

# Pit Stop Recipes



## Steve Thomas's Famous Peanut Butter Cookies

### Steve's Cookies – A Little Piece of Club History



#### Ingredients

- 1 cup peanut butter
- ½ cup butter, softened (1 cube)
- ½ cup white sugar
- ½ cup packed brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1¼ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon salt



#### Directions

1. Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C).
2. In a large bowl, cream together peanut butter, white sugar, and brown sugar until smooth and well blended.
3. Beat in the egg, milk, and vanilla, one at a time.
4. In a separate bowl, combine flour, baking powder, and salt. Gradually mix into the creamed mixture.
5. Chill dough for about 1 hour.
6. Roll dough into tablespoon-sized balls and place 2 inches apart on a baking sheet.
7. Press gently with a fork once or twice to create the classic crisscross pattern.
8. Bake for 9 minutes, or until edges are lightly golden.
9. Cool on the pan for 5 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack.
