Rev. Luther Morgan

Reverend Luther Ray Morgan, 86, of Huntington, died peacefully at his home on Wednesday, September 5, 2018, and was reunited with his lifelong companion, Beulah, at the front of Heaven's gate. In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by his parents, Tillman (TC) and Virginia Morgan; his step-mother, Russie Morgan; and one sister, Judy Mateoski.

Luther was a graduate of Huntington East High School and received his divinity degree from The Free Will Baptist Bible College (now Welch College). He was retired from Valley Bell and Borden Dairy, where he drove his milk truck through Eastern Cabell and Lincoln Counties serving many schools, grocery stores, and small markets throughout the region.

Luther served our country in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict and was a minister of the gospel for over 70 years, starting when he was a teenager. He was the former pastor of Trinity Free Will Baptist Church, where he was a loyal member for 40 years. He also pastored numerous other churches throughout Huntington and Charleston. He was the General Board Member to the National Association of Free Will Baptist, from the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptist. Luther was a very active member of the WV State Association. He had served 136 times in various positions as Board and Committee members and as past Moderator of the WV State Association. He also served in numerous capacities for the Brotherhood Conference.

He is survived by his four children, Louis Morgan of Barboursville, Martha (Dennis) Cooper of Fuquay-Varina, N.C., Amy (Keith) Rose of Wilmington, N.C., and Mark (Michelle) Morgan of Barboursville; five grandchildren, Breanne (Corky) Dowdy, Nathan (Jennifer) Cooper, Morgan (Austin) Eaton, and Rachel and Caleb Morgan; two greatgrandchildren, Lilly and Spencer Dowdy; two brothers, John Morgan of Martinsburg and Morgan Morgan of Cleveland, Ohio.

Over the last 20 years, he was a dedicated member of the Silver Sneakers program at the Phil Cline Family YMCA. He was a daily fixture and will be greatly missed by all those who he encountered, and especially by, Marlene.

Visitation was from noon to 2 p.m., and Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. on Sunday, September 9, 2018 at the Trinity Free Will Baptist Church, 2325 Johnstown Road, Huntington, by Reverends Todd Lovins, Fred Ramey, Ray Williamson and Steve Williams.

CONSTITUTION OF THE WEST VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

Having received salvation through faith in Christ Jesus, and having been baptized as an outward sign of our separation from the world, and realizing the necessity of being identified with and sharing the fellowship of other believers, have joined ourselves to a local visible church, we do ordain this Constitution to unify the work of Free Will Baptists in the State of West Virginia, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ and for the salvation of souls in cooperation with various Conferences or yearly meetings comprising this State Association. **May God Bless our labor**.

Article No. 1 - Membership

- **Section 1.** All ordained Ministers and Deacons belonging to member Local Conferences shall make up the standing delegates to this State Association. Each Local Conference shall be permitted to send three lay delegates to the State Association, plus one delegate from each Church composing that Local Conference.
- **Section 2**. The membership of the State Association shall consist of the Local Conferences. Conferences must be examined by the Executive Board, and approved by the State Association, to become members of this body.
- **Section 3**. Any Minister, Deacon, or Delegate, voting in the State Association, must be a member in good standing, of a Church in good standing with the Local Conference recommending them to the State Association, and must have dues pre-paid or paid during registration for the current State Meeting.
- **Section 4.** This State Association shall be affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists of the United States of America, and recognize the Treatise of Faith and Practice as our guidelines for denominational fellowship, as long as they remain an independent denomination.

Article No. 2 – Discipline

- **Section 1**. The State Association shall have the right to settle questions of discipline, doctrine, or usage, that may properly come before it from any Local Conference composing the State Association, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any of the bodies that belong to the State Association. The said appeal by the Church or Local Conference, shall have been written and signed by the Church or Local Conference making the appeal, then forwarded by mail or in person to the State Association and Local Conference.
- **Section 2.** No Local Conference shall license or ordain to preach or serve as a Deacon any Man having two living wives. No Man having married a divorced Woman shall be licensed or ordained to preach, or ordained as a Deacon in this State Association.

- **Section 3.** No Local Conference shall license or ordain a Woman to preach, or serve as a Deacon.
- **Section 4.** No Local Conference shall be accepted or retained as a member, that license or ordain Women to preach, or serve as a Deacon.
- **Section 5.** The Executive Board shall investigate any charges, after they have been properly presented to the Local Conference of which the grieved party or parties are a member. Any charges presented to this State Association Executive Board for consideration, must be presented in writing and signed by the person or persons making the charges. The Executive Board shall be paid for travel expenses, at the United States Government rate when traveling to meetings for business of the State Association. The party or parties requesting the Executive Board to meet with them, shall be responsible to pay their expenses.
- **Section 6.** Both Scripture and nature as designed by God affirm the lifelong, covenantal union of one man, being male as created by God, and one woman, being female as created by God, in a one-flesh relationship. This one-flesh relationship is emblematic of the union of Christ and His church. It is the sole and beautiful context of the divine plan for the marital relationship of man and woman as image-bearers of God, as well as the foundation for the family as the basic, divinely ordained unit of human society. Violations of this one-flesh union, whether heterosexual or homosexual, premarital or extramarital, contravene the divine plan for the family and for the conception and rearing of children, brining spiritual despair, guilt, and death to individuals and cultures.

Article No. 3 – Officers, Boards and Committees

Section 1. The Officers of the State Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Parliamentarian. Each of whom shall be nominated from the floor. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be elected for a two-year term, and able to succeed themselves for an indefinite period of time. The Clerk and Assistant Clerk, the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be elected for a three-year term. The Parliamentarian shall be elected for a two-year term.

Election shall be determined by a majority vote. Those persons and Officers thus elected shall hold their office until their successors are elected and installed.

Section 2. Duties of the Officers of the State Association

- **I- Moderator.** It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings to see that all the Constitution and By-Laws are obeyed and respected, and to exercise all the right to vote. The right to vote shall be given the Moderator only in case of a tie. He shall be allowed to speak on any subject provided the Assistant is in the chair.
- II- Assistant Moderator. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator in any way he can, in the discharge of his duty. This duty shall not be construed to abridge his right to vote when in the chair, in which he shall be governed to the same rule as that affecting the Moderator.

III- Clerk. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a complete record of all Executive Board and State Association meetings, and to publish them in book form. Minutes Books are to be distributed to Local Conferences composing this State Association. All expenses of such records, printing, and distribution, are to be defrayed by the treasury.

The Clerk has authorization for expenses of up to \$1000 per year, for needed supplies to carry out the duties of clerk. These expenses are to be defrayed by the treasury.

- **IV- Assistant Clerk**. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Clerk to assist the Clerk in his duties, and fill-in in his absence.
- V- Treasurer. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold and keep all such money as may come into the State Association and disburse it only at the direction of proper authorities. He shall make a bond of not less than all funds coming into his possession. The bond to be defrayed from the treasury of the general fund.
- VI- Assistant Treasurer. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Treasurer to assist the Treasurer in his duties, and fill-in in his absence.
- VII- Parliamentarian. It shall be the duty of the Parliamentarian to act as an expert in the rules and usage of Roberts Rules of Order, in regard to all deliberations and business conducted by the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist. The Parliamentarian shall rule on any mis-use or abuse of procedures or business brought before said Association.
- **VIII- Promotional Director.** It shall be the duty of the Promotional Director to strive for the enlistment of new Conferences into membership of the West Virginia State Association. To promote the works of this State Association first, and the work of Free Will Baptists in new fields. The office of Promotional Director shall not be used to settle disputes between brethren and Conferences.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

POSITION:

Promotional Director.

