# Orchid of the Month *Paphiopedilum* Harold Koopowitz, Paphanatics 1995 - Jeanne Rhinehart

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz is a primary hybrid of a cross of Paphiopedilum malipoense x Paphiopedilum rothschildianum. The cross originated by Paphanatics in 1995 and named in honor of Harold Koopowitz. A primary hybrid is a cross of two species.

Culture conditions for *Paphiopedilum* Harold Koopowitz are moderate light and with high humidity

(60% to 85%). Day temperatures of 75 to 83 degrees Fahrenheit and night time temperatures dropping to 58 to 65 degrees. To induce blooming in winter months, keep cool temperatures as low as 55 degrees at night and have 9 to 12 hours of bright light. More shaded conditions increase coloration.

Looking at the name of a plant tells you much about the plant. Plant species are named with two parts called binomial nomenclature. This provides a unique identifier for the plant for all languages. The first part is the name of the genus to which the plant belongs and is capitalized and italicized. A genus is a rank in the classification below family (in this case Orchidaceae) and is a group of species having similar characteristics. If the plant is a species, the second part of the name, the specific epithet, is lower case and italicized. If the plant is a hybrid, the second part is capitalized and is not italicized. The name and date attached to the name is given to the person (or company) naming the plant and the date the name is registered by Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) in the UK. In the case of the species, the name is credited to the person who first published the description of the discovered species. For hybrids the name credited is that of the person making the cross. This person gives the name to the cross when it is registered with the RHS. If a new cross or species is awarded at an American Orchid Society judging the originator of the cross is first asked to name or register the plant with the RHS. If they do not wish to register the cross the exhibitor can name it and register it.

When the parents of a cross are listed, the pod parent is listed first. My plant (pictured at above) is a reciprocal cross with *Paphiopedilum rothschildianum* as the pod parent instead of *Paphiopedilum malipoense* as the original cross was made.

Paphiopedilum malipoense S.C. Chen & Tsi 1984 is from mountainous cloud forests in southern China Vietnam. It grows in leaf litter on limestone rocks in mostly deciduous forests and are usually east facing. It grows at elevations of 450 to 1450 meters and is warm to cool growing in these regions. It blooms in the spring and usually has 1 flower on its inflorescence. It is one of the largest Paphiopedilums especially its leaves. Flower inflorescences can exceed 75 cm with flowers up to 13 cm across. It has an apple-raspberry scent. It likes more water than most other paphiopedilums. It appears to be

sensitive to air pollution. The Chinese botanist Feng first collected plants in 1947 but no published description was made until 1984.



Paphiopedilum rothschildianum (Rchb. f.) Stein 1892 is from northern Borneo. . It was named for the Victorian orchid grower Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild. It grows on mossy and leafy humus on cliffs and steep grades near running water. It is warm to cool growing and found at elevation of 500 to 1800 m. It blooms year-round peaking in March through July. It produces spectacular inflorescences up to 75 cm with 2 to 4 striking flowers. Flower color varies with a pale color found. An albino plant has been rumored to exist for years. (This plant is the basis for the mystery in one of Harold Koopowitz's novels.) The pale form has allegedly been selfed to produce an albino variety. It makes spectacular hybrids with more than 226 having been made.

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz has had 74 AOS awards. It has five offspring. (Good luck finding any to them.) These are complex hybrids (a hybrid crossed with a species or another hybrid).

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz back crossed with Paphiopedilum rothschildianum is Paphiopedilum Yasumasa Takahashi.

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz crossed with Paphiopedilum armenicium is Paphiopedilum In-Charm Gorgeousness.

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz crossed with Paphiopedilum hangianum is Paphiopedilum Chen Samn Challenger.

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz crossed with Paphiopedilum delenatii is Paphiopedilum Delightfully Harold.

Paphiopedilum Harold Koopowitz crossed with Paphiopedilum micranthum is Paphiopedilum Sunlight Rainbow.

Harold Koopowitz, Ph.D. is a famous author, scientist, and educator. He was born in South Africa. His parents were Americans and he returned to the US in 1964. He is Professor of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology for the School of Biological Sciences at University of California, Irvine, CA. His main interest at present is the loss of biodiversity around the world. He is editor emeritus of *Orchid Digest* since 2009 having been editor from 2002 to 2008. He is the author of several books both fiction and nonfiction:
