Guest Speaker: Doug Martin on Growing Terrestrials in Pots

Doug started growing orchids in 1991. He grows a mixed collection of about 200 tropical orchids in a basement light room. He also grows about 40-50 species and hybrids of Cypripediums and other hardy orchids in his outdoor growing area and 50+ species of winter green Mediterranean orchids under lights in his garage. He has published articles on growing Cypripediums and Ophrys. Doug lives in a suburb of Kansas City with his wife and fellow orchid lover, Beth. Both Doug and Beth are AOS judges. He has been of the President of the Orchid Society of Greater Kansas City and the Mid-America Orchid Congress and served as chairman of the Mid-America Conservation Committee for seven years. Doug has a Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry. He worked in biomedical research and ran an

orchid lab and taught chemistry at Penn Valley Community College in Kansas City, Missouri. He retired in 2016.

Report of the Ohio Valley Orchid Fest - August 25-27

The third annual Ohio Valley Orchid Fest took place August 25-27 in Kettering Ohio. We had another really fun-filled weekend of orchid sales, ribbon and AOS judging, and the pure enjoyment of spectacular orchids! This year most meals were included with a full registration which was unusual.

The speakers were amazing. David Edgley from Seattle Washington was the keynote speaker. His fascinating presentation on Novelty Phalaenopsis Hybrids defined them as having short spikes, smaller

lips, a glossy almost waxy surface and *fragrance*. One orchid even smells like Fruit Loops. His second talk on Phalaenopsis culture contained many new concepts such as an Orchids Magazine article which noted that any fertilizer is better than nothing to a starving orchid; it will take what it can use. Carol Klonoski gave a great talk on Multi-Floral Paphiopedilums. Their characteristic multiple blooms make this type of orchid distinctive and a welcome addition to any collection.

Congratulations to Eric Sauer from MVOS who received the MAOC "Orchidist of the Year" award for his outstanding work! And at the MAOC Annual meeting he was voted in as next year's MAOC President.

To summarize, at this year's OVOF gorgeous orchids were bought and sold, attendees made new acquaintances by playing a game, orchids were repotted, and a large number of community members, as well as volunteers and Society members, enjoyed the Show.