FUNCTION:

To promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist. To actively interface with WV FWB Conferences and Churches. To promote the WV State Association and its works to other FWB State Associations, Colleges, and National Organizations.

ORGANIZATION RELATIONSHIPS:

The office of the Promotional Director shall be filled, supported and supervised by the Executive Committee of the West Virginia State Association. The Executive Committee may by two-thirds vote modify the duties of the Promotional Director to the State Association.

DUTIES AND RESPNSIBILITIES:

Accountability:

The Promotional Director shall provide a written report bimonthly to the Executive Committee and an annual written report to the State Association. The Promotional Director shall meet bimonthly with the Executive Committee.

The Promotional Director shall present an operating budget for approval to the Executive Committee. Once approved, the Promotional Director shall be responsible to operate within the budget.

National Meetings:

The Promotional Director, will attend and represent the WV State Association annually at the National Convention and the National Leadership Conference.

Conference and Church Meetings:

The Promotional Director shall attend and represent the WV State Association at as many Local Conferences as possible. He shall attend every Conference at least once every two years.

The Promotional Director will make as many Church visits throughout West Virginia as his schedule allows. To promote the works of the WV State Association; to minister to the pastors; and to keep people informed about the issues affecting Free Will Baptists.

Coordination:

The Promotional Director will participate in all WV State Association Board Meetings. To provide general oversight to the Free Will Baptist work in West Virginia and provide insight in regard to National Free Will Baptist issues.

The Promotional Director will work closely with the Publication Board in the publication of the State Paper

(The Messenger); and have direct impact as to its contents and format. This is to provide consistency in the promotion of West Virginia's Free Will Baptist.

Strategic Goals:

The Promotional Director shall proactively work towards the Strategic Goals defined by the Executive Committee and as listed in the Addendum.

Other Duties:

The Promotional Director will serve as a pastor's role to our WV pastors by counseling and encouraging them. He will also provide resources for them and their flock for their spiritual growth.

The Promotional Director will promote women and youth activities.

The Promotional Director will have a strong emphasis on Missions, and promote our WV Missionaries.

The Promotional Director shall work with the Masters Men Board to carry out the Disaster Response Plan, and serve as the liaison between the National Association and the State Association.

The Promotional Director will make himself available to the WV State Boards for special projects and to promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director will make a verbal report at the State Association.

The Promotional Director will be the states representative to Randall House Publications. He will comply with the promotional guidelines set forth by Randall House as follows: (on any product, program, or service that is acceptable to WV).

- Promotional Director to write a minimum of four letters a year for promotion of Randall House Publications in conjunction with our campaigns.
- · Promotional Director will attend a minimum of two training events during the year.
- · Promotional Director will promote literature and books in churches, conferences, and at the state meetings.
- State will provide a half page in state newsletter for use in promoting Randall House Publications.

The Promotional Director will promote our ministers and provide resources for them such as; training, retirement fund, insurance, church resources, etc.

The Promotional Director will provide connections with all FWB Colleges and provide resources for our young people to attend College.

The Promotional Director will work toward establishing a permanent State Office in the location approved by the WV State Association. It will be used for meetings and a repository for minutes, financial reports, historical records, and other documents of the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director may hold another job for means of additional income; however, his employment is not to interfere with his required duties as Promotional Director.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The qualifications of the Promotional Director are as follows:

Must be saved.

Must be an active member of a Free Will Baptist Church associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must currently be an ordained minister from a Conference or State associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must have been ordained for at least five years and have been in good standing with his Church, Conference, and State Association.

Must be willing to transfer by letter his membership and ordination papers to a Church and Conference associated with the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist, if not currently associated with West Virginia.

Must have prior experience in dealing effectively with various denominational groups (such as: Churches, Conferences, State Associations, FWB Colleges, National Organizations, etc.) and the public.

Must have adequate training and experience in business and computers.

CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS:

The Promotional Director shall have an annual contract effective from January 1 until December 31. The contract shall be reviewed, and renewed or cancelled in June for the following year. This will give a minimum of six months notice in case of non-renewal, however, in case the Conference calls for the ordination papers, the Promotional Director will be relieved of duties while investigation and hearing is taking place, and given two month's salary.

Remuneration will consist of:

- (1) Salary and benefits set annually by mutual agreement of the Executive Committee and the Promotional Director.
- (2) Expense reimbursement for attending the National Association \$1200.00, and the National Leadership Conference \$450.
- (3) Shall have two week's vacation after one year of employment, and have three week's vacation after five years of employment.

ADDENDUM

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S STRATEGIC GOALS FOR THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR

(for future use).

- **IX- The Executive Board** The Executive Board shall act as the State Association when State Association is not in session, action subject to approval by State Association. (see article #4 for more information)
- **X- Program Committee** That a Program Committee be elected on Friday morning to prepare the program for the coming year. This Committee shall act as a Placement Committee and shall comply with the Constitution in making their choice for the Church, where the State Association is to be held. This Committee shall consist of two ordained Ministers, one Deacon, and four members of duly seated Delegates. This Committee shall be prepared to report to the State Association on Saturday.
- XI- The Mission Board This Board is to be an eight-member Board, with expiration to be two at four years, two at three years, two at two years, and two at one year terms. It shall be the duty of this Board to work to promote International Missions, and North American Ministries work throughout the State of West Virginia. This Missions Board shall cooperate with the National Association, and endeavor to raise funds for the Missions Board and our denomination. This Board shall arrange Missionary Conferences throughout the state work as it feels necessary. Also, to promote new Churches and Conferences through the State of West Virginia where we do not have established Free Will Baptist Work. The Mission Board has the authority to organize within themselves, as to Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.
- XII- Publication Board The Publication Board shall consist of five (5) members elected for a term of five (5) years and elected so that one member is elected annually. It shall organize with an Editor, Associate Editor, Treasurer and three Associate Editors. It shall be the duty of this Board to publish a regular news publication concerning the various ministries of Free Will Baptist in West Virginia and in the world. Also, that the news publication include a news letter format. This Board shall be limited to new purchases of \$300.00 per year without approval of the Association or the Executive Board.
- XIII- Christian Education Board This Board shall consist of seven (7) members elected for a term of seven (7) years and elected as so that one member be elected annually. It shall organize within itself a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. It shall be the duty of this Board to generally oversee the educational efforts of this Association. This would include but not be limited to (A) organize and conduct a State Bible Institute; (B) Establish Sunday Schools; (C) Promote Church Training Services (CTS) and generally oversee competitive events on the state and local levels.
- **XIV- Trustee Board** The duties of this Board shall be to hold titles to all real property belonging to this body; the maintenance and upkeep of all such properties; the planning and supervision of all developments; and the expansion of these properties as directed by the West Virginia State Association.

It is agreed, in this connection, that the Board of Trustees shall at no time sell or encumber these properties by mortgage, lien, or otherwise without the express consent of this body given in regular session of this Association.

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to receive, in behalf of and for the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists, gifts, grants, monies, real estate, or other valuable assets.

The Board of Trustees shall act for and in behalf of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists in any and all transactions involving any of it's properties, but shall do so strictly in accordance with instructions given by said State Association in regular or called session.

