New City Catechism Question #40

Q: What should we pray?

A: The Whole Word of God directs us in what we should pray

THE CHARGE IS THIS

When Matthew is called by Christ, he is eager to follow. He doesn't hide behind the pride of false humility or give in to the despair of sinfulness - he knows he can come because he understands who he is, and he understands who Christ is. He leverages his position to throw a celebration in gratitude for his direction. Jesus takes the opportunity in this mixed group setting to give a multi-faceted truth - those who are well don't need a physician, but those who are sick. The eyes of faith see beyond the surface level and understand that we are all sick. We are not righteous, but sinful. But most importantly of all, seeing our position honestly is what gives us access to Christ. Hypocrites and the self-deceived try to offer sacrifices, but the repentant run with gratitude into the mercy of God. Our charge this week is to cultivate a sense of deep gratitude that sees that we are not only saved from our sin, but also from the pride and self-deception that tries in vain to cover that sin on our terms. And let this motivate us to eagerly share this comfort with those around us, so we may all say with John Newton that even when our memory starts to fade, we remember two things very clearly. I am a great sinner, but Christ is a great saviour.
