New City Catechism Question #38

Q: What is prayer?

A: Prayer is pouring out our hearts to God.

THE CHARGE IS THIS

Christ came into a world groaning under the weight of the curse. This groaning takes shape in many forms, including natural disasters, disease, and demonic activity. In His earthly ministry, Christ pushes the darkness back step by step, taking dominion over it wherever He goes. His is a ministry of putting His enemies under His feet, like the Psalmist declared centuries before. Christ points to His literal death and resurrection with a death-and-resurrection story at sea. He points to the final judgement as He simultaneously lifts the curse off two oppressed men, and sends Satan's angels to their own self-imposed early grave. In all of this, He strikes awe into the heart of men. True holiness is imposing, intimidating, scary, and threatening. It repels just as strongly as it attracts, which is why Jesus got the response He did during His earthly ministry. So, our charge is to remember the power of His holiness. It is a dread to those in their sin, and a comfort to those whose sin has been removed. If we are in Christ, then Christ is in us, and He is working for our good. The storm may rage, the Lord may seem silent, but we are safe when we call on Him. This week as we face whatever providence has in store for us, we can rest assured that the Lord behind the providence is never worried, never uptight, and never at a loss for what He must do next. Christian, you are free to face the storm with a quiet confidence, because the Man who commands winds and waves is working for you.