XV- Nominating Committee — The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) ordained Ministers elected for a term of one (1) year. It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to select candidates, who are qualified and available to fill Boards and or Committees. They will begin their search for candidates from the time they are elected until they make their report at next scheduled State Meeting. They shall meet with the Executive Board semiannually and yearly Pre-State Meeting.

XVI- Executive Committee — This Committee would be made up of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Chairman of Missions and Christian Education Board, Editor of State Paper, Ex officio member, President of the Women Active for Christ, and two Members at Large from the Executive Board to be chosen by this body. This Committee is to supervise and oversee the Promotional Director, State Office (if and when established), and Newspaper. The duties of this Board would be Executive and Promotional.

The Executive Committee will set an annual budget for the Ministries under their supervision.

The Executive Committee will submit this budget to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Committee will provide an annual report to the Executive Board to include goals, milestones, financial status, and any important concerns.

The Executive Committee will report the number of meetings conducted the past year.

The Executive Committee will report to the West Virginia State Association during the annual session.

XVII- Master's Men Board — The purpose of the Master's Men Board shall be to promote and encourage the Men of Free Will Baptist Churches in West Virginia to become active in the Master's Men program and to assist in starting Chapters in the local Churches or Conferences, and will be responsible for maintaining and dispersing the West Virginia Master's Men fund.

This Board shall coordinate work projects to assist the Churches of West Virginia to build and remodel as needed on a volunteer basis. This Board shall also coordinate programs for fellowship and spiritual growth for the Men in the Churches throughout the state. These programs may be in the form of retreats, workshops and seminars, etc.

This Board will in cooperation with the Moderator and Promotional Director, distribute monies given for Disaster Relief as designated or as instructed, to Free Will Baptist Organizations selected for assistance.

All members of this Board shall serve as corresponding messengers to the Conference and Churches of West Virginia, and give report to the Chairmen, who will then give report to the West Virginia State Association.

The Master's Men Board shall consist of seven (7) members serving from one seven-year member to a one year member, with one new member elected annually. The Board will have the right to replace any member that resigns with another man to serve pro-tem until the next State Meeting.

The Masters Men Board will elect a Chairman.

The State Treasurer will deposit and disperse funds in the Masters Men account at the direction of the Masters Men Board.

The Chairman of the Masters Men Board shall present an annual plan outlining their goals for the coming year. The plan is to be approved by the Executive Board, and presented to the State Association.

XVIII- Women Active for Christ (WAC) — The West Virginia WAC Convention will be recognized as subordinate to the West Virginia State Association; but it shall organize at its own discretion and have power to create and adopt a Constitution and By-Laws and maintain management of the work for which it is constituted. The State WAC shall report its accomplishments and financial operations annually to the West Virginia State Association.

Purpose Statement: We are Women seeking to fulfill the Great Commission through our God designed roles in the home, the Church, the Community and around the world. The purpose of the WV WAC is to promote and encourage the Women of Free Will Baptist Churches in West Virginia to become active in the program of WNAC and to assist in starting groups in local Churches and will be responsible for maintaining and dispersing all funds received by the State WAC.

The Officers of this Convention shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Historian, Treasurer, Mission Chairman, three (3) Field Workers and three (3) Members at Large. Six of these shall compose a quorum. These will be elected every two years. All Officers are to be a member of a Free Will Baptist Church and a WAC group which reports to the State Convention. Revised 06/09/2018

Article No. 4 – Executive Board

- **Section 1**. The Executive Board shall be composed of one ordained Minister from each Local Conference that is in good standing with the State Association.
- **Section 2.** If any member of the Executive Board is unable to attend, he must send a proxy in his place.
- **Section 3.** At a regular scheduled session, 10:00 a.m. the Saturday before the State Meeting, this Board shall hear the reports of all Standing Boards and Officers. It shall serve as a Budget Committee and make recommendations as deemed pertinent to the State Association. This Board will also examine the Conference letters and report findings at State Meeting.

Article No. 5 – Standing Boards

The standing Boards shall be the following: Mission Board, Christian Education Board, Publication Board, Master's Men Board, and the Board of Trustees.

Article No. 6 - Fees

- **Section 1.** Annual Dues from Conference to State Association shall be as follows: Churches with 0 to 25 membership will pay \$25.00, Churches with 26 to 50 membership will pay \$50.00, Churches with 51 to 75 membership will pay \$75.00, Churches with any additional membership above 75 members will pay an additional \$25.00 per each additional twenty-five membership, plus National Dues.
- **Section 2.** All Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates shall pay Ten Dollars (\$10.00) registration fee (dues), with the exception of those Ministers and Deacons who are Sixty-five years of age or disabled. Three dollars (\$3.00) to go to the host church, Seven Dollars (\$7.00) to go to the State Association. (Revised 6/8/2019)
- **Section 3**. Any Minister receiving a good standing card must pay his Ten Dollar (\$10.00) dues. If the Minister is disable or retired, he is not required to pay dues. Each Local Conference is requested to collect the Ministers and Deacons dues and send to the State Association with their letter.
- **Section 4.** The State Association shall if requested, pay all Board and Committee members mileage at the United States Government rate, when traveling to meetings for business of the State Association. If any Conference does not pay the mileage expense for their Executive Board member, the State Association will pay that expense. Any other parties requesting a Board or Committee of the State Association to meet with them, shall be responsible to pay their mileage. This excludes mileage to the National Association or National Leadership Conference

Article No. 7 - Meetings

Section 1. The State Association shall hold its regular meeting annually on Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in June at a place and date fixed by the regular session and made known before adjournment.

Special meetings may be called by the Executive Board when extreme necessity demands, provided that the Clerk of each Local Conference has been properly notified fifteen days before the date of the meeting of this organization.

Section 2. Any Local Conference or Church desiring to host the State Association, shall complete a Hosting Application Form with the seating, dining, and parking capacities. They shall also provide a list of local Hotels and Restaurants, with an approximate distance from the host Church.

Article No. 8 - Revisions

This Constitution may be revised or changed at any regular session of the West Virginia State Association provided the change is presented in writing and stated one day before vote is taken.

BY-LAWS

- 1- A portion of the scripture shall be read and prayer be offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session of the State Association and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.
- 2- The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to order at the hour designated by the program committee. When Moderator nor Assistant is present, the Clerk shall call the meeting to order and elect a Moderator-protem.
- 3- It shall be the duty of the Local Conferences so composing this organization to send a letter to it giving accurately as possible the information requested by the State and National Association.
- 4- Not over one Deacon shall be appointed on any one committee. Except in case of emergency.
- 5- Only ordained Ministers shall be allowed to moderate this meeting.
- 6- All Sunday School Conventions and the State WAC Convention shall report to the State Association and their report be received as information.
- 7- In case of controversy regarding parliamentary procedures, Robert's Rules of Order shall be considered as final authority.
- 8- All business except routine shall be brought by Committee, but should the Committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this State Association, then such business cannot be discussed unless by vote of this body.
- 9- No one shall speak for more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 10- Each Conference shall have its letter and finance report sent to the State Association Clerk on or before May 24th, so that the Executive Board may examine them the week prior to the State Meeting.
- 11- Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the body and by a two thirds majority of all members present, thereon. This decision shall be sustained or rejected.
- 12- No one shall leave the body without consent of the Moderator. Anyone deciding to speak shall arise and say "Brother Moderator" and shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator. The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or think it will lead to discord or division

- 13- This State Association shall correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 14- The same person or group of persons shall not serve on more than one standing Board or Committee, as long as it can be supplied otherwise.
- 15- Not less than three (3) Gospel Sermons shall be preached at any one session of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 16- No person shall be elected to any office without being present, except the Executive Board members. (The member is recommended by the Local Conference).
- 17- The Moderator shall be elected at the close of each two-year session on Saturday, and shall serve until his successor is elected at the same time the following two years.
- 18- No Ministers, Deacons or Delegates shall be permitted to vote that is a known Homosexual, Bi-Sexual, Transsexual, Transgender, or Lesbian in this State Association. The State Association will not retain any persons known to be such.
- 19- The Officers of the State Association shall receive an honorarium as follows:

 Moderator \$100/Yr. Assistant Moderator \$50/Yr.

