THE CHARGE IS THIS

Jesus has gained some notoriety on account of His Sermon on the Mount and the miraculous healings that we learned about last week. In this week's Scripture, we learn of two men who had been listening to Jesus' teaching and had seen some of the miracles and wanted to attach themselves to Him as their Teacher. However, through the conversations that we see in this text, these men have not counted the cost as closely as they had originally thought and they are left wondering if following Jesus is worth the sacrifice. While we don't know what happens in the lives of these two men as a result of their conversations with Jesus, we do see Matthew's intent in the lives of his audience as he encourages us to pause and count the cost of following Jesus in our own lives. Is the cost too high? Is Jesus worthy to be followed? This week, as we examine our own lives and consider the radical call to follow Jesus, may we be given grace to respond as the disciples in Matthew 4:18-22 who joyfully left comforts, security and family behind as they sought to singularly devote themselves to following Jesus as their ultimate comfort, treasure and hope.
