Topic: The Birds, The Bees and the Orchids

Join us for our May meeting to learn about how orchids reproduce! We will again be using the Zoom online meeting format.

Doug lives in a suburb of Kansas City with his wife and fellow orchid lover, Beth. He started growing orchids in 1991. He grows a mixed collection of about 200 tropical orchids in a basement light room. He also grows about 40-50 species and hybrids of Cypripediums and other hardy orchids in his outdoor growing area and 50+ species of winter green Mediterranean orchids under lights in his garage. He has published articles on growing Cypripediums in the Slipper Orchid Alliance Journal and the North American Native Orchid Journal. Doug is a student AOS judge and also serves as Treasurer of the Slipper Orchid Alliance. He has been of the President of the Orchid Society of Greater Kansas City and the Mid-America Orchid Congress and previously served as chairman of the Mid-America Conservation Committee for seven years. Doug has a Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry. Before retiring in 2016 from teaching chemistry at Penn Valley Community College in Kansas City, Missouri he worked in biomedical research and ran an orchid lab.

Trip to see Native Orchids

GCOS is rescheduling the trip to Shawnee State Park with NOPES

https://nativeorchidpreservationeducationsociety.com. The trip will be a car drive around the park and short hike to see Cypripedium acaule the Pink Lady's-Slipper, Cypripedium parviflorum var. pubescens Large Yellow Lady's-Slipper, and Galearis spectabilis Showy Orchis and some other wildflowers and maybe another orchid or two. Most are along the road and only require stepping out of the car. Shawnee State Park is about 2 hours east of Cincinnati. To keep up with social distancing we expect to not carpool. I was there the last two weeks, and the orchids are up and open! There is also a beautiful field of Indian Paintbrush in a field along State Route 125. We are looking at Saturday May 16 and meeting at the UDF in West Union 735 E Main St, West Union, OH 45693 around 10:30 AM. We would spend a couple of hours and go to 3 areas. You would need to pack a lunch and bring water and insect repellent. Boots would not be necessary. Restrooms may be limited although there are gas stations nearby. Orchid of the Month Aerides (AIR-eh-deez) houlettiana





Known as Houllet's Aerides and named for Houllet, a 19th Century French gardener who was Director of Plant Conservatories in Paris, France.

The genus *Aerides* is in the Vanda Alliance. The species *houlettiana* has been awarded 30 times and used in creating 37 crosses.

Aerides houlettiana is an epiphytic warm to hot growing medium to large sized orchid species that is native to Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos (Southeast Asia) at 0 to 700-meter elevations. Habitat is evergreen, semi-deciduous and deciduous forests under bright indirect light conditions (2500-3500-foot candles during summer months).

There are up to 20 or more yellow with reddish-purple fleshy flowers of *Aerides houlettiana* found on pendulous inflorescences. Flowers are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " to 2" and very fragrant reminiscent of citrus and spice.

Aerides houlettiana is usually grown hanging with or without baskets, mounted, or in pots. Summer temperatures on average range from 70-95°F and 60-70°F during the winter. Plenty of air movement needed. Watering frequency will depend on how it is grown.

Hanging/mounted plants may need watering daily to every third day with some influence from sunlight levels. Potted plants should be watered at least twice a week during the summer. Type of media may also influence watering schedule. *Aerides* are heavy feeders. Relative humidity should be between 50-70°. Spanish moss may be draped over roots to help retain moisture for absorption.