 Clerk \$4800/Yr. Treasurer \$4800/Yr.
- 20- The General Board member of the National Association, the Moderator and the Promotional Director shall receive a total of \$1200.00 each to attend the National Association. The Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Parliamentarian shall receive \$400 when the National Association convenes east of the Mississippi River and \$600 when west of the Mississippi River, if they attend. All are eligible to receive \$300 to attend the National Leadership Conference.
- 21- Any Minister having voting privileges in the State Association must have a good standing card issued by the State Association.
- 22- Any ordained or licensed Free Will Baptist Minister that assumes the position as Pastor of a Church whose general doctrine teaches or advocates second works of grace, eternal security, or speaking in tongues must immediately surrender his ordination papers or license to the Conference of issuance.
- 23- These By-Laws may be changed or revised at any regular session of the State Association provided that they be plainly written and stated one day before vote is taken.

Clerk: Reviewed the business items from the 2018 State Association.

Reports:

State Promotional Director's Report: Bro. Rickie Holstein. He highlighted his 644 hours worked, and the 8641 miles traveled since June 2nd. He has visited 20 Conferences and 7 Churches. He has preached at various Conferences, filled in for Pastors, attended wakes, and participated in various Board and Committee Meetings, and did several Hospital visits. He is working on 7 or 8 additional Churches with the Tri County Conference to join the State Association. They vote in May to see if they want to join the State Association. Visited the Gordon Church that was flooded some time back. Other things in the works which we will discuss later are, I am working with Nashville on sharing our History, possible Missions Conferences, record storage, an All Boards Meeting, and a Men's Retreat. Bro. Rickie has a Power Point presentation he would love to come to any Church and present. M / S to receive Promotional Director's report. Motion passed.

Assistant Moderator GW Mounts takes charge while Bro. Earl gives his Executive Committee report.

Executive Committee Report: Report was given by Bro. Earl White. The Committee has met 4 times. They approved the Treasurer to purchase a new computer, but since the funds have dropped off, Bro. Curtis has not purchased one yet. They would like to see us have a Men's Retreat. They recommend that we dissolve the Pastor's Retirement Fund, and for the money to go into the General Fund. The criteria for this fund is no longer in line with our Pastors and has been inactive since 2009. They met with 3 members of the Huff Creek Conference. That Conference has 6 Churches that has formed another Conference (Huff Creek #1 Conference), and they wanted guidance on joining the State Association. The Committee has discussed the lack of financial giving and has discussed ways to address this concern. They appointed a 5-member committee to address options on funding our State Association. We have dropped around \$19,000 since this time last year.

M / S to receive the Executive Committee report. After much discussion on Co-Op, funding, and Huff Creek #1 Conference, the Motion passed.

Treasurers Report: Asst. Treasurer Rev. Scott Erwin gave treasurer's report.

Mission Board Report: Report was given by Rev. Rex Cox. The Board has met 4 times. Members have visited several Conferences. March for Missions revivals have been scheduled in different areas, this year's goal is \$50,000, and will be divided 5 ways, which is the 4 missions works and the general fund. The Mission Boards Scholarship is available. Last year's recipient was Hanna Gorrell. The Bulgarian work is going good. Jonathan and Amy Postlewaite, and Tim and Lydia Awtrey are doing a great job working there in Bulgaria. They need our prayers. The Government is trying to pass a law that Government interpreters must be present to interpret for all religious type meetings. Bro. Josue and Christina Rivera are working in the Eastern Panhandle. Their account is very low, and they need support. The crackdown on immigration laws has lowered their meeting attendance and their chances to witness to the Hispanic population. Rev. Maitland and Jessica Bailey have begun their work in the Morgantown. They have rented a house, and a Recreation Center to hold services in. They will be holding their first service the first Sunday in March. Please pray for and support this work. The Board has met with the Brothers from the Brotherhood Conference and has partnered with them to support Brother D.J. Scarberry with \$200 per month to start a Church in the Salt Lick area, with hopes that Churches in that area will pick up that work. The Board is giving \$1100 to Hanna Gorrell who is going to Ecuador on a Missions Trip. M / S to receive the Mission Board report. Motion passed.

Our mission project was to raise money for Josue Rivera, and Jeff and Susan Turnbough to support their mission work. We received a great offering and received donations of \$1232.35. We are doing the Adopt-A-Granny program, which includes any outreach activity, and the Sunday School enhancement program again this year. The Bible, Music, and Arts Festival will be March 30, 2019 at the Central FWB Church, Huntington, WV starting at 8:30am. Last year we had 11 youth to go on to the National competitions. We need our kids more now than ever before. Deacons and Ministers need to be raised up. No Treasurers report was given. M / S to receive the report. Motion passed.

Business session called back to order at 1:00 pm. Prayer by Rev. Rickie Holstein.

Historical Committee: Brother Rickie Holstein reported we still need HELP! We have history on 55 Churches and 5 Conferences. He still needs information on around 80 Churches, plus Conferences. All the History he has is now on the Website. Also a "Who's Who Among WV Free Will Baptist can be found on the website. More discussion later on History.

M / S to receive the report. Motion passed.

Publication Board: Report was given by Bro. Adam White. We feel we have made improvements to the Messenger. We would like more involvement from our Churches. We have had Business Cards printed free of charge to pass out to the Churches with the Messenger info on them. No Minister has utilized the Ministers Looking to Pastor Area. We would like to see that area used. We have attempted to get e-mail addresses for our Church leaders. Communication is the key to keeping our folks informed. Our goal is to provide quality, relevant, timely information about our churches, state, and national association. If your Church or Pastor does not have e-mail, please designate someone within the Church that has e-mail, to be the contact so information can get to the Church and pastor. See our Facebook page for many articles that are not included in the Messenger due to the lack of space. Last year we sent out forms to the Conference Clerks to get Church information. We have only gotten 5 back. Please go back and have your Conference to get us that information.

M / S to receive Publication Board report. Motion passed.

Nominating Committee: No report.

Web Master: Report given by Rev. Jim Sturgill. Bro Jim says he does not own the site, and therefore does not generate information to go on there. He only posts what he is instructed or requested to. The web site is surprising in the number of hits of around 2000 per month. He has cleaned up some of the unused items. It is currently listed as being unsecure, and is working on getting it to be a secure site. This will probably give us even more hits. We can post some of the information we have discussed today. The calendrer is now up and running with all the Conference dates listed. Probably within our pass worded area we could list our financial structure explaining the Co-Operative giving plan that would inform our people and reduce confusion.

M / S to receive Web Masters report. Motion passed

Clerk's Report: The subscription is due in early March for Microsoft Office. It is \$100 per year and there are additional licenses available if needed. No one has requested to host the 2021 State Association. The State Letter packets are ready to be mailed out to the Conference Clerks.

