both been active in the "Oxford Group" they never would have met!

February 1938:

Rockefeller gives \$5,000 to AA. Saves AA from professionalization, at the Union Club in New York with Dr. Bob, Bill and six other A.A.'s in attendance.

Feb. 1939:

Collier magazine editor Thomas Uzzell edits the Big Book manuscript from approximately 800 pages down to 400.

February 1939:

Dr Howard of Montclair, NJ suggests swapping "you musts" for "we ought" in the Big Book.

February 13, 1940:

The first recorded time "The Lords Prayer" was used to close an AA meeting.

February 13, 1940:

First clubhouse for AA members opens at 3341/2 West 24th Street, New York City. Bill W. and Lois had lost everything and moved in upstairs making do with wooden crates as furniture and no heat coming from a small wood stove downstairs.

February 1943:

During gas rationing in WWII, AA's are granted the right to use cars for 12th step work in emergency cases.

February 1990:

Going to print – the Ten Millionth copy of the Big Book.
