The meeting starts at 6:00 pm with a beginners talk on "Growing your Paphiopedilum" at 6:00 pm followed by social time and starting at 7 pm



Brandon Tam is speaking on The Orchid Collection of the Huntington". For those who can't attend, Zoom login is below.

Brandon Tam oversees one of the largest orchid collections in the United States and one of the most diverse species collections in the world, which has grown from 2000 to over 10,000 plants in the past decade. He manages over 3,600 unique varieties, representing 280 genera, 2,200 hybrids, 1,500 species, including, but not limited to Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, Cymbidium, Cattleya, and Stanhopea. Brandon is responsible for the day-to-day horticultural operations, including acquisitions, propagation, conservation, and supervision of over 40 orchid volunteers. He is also tasked with coordinating numerous public and education events, such as orchid shows, judgings, and conferences. Brandon began managing the collection when he was 16 and has been with The Huntington for over 12 years as the Orchid Collection Specialist.

The orchid collection at the Huntington started with Arabella Huntington's personal collection. It was sold off after her death in 1924, Henry's death in 1927 and the 1929 stock market crash as a cost cutting measure. Since 1910 the collection has grown.



The Huntington https://www.huntington.org consists of a library, art museum and botanical gardens. It is a collections-based research and educational institution located in San Marino, California. It was founded by Henry and Arabella Huntington and covers 120 acres. Henry was a railroad and real estate businessman. The gardens include a desert, bonsai and Asian gardens.

The art museum contains works by Thomas Gainsborough and other artists including portraits of George Washington by Gilbert Stuart. There is also a large collection of



sculptures bronze by Frederic Remington and others.

There is also an extensive library which includes many rare books.

Orchid of the Month – April Bulbophyllum treschii Jenny 2012

bulb-oh-FILL-um (click on the name to hear it spoken)

Bulbophyllum treschii is one of the most recently named species of the genus Bulbophyllum. It was at one time thought to be a variety of plumatum.

Bulbophyllum and closely allied genera is the largest group in the orchid family Orchidaceae. The genus name is derived from the Greek bolbos meaning 'bulb' and phyllon 'a leaf'. They were first described in 1822 by Louis-Marie Aubert du Petit-Thouars.

Bulbophyllum are mostly epiphytes. They have pseudobulbs and a widely spreading growth habit through their branching rhizomes.

Flowers only live a short time and may be fragrant often times with a quite unpleasant fragrance.



Most grow in tropical or subtropical regions extending into some temperate regions. They are thought to have originated in New Guinea. Most species are found in Asia from the foothills of the Himalayas to southeast Asia and nearby islands. They also exist in Africa, Madagascar, Australia, New Zealand, the Caribbean, and Central and South America.

Bulbophyllum treschii grows in Malaysia at elevations from 3000 to 5000 ft. It is considered to be cool growing but can be grown in intermediate to warm conditions.

DESCRIPTION: Mini-miniature to miniature sized, cool growing epiphyte with a slowly creeping, branching rhizome giving rise to close



set, conical-ovoid, tetragonal, concave side on older, slightly compressed pseudobulbs carrying a single, apical, erect to slightly spreading, leathery, rigid, dark green, oblong, acute to obtuse, apiculate, subpetiolate base leaf that blooms in the summer on a descending to pendent, to 6 [15 cm] long, 4 flowered inflorescence carrying simultaneously opening flower.

CULTURE: It grows n medium to low light in intermediate to warm conditions. It prefers wet conditions only allowed to start to dry between waterings. It should be watered year-round. It is usually grown mounted because of its hanging flowers but can be grown successfully in elevated pots.

Recognition of *treschii* as its own species has been verry recent as it was originally called *plumatum*. Bulbophyllum plumatum and Bulbophyllum thiurum were once thought to be color forms of the same

species. All three species are found in Malaysia but plumatum is also found in Sumatra and the Philippin

Interested in seeing native orchids growing and blooming in the Wild?

June 11 is a perfect time to see multiple blooms on the same plant of the Showy Lady Slipper (Cypripedium reginae) at Cedar Bog.

Already mentioned above is viewing of Slipper orchids, including the Pink Lady Slipper (*Cyp acaule*) on the buying trip to Kristen's.

Another possibility, if there is enough interest, is a trip to an area in Shawnee State Park on May 7 when traditionally the Pink Lady Slipper, Yellow Lady Slipper and perhaps the small Showy Orchis (*Galearis spectabilis*) are in bloom.

There will be Signup sheets for anyone interested at the Beginner and the Regular meetings this Tuesday, April 12. More information about each will be provided on the sheets. All will be notified if the trip goes or may have to be changed due to fickle blooming of orchids or weather.