M / S to receive Clerk's report. Motion passed.

Unfinished Business: The letter has been hand delivered to Brother Ryan Lewis at the National Executive Office asking the National to consider West Virginia to host a National Convention in the future.

New Business: Points of information discussed were,

1- The 5 member Committee appointed to work on funding. The committee will research options for funding, checking with other states to see how their funding works. The consensus was the majority of those present think they should look into other ways of funding besides CO-OP. One option discussed is for the Churches to pay a monthly fee according to their membership, to the State Association. The thought is that so much money per member would be paid to the State from each Church. This would take place of State and National dues, Co-Op, \$0.50 per member, and could be less of a financial burden, since Churches currently pay their State and National dues in one big chunk.* The National dues are going up \$25 the next two years. *This type of funding plan would be more of a work load on Church Treasurers and a great increase of recordkeeping on our State Treasurer. *It is feared if we base the fee on

Church membership, with the current trend of membership dropping off, we could be setting ourselves up to fail, and still come up short on funding. *With this type of funding we must make sure we have enough money for the State Association to pay the National dues for each Church. *Many of the small Churches are barley getting by now, with elderly members on fixed incomes. They wouldn't be able to pay increased fees. *Should we be concentrating on cutting expenses our self within the State? We have already cut costs on the Messenger. *Currently 10 Churches and 4 Conferences are all that is supporting CO-OP. *We need to get the rest of the people participating. *CO-OP is nothing more than the Churches tithing. *Pastors need to preach and educate our people and Churches on tithing. *However if we restructure funding, it is going to cost the Churches more money than they are paying now! *Based on our current number of total members, and the amount of State dues paid, it currently averages out to \$1.27 per member, which is obviously not nearly enough. *Co-Op allows everyone to participate and feel they are helping support the State work. *A change in funding would take time to develop, and then we would have to roll it out and educate our people, and you can't make them pay! *We need more funding now; we need to increase Co-Op giving now! *Another option is to increase our State Dues. *This discussion has given the 4 Committee members' that are here today, a lot to consider.

- 2- A discussion was held on the Digest of Reports, and the amount of work that needs to be done in such a short period of time. It would be so much easier if all the reports were e-mailed to the Moderator and then the Digest would be printed and stapled without all the handling of the individual reports. This cost would be around \$115 for the paper and ink to print. This would be a cost savings overall, since many have to get their reports printed at a print shop, and we have to pay postage to get the pre-State minutes mailed to be placed in the Digest. The State should reimburse the Church or School.
- **3- Historical records.** The National Historical Commission would like to have our history. Do we want to give our history to them to keep, or do we want to make copies of what we have, keep the originals, and give them the copies? If we keep the originals we need a secure place for storage.

Item of Business.

M / S to (a) allow Rev. Rickie Holstein to share our State historical records with the National Historical Commission, at his digressions by either giving them our original copies or allowing them make their own copies. (b) Giving Brother Holstein permission to price rental fees for storage facilities, or to find a Church that would store our State records and give Bro. Rickie access. This is to be presented to the State Association on Friday as an item of business for approval or rejection. Motion carried.

- **4- Missions Conferences** Is anyone interested in a Missions Conference? Do you feel your Churches, Conferences, or members would attend or host a Missions Conference? Some feel the Missions Revival we are having is a type of Missions Conference.
- 5- All Boards meeting- Rickie would like to see an "All Boards meeting to get all Boards and Committees together to schedule all meetings and to place them on a calendar. The intent is to try schedule meet on different dates.

6- Men's Retreat- Do we want to have a Men's Retreat? Yes was the consensus. The thought is to schedule one, have pre-registration to assure we will have enough attendance to make it worthwhile. It would not cost the State anything, since those attending are paying for rooms and registration.

Item of Business.

M / S to give the Promotional Director, working with Masters Men, authority to plan a Men's Retreat. It will be based on pre-registration. If there is not enough men registered, it would be cancelled. To be presented to the State Association for approval. Motion carried.

With no other business,

 $\mbox{M}\slash\mbox{S}$ was moved to close the business session until our next regularly scheduled meeting. Motion carried.

I recommend to the Executive Board that they receive all 20 Conferences into fellowship, and that we seat for voting privileges, their Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates who have paid their dues, and that are properly registered. We also received proper letter and finances from the Huff Creek #1 Conference who is desiring to take membership with this Association. M / S to approve. Motion carried.

Un-finished Business: The 5-member Financial Committee recommended to stay with the Co-Op plan. We need to educate and encourage our Churches to support Co-Op. M / S to accept as a point of information. Motion carried.

New Business:

The Moderator said that the Huff Creek #1 Conference who is desiring to take membership with this Association has lettered with proper finances. Their Clerk, Rev Billy Cantrell has provided letters of good standing as requested for the 6 Churches that has formed their Conference.

M / S was moved to accept the Huff Creek #1 Conference into the State Association. Questions- was the split off from the Huff Creek Conference due to doctrinal or administrative issues? Doctrinal, but all is well between us, was the answer. Vote was unanimous to accept the Conference. Motion passed.

The Tri-County Conference that our Promotional has been encouraging to join our State Association, voted in May to not take membership. Reason being, some of their Ministers do not meet the requirements of our Association.

The Promotional Director presented his proposed budget for 2019 – 2020, the totals are unchanged from last year.

Another option would be for the Promotional Director to send the Messenger articles to a list of those without access.

M / S to phase out the Messenger in print form. After questions, a

M / S was moved to amend the original motion to have one final printing of the Messenger informing our people the paper would no longer be printed and mailed, to request they send e-mail addresses so the Messenger can be e-mailed to individuals, that the e-mail addresses be protected and not shared with outsides, and to also phase out the Publication Board. A vote was taken and approved to pass the amendment. A vote was taken to approve the original motion to phase out the printed form of the Messenger, and motion passed. (To be presented to the State Association.)

M / S to dissolve the Co-Op Committee and to have the Executive Board Members from each Conference to be a representative of Co-Op. Vote taken and motion carried. (To be presented to the State Association.)

Bro. Rickie Holstein reported on the cost of climate-controlled storage units for record storage. A 5' X 7'unit is \$39.95 per/month, and a 5' X 14' unit is \$49.95 per/month. This space could be used for storing record for the Historical Committee, Promotional Director, Mission Board, Treasurer, Clerk, etc.

M / S to give Bro. Rickie Holstein authority choose the size, and rent a climate-controlled storage unit, and to give access to whoever has a need to access the records. Motion carried. (To be presented to the State Association.)

A discussion was held concerning the Ministers, Deacons, and Wives Breakfast. It is a big expense on the Host Church to prepare. It is early Saturday morning to attend. The consensus was to cancel this activity.

M / S to cancel this years and future Ministers, Deacons, and Wives Breakfasts. Motion carried.

The Promotional Director reported that upon our request to host a future National Convention, Keith Burden and Ryan Lewis from the National Executive Office came to Charleston to look over the facilities at the Civic Center. They were pleased with the facilities and available housing. They are offering for West Virginia to host the 2026 Convention. We will need to raise \$40,000

 $M\,/\,S$ to host the 2026 National Convention. Motion carried. (To be presented to the State Association.)

PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT June 7, 2019

Year two.., has been a very busy year.., and one that I believe has been a productive year.

I have been well received everywhere that I have been.

I have met many pastors, preachers, and lay members that I did not know before, and hopefully I have made some new friends among those I have met.

I have heard some good messages, good singing, and good testimonies . . .

But most all I have enjoyed the fellowship, and the Spirit of the Lord, that I felt among our people.

What a wonderful time we had in Little Rock! Four-thousand seven- hundred seventeen visitors came together for fellowship, worship and business. There were Three-thousand four- hundred sixteen who registered for the Youth Convention.

Lots of people enjoyed the many seminars at the convention. The exhibit hall was one of the main attractions as people meandered their way through the aisles, stopping to talk with the vendors and friends, and viewed the exhibits. Many preachers could be seen buying materials at the Randall House display while others were more interested in browsing the youth or the women's sections.

Three of our Bible Colleges had people on hand to discuss and answer questions. Southeastern College has a new president, Nate Ange. They have decided to remain on their present campus. Welch College, formerly Free Will Baptist Bible College, had many pictures of their new campus located in Gallatin, Tennessee just 30 miles north of the former campus. The new campus is beautiful, having all new buildings and an entire new campus designed to attract and serve students. It is definitely an answer to prayer, and with accreditation by both the Bible College Association and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, it truly is a wonderful place to educate our young men and women. Offering many majors and minors, our high school graduates have many options available from which to choose their program of study. In addition to a rosy financial picture and plans to add another residence hall and a 2000 seat chapel the enrollment had jumped to 446 with a healthy increase expected this year. She also shared some pretty funny "Granny Sitting Stories!" We received a lot of good comments about this session.

We had some really great music too! Friday night the music was provided by ladies from the Little Creek FWB Church. What a blessing! And on Saturday, Ginny Hansford and Barbara Curry of Slaughter's Creek FWB provided the music. We even had violin music! It was like heaven!

Our mission project was to raise money for Josue Rivera and Jeff and Susan Turnbough. We received a great offering for these missionaries. We received donations of \$1,232.35 to be divided between these missionaries.

Let me share some exciting things that happened in May! Our annual convention was held on May 18th at the Prince of Peace FWB Church in Huntington. The meeting began at 10 a.m. The theme for that day was "Making a Difference."

Our mission project for the day was to bring industrial size canned food products for the Huntington City Mission. The value of the items brought that day was estimated around \$1,000! The food would not only help with the meals there during the day but also would help with bag lunches for underemployed people who stay at the mission but work during the day.





The City Mission's director, Bro. Mitch Webb, was with us that day and shared about the various services of the Mission. They are doing an excellent job in helping those who are having a hard time either by bad choices of their own or by those in their family.

Our ladies were introduced to the "Love A Bible Project" that day. We were challenged to love a Bible (or two or three!) from this meeting until our Retreat in September. All these "loved" Bibles will be brought to retreat at Bethel FWB in September and prayed over. These Bibles will then be given to Bro. Mitch for the Huntington City Mission to share with those coming through their doors who do not have a Bible of their own. What a wonderful project to change lives!

The special treat for the day will be the fact that Sis. Bobby Bowen was with us as our special speaker. She shared how she has made a difference in people's lives in The Works in Jinja, Uganda. I can tell you from talking to her that the life of a missionary isn't easy but the motivation is that they are changing lives – making a difference.

Retreat will be held on September 6th·7th, 2019 at the Bethel FWB Church in MacArthur, WV. The theme will be "Entrusted" taken from II Timothy 1-2. As we have been entrusted with the true Word of God, we must also share this with those who come after us. Deuteronomy 6 says we're supposed to teach our children all through the day and evening time every day! Our speaker will be Sister Sarah Mason from Powell, Ohio. Christian Education Board Report

June 2019

The Christian Education Board has certainly been blessed this year. Many of the programs established in recent years are still going, but are still in need of participation from our churches. The annual Bible, Music, and Arts Festival is continuing to grow and the talents of our youth are certainly growing with it. We are here to help our churches educate their members and reach out to their communities and make an impact for Christ. We would like to update everyone on the programs sponsored or promoted by the Christian Education Board:

Youth Event Sponsors

We understand the need to involve the youth in our local churches, as well as the need for revivals and events to engage the youth in our communities. We have established a sponsorship program for any of our churches to receive \$100 toward hosting a youth revival or youth event. One event selected for sponsorship in 2018 was postponed.

Bible, Music, and Arts Festival

The 2018 Bible, Music, and Arts Festival was held at Victory FWB in Pecks Mill, WV. 72 entries from over 45 young people participated in the festival from seven churches, three of which had not previously participated. We look forward to seeing our first time participating churches: Bright Star, Freedom, and West Williamson again next year. 12 entries proceeded on to the National CTS Expo in Little Rock, Arkansas in July 2018.

We recently held our 2019 Bible, Music, and Arts Festival at Central FWB in Huntington, WV. A new record was set for participation in recent years with 136 entries from 94 participants from 7 churches. This year we welcomed Springdale FWB as a first year participant. Big Elk FWB marked their 10th consecutive year of participation. Freedom FWB was awarded the plaque for Most Participants, with 24 young people entering from their church.

The 2020 Bible, Music, and Arts Festival will be held on March 28, 2020 at the Nolan FWB Church in Williamson WV. Entries for the festival are due by March 8, 2020. More information about the festival and entry submission will be made available on our website.

Participation in and preparation for the Bible, Music, and Arts Festival is a wonderful opportunity for our youth. This is an opportunity for them to showcase their abilities and talents in their style of worship, whether that be by scripture memorization, in song, in music, in drama, or in artistic ability. Their participation or placement does not value one person's gift over another, but gives each child a boost in striving to reach their next goal, whether that be to memorize longer passages, to learn a new song or instrument, or to practice and develop

Audit Committee Report To The West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptist

To the best of our ability the Audit Committee found the financial records to be in PROPER ORDER. We looked at the records of the West Virginia State Association of the FWB, the West Virginia FWB Mission Board, and the Christian Education Board. We agreed to look at the West Virginia WAC records during the State Meeting. This was due to Doctor appointments at the time of the Audit meeting. The information provided covered the fiscal year starting on January 1, 2018 and ending on December 31, 2018. We carefully examined the following: Computer printouts, invoices, cancelled checks, balance sheets, receipts, and bank statements. We found the check book and bank statements to reconcile (balance much like an individual would their check book) for three sets of books. We also made sure the computer printouts and checks matched the invoices and receipts as they should. We are sure the West Virginia WAC records will also reconcile.

The Audit Committee believes according to the REVIEW by the accountant on May 26, 2015 that all financial things are being done correctly (next REVIEW is due next year in 2020). A 1099 Form again was issued for anyone who is paid \$600 or more, whereas the Promotional Director was issued a W-2 Form. We would like to thank the people who filled out the reimbursement forms with receipts attached and the treasurers who did a great job of asking for them. Some people created their own forms with the correct information on them which seemed to work very well (the committee thought this was alright). We would remind all the people who get reimbursed to do the same great job this year.

The committee met on April 6, 2019 at Grace FWB Church. Three of the committee members were present. Rev. Jackie Grimmett could not make the meeting on this date. Rev. Kenneth Samms could not make it because he was sick. Bro. Curtis Hall, treasurer for the State Association, made the meeting on this date. Rev. Rickie Holstein, treasurer for the West Virginia FWB Mission Board, and Sister Amy Smith, treasurer for the West Virginia FWB Christian Education Board, provided the documents needed for the Audit meeting. Sister Linda Hutchison treasurer for the West Virginia WAC will be providing records at The State Meeting. As the chairman, I would like to say the people I worked with are a great group.

Our thanks go out to the treasurers (Bro. Curtis Hall, Rev. Rickie Holstein, Sister Amy Smith and Sister Linda Hutchison) for all the work and many many hours they put in for our benefit. Our thanks as well go out to the Grace FWB Church and its pastor Kenneth Samms for allowing us to meet at the church. To each and every one of you we would like to thank you for the privilege of allowing us to serve on the committee.

The Free Will Baptist Board of Retirement is the financial services agency of the National Association of Free Will Baptists. The Board of Retirement wants to partner with you to help you fulfill God's purpose both now and in the future. Here at the Board of Retirement, we strive to help our Free Will Baptist employees, churches and organizations "prepare for their future ministries." We have three ministry focuses...Retirement Planning, Institutional Investing, and Financial Education.

RETIREMENT PLANNING

Planning For Your Retirement – The best time to begin planning for your retirement is now. Making contributions to a salary deferral program is one of the easiest and most important steps you can take to ensure a secure financial future. The Board of Retirement Plan provides that important option.

The Board of Retirement administers the Retirement Pension plan established by the National Association of Free Will Baptists ("Plan"). It is a defined contribution 403(b)(9) pension plan that is designed for the retirement needs and security of employees of FWB churches and agencies. The Internal Revenue Code permits denominations and churches to set up retirement plans designed to permit you and your employer to accumulate retirement savings. The Plan has each participant's retirement goals in mind and has historically great performance records while maintaining Christian values in its investments.

Eligibility – Any employee of a FWB church, organization, or ministry (i.e. State Office, church school or daycare, camp, etc.) that has a Full-Time or Part-Time status of at least 20 hours per week with their employer is eligible to enroll in the plan. Church Planting/Church Revitalization Report

Church planting continues to be the main focus of our department and we are excited to report that 2018 was a good year for us. We currently have 51 church planters- planting 38 churches in 25 states and one Canadian Province. There were 382 salvations, 143 baptisms and 4,154 first time guests in our church plants last year! We are very excited about these decisions and grateful to God for blessing our churches. 2018 was a good year for new churches launching. Plus, we currently have 8 churches in the process of being started in 2019 as well as 7-8 churches that will be going self-supporting in the next 12-18 months.

After the departure of our full-time director of church revitalization we refocused our efforts in this area. We are very excited to announce that we will continue to help churches and we are in the process of developing some new resources that will be in a printed form as well as videos that churches will be able to use free of charge. Our staff is still available on a limited basis to travel to state and district conventions and speak on church growth issues. We are refocusing our church revitalization efforts under the new name "Fresh Wind Resources." You can look for several new resources coming out in 2019 under that name. We also have a completely new website released in January 2019. We invite you to check us out online at www.fwbnam.com. Lastly, we always ask you to remember, pray for and plan to participate in the Mission North America offering scheduled for November 24, 2019.

Master's Men Report

Master's Men continues to serve our denomination, churches and men, by providing service to our men and churches. In 2018 Master's Men released two new Direction Bible Studies, bringing the total to twenty. We continued our sports fellowship with our deep south and national golf tournaments. We gave men the opportunity to serve at our National Convention through IMPACT and ushering. We returned to New Durham, NH for continued restoration of the Ridge Church. We were once again actively involved in our Disaster Response Teams serving in and providing supplies to North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida following hurricanes.

Chaplain Ministry

Dr. David Crowe and Chaplain Kerry Steedley, COL US Army (Retired), Chaplain Support Officer for FWBNAM, see the military as a strategic mission field. Currently, the NAFWB has 9 military chaplains: 5 on active duty in the Army; 2 on active duty in the Navy; 1 full-time National Guard in OK; and 1 US Army Reserve in CA. We also have 2 chaplain candidates, one in the Army Reserve and one in the National Guard. We also have two young men who feel called to the chaplaincy. One is serving on active duty in the Navy as an enlisted sailor, and one is in college. Please pray for our chaplains, their families, and for our military forces. Several of our chaplains have had multiple combat deployments. Also, please pray for other young men to consider the call to the chaplaincy.

Hispanic Ministry

Our Hispanic ministry currently has fifty-one mission works, led by only 4 Spanish speaking church planters/ missionaries. Forty-seven of these works are self-supporting and providing for their churches and families through bi-vocational ministry in many cases. Several works own their own building while others rent facilities. We have several new works that have recently started or will start soon including, Greely, Colorado; Buhl, Idaho; Andrew, South Carolina and Smyrna, Tennessee. The Hispanic Bible Institute's name has been officially changed to the NAM Hispanic Bible Institute which is located in Bartlesville, Oklahoma. In total, 327 students have graduated and we are launching online studies later this year. Classes will begin in July 2019. Our Hispanic churches will host another youth camp held in McAlester Oklahoma this summer. Although the church in Puerto Rico is now self-supporting, several churches have begun to support the rebuilding of the church and school property since the devastation done by hurricane Maria. There is still much work to be done in this area and they definitely need your continued prayers. Thank you for your prayers and financial support.



THE HARVEST STORY

Harvest is a non-profit children's home, licensed by the Virginia Department of Social Services. In addition, Harvest is a Free Will Baptist Ministry endorsed by the Virginia State Association and is a member of the Virginia Association of Children's Homes

The home officially opened its doors in August 1993 with the mission of providing abused, neglected, abandoned or troubled children with a healthy Christian home environment, caring parents, and a wholesome family life. Since that time, the home has served over 1,700 children with tremendous success.

Harvest Free Will Baptist Child Care Ministries began only as a dream in the hearts of a few motivated people. It was a dream of reaching out to victimized young people who needed a second chance. It was a dream of providing a home of Christian love to children who are mistreated and misused.

The Stickleyville and Ruby Dobson Cottages are long-term homes that provide children, ages 5 to 17, a structured, family-style environment. House parents provide a homelike setting that promotes a healthy balance between nurturing and structure.

The Emergency and Assessment Shelter provide both emergency care and evaluation services. The homes, which operate separate wings for boys and girls, can serve up to thirty-three children at any given time. The shelters are short-term programs of 45 to 90 days.

When children come to Harvest, they have many needs that must be addressed. Most of them are educationally neglected and are several grades behind their peers. Our staff works diligently with the school system to provide assistance that will assure the children the time and attention they need to catch up.

Socialization is an important aspect of a young person's life. Before coming to Harvest, most of these kids are unable to take care their most basic needs. The house parents use Proverbs 22: as a guide: "Train up a child in the way he should go....." They model appropriate behavior. Often they take a child aside and explain what he is doing wrong and who him the correct way.



The most important reason for Harvest's existence is to lead boys and girls to Christ. All the children attend church and participate in family devotions. Many of the children accept Christ and are baptized. They join their local church. They are taught to work in the church. Some play instruments or work in the sound room. Others learn to be ushers by taking up the offering or greeting attendees. Harvest's desire is to see these young people grow up to productive members of a church community.

Today, Harvest stands tall among its peers. The home is relied upon by agencies that place children in the Commonwealth of Virginia, by Pastors of Free Will Baptist churches who are helping families in need; and grandparents who do not know where to turn

In Virginia alone, there were 6,459 substantiated cases of abuse and neglect reported last year, the majority of which came from dysfunctional families. The need is particularly notable in the southwestern counties, which are among the most disadvantaged in the Commonwealth. Lee County is the "poorest" in the state.

HARVEST WANTS TO HELP YOU

Harvest Child Care Ministries' mission has always been to help families in need. We work diligently to provide a safe nurturing home for children whose families find themselves in crisis situations. We also work with the child's family through counseling and education to reunite them as quickly and successfully as possible. In 2016, 37% of the children were returned to the biological families. Our purpose remains the same as it was 24 years ago—to serve children and families in need. With homelessness, a poor economy, and changing trends within the social services system, many families may find themselves unable to get the help they need. Another change we experienced in mid-2018, we bid a fond farewell to Rev. Frank Woods, who stepped down from his role, and we welcomed Rev. Jim McComas to the team as our new Executive Director. Though leadership is changing, our focus is still to serve and share Christ to hurting children and families

Other exciting news to share, Family Ministries is commemorating 80 years in ministry this year! From its humble beginnings as an orphanage in 1939, God has allowed our deep heritage of caring for the most vulnerable, to expand to encompass a full circle of services ranging from the protection of unborn babies to providing a safe and secure home to senior citizens. While many things have changed over the past eight decades, our efforts as a ministry are more concentrated today than ever before, as we expressly meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of at-risk and uncared for in our society. Areas of Ministry:

Almost one hundred children are actively in care through Family Ministries. This number continues to grow, as we maintain our attention on serving the fatherless and motherless in Tennessee and Arkansas through our Independent Living, Residential and Foster Care Programs.

In the early 2000s, Family Ministries expanded to include another group of often uncared for people. Governor's Bend, The Laurels and John Reed Center, our Assisted Living Communities, have grown over the past twenty years to include almost one hundred individuals in care.

We also have had the privilege to care for pregnant women who are in helpless situations, including assistance for their newborn babies through the Hope Center, Door of Hope (satellite office) and future growth with Honeysuckle Studios, our Maternity Home, currently in renovations to include 5 apartments for mom and baby.

Each and every day, our caregivers work with over three hundred children, pregnant girls and the elderly. The result of spiritual fruitfulness is that God is glorified, we grow and others come to know Christ. We are thankful for the ministry opportunities God has provided as we continue into our eightieth year of service and beyond. We understand that our success is a result of God's people standing with us through steadfast prayer and loyal support. We are grateful for your vital role.

Reflecting on the past few years, I find myself breathing a sigh of relief. At times it felt like IM was tossed about on a stormy sea. However, we did not hunker down, give up, or lose hope. We pressed on, seeking His direction and depending on the moral, financial, and prayerful support of our faithful Free Will Baptist constituency.

In the peaceful moments after a storm, we realize we must refocus, get up, and move forward. I believe we are lifting our eyes and looking to the future with renewed hope and strength. We will faithfully hold true to our mission statement: We exist to labor with the Body of Christ to fulfill the Great Commission. The statement calls for active engagement of the Mission office and field staff as well as you, our friends and fellow Free Will Baptists.

We continue to receive encouraging reports from our missionary staff and national churches. Some ministry areas show rapid numerical growth. Others steadily move forward. We embrace the realities of the different fields and their readiness for harvest. We rejoice with every sign of progress and recommit to laboring together to fulfill the Great Commission.

STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

The Mission staff is highly committed to pursuing the four strategic objectives agreed on in the December 2017 board meeting. We all played a part in developing these strategies through discussion, research, rough drafts of strategic plans, approving the plans to be presented, and most importantly, committing to seeing them become reality.

We are pursuing the following strategic objectives:

- 1. Broaden the Free Will Baptist footprint in India.
- 2. Adopt and reach the "NONs" as an Unreached People Group.
- Develop teams to focus on reaching immigrants and refugees.
- 4. Develop more international teams.

Well-developed strategies for the first three objectives were presented at the April 2018 board meeting and approved. Now the work begins. We know strategies are invalid and lack value unless we work to make them a reality.

NAME CHANGE

Last year at the 2017 national convention, we presented a proposal to legally change our name to IM, Inc. The motion was tabled for one year. We will ask for the motion to be reconsidered this year in Little Rock and, hopefully, receive a positive vote.

The basic rationale for desiring this change boils down to two factors:

- 1.Our current legal name contains words (Baptist, missions) that immediately raise questions when attempting to obtain legal documentation to enter countries where religious words often hinder visa approval.
- 2.Practically, our official name—Board of International Missions of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.—is extremely cumbersome when preparing legal documents.

We can add to these factors that you already know us as IM.

This name change in no way alters the mission statement, ministry focus, goals and objectives, internal elements of our organizational charter, nor information shared on our website.

TRANSITIONS

Life brings periods of transition. At times these transitions are joyful; others bring great sadness. The IM family has seen transitions that stir both sentiments in 2017.

IM welcomed **Don Matchett**, former mission director for Arkansas Free Will Baptists, to the team in October 2017. He serves as director of church relations, building relationships with churches and providing bridges for missionaries while they are on stateside assignment.

Dale and Sandra Bishop began ministry in Japan as college students in 1972. Two years later, the board approved them for career missionary service to Japan. Their warm hospitality, calm spirits, love for the Japanese people, and high commitment to the Great Commission have had an eternal impact on the lives of many people. Dale and Sandra Bishop retired December 31, 2017.

Robert and Judy Bryan launched their missionary service in 1968. After 50 years of faithful service in Côte d'Ivoire, Africa (1968-2002), and France (2002-2018) they are transitioning to the next step God has for them effective December 31, 2018. The Bryans have been active in church planting, discipleship, publication ministry, leadership training, and much more.

Another transition sees **David and Angie Outlaw** returning to pastoral ministry. They return to a ministry for which they are passionate. They played a tremendously strategic role in moving our partners in Central Asia to ministry focused on the indigenous people of that area of the world.

Nelson Henderson brings 12 years of service as an IM board member to a close. His easy spirit, deep resonant voice, and practical insights will be missed.

It is with great sadness, juxtaposed with joy, we hear of the passing of one of our family. Since last April, we have lost six family members: Susan Turnbough's mother, Mrs. Martha Crowson, passed on June 3, 2017; Jimmy Aldridge, former missionary to Côte d'Ivoire and office staff member, passed on July 9, 2017; Tom McCullough, former missionary to France, professor at Welch College, IM board member, and pastor, went to be with the Lord on August 11, 2017; Mrs. Leah Postlewaite, mother of missionary to Japan, Ruth McDonald; grandmother of missionary to Bulgaria, Jonathan Postlewaite; and grandmother of missionary intern to Japan, Kate Speer, made her homeward journey August 30, 2017; Debbie Griffin's mother, Mary Ellen Griffin, joined her heavenly Father on November 12, 2017; Reverend George Johnson, the father of missionary Tim Johnson, took that final journey on March 31, 2018; and former missionary to Côte d'Ivoire Sarah Mayhew transitioned to life eternal on May 23, 2018.

Another tragic loss for the IM family was the sudden death of Radostin Tsvetkov, a dear Bulgarian brother who recently teamed with Josh and Lydia Provow to plant a new church in the city of Shumen. Radi, as he was known, collapsed while playing basketball with a group of youth, seemingly from heart failure. His colleagues knew him as loving, hardworking, humble, and always thinking of others before himself. We must wait on God to fill this void and keep our Bulgaria team focused as they faithfully take the Good News to the lost in that country.

As we continue this ministry of world outreach together, we must keep our eyes on the prize. Our missiology must be driven by divine direction, sound doctrine, unwavering commitment to declaring God's truths, a determined spirit, and a growing anticipation of His return.

May He help us continue to labor together with the Body of Christ to fulfill the Great Commission until His return.
