Tuesday March 11, 7:00 pm: Peter T. Lin of Diamond Orchids Speaking on Compact Vandaceous Species and their Hybrids



Peter started growing orchids over 40 years ago but then stopped due to school and starting a career. It wasn't until about 20 years ago that the orchid "bug" came back, and he is now heavily involved once again! He is an avid orchid hobbyist, hybridizer, AOS accredited judge, and a hybridizer of mini-catts. He enjoys meeting with other orchid enthusiasts and can often be found at various orchid shows and societies around the country.

Due to limited growing space, Peter likes to specialize in miniature orchids, both species and hybrids, and has received numerous AOS awards. His interests in orchids include Dendrobiums, Angraecoids, and Neofinetias. He

maintains a collection of several thousand orchids at his home in Southern California in 3 small greenhouses, outdoors, as well as an offsite greenhouse. Peter will be speaking to us over Zoom at the Scout Building. The Board has ordered a few of his orchids which will be available to purchase at the March 11 meeting.

Monday, March 10, 6:30 pm: Carson Whitlow *The World of Cypripediums Free to GCOS members compliments of MAOC.* View a Live online seminar over Zoom from your home.

Be sure to see an amazing lecture by one of orchid's legendary orchid hybridizers, author and speaker. Carson Whitlow has spent a lifetime studying blue cattleyas and Cypripediums and the internet. His accounts are pleasantly humorous and often incredulous as he tells of natural and artificial Cypripedium propagation and hybridization, and the incredible length of time to observe the resulting blooms.

There are over 40 native Cypripedium species in the world. This presentation covers those mainly in North/Central America plus many of those from the rest of the world. This program is about 45 to 60 minutes in length, according to the number of questions asked.

Carson Whitlow Bio: Carson started working with the hardy terrestrial orchids, primarily the Cypripediums and Calopogons in 1967. His work resulted in the first registered artificial hybrids of Cypripedium in 1987 and Calopogon in 1991. Carson's interest in the internet and an easier means of finding orchid related sites on the world wide web brought about the birth of "The Orchid Mall," which today has become the definitive index site for orchids on the internet. My Favorite Orchid: Ctt. Candy Corn

Registered by Stewart Inc. in 1982. Cross of C. Dubiosa (syn C. Dubiosa (1980)) and Ctt. Trick or Treat. The species that make up this cross are: C. harrisoniana, C. trianae, C. cinnabarina, Gur. aurantiaca, C. crispata and C. harpophylla.

A few society members know that I have a thing for flared cattleyas and boy does this hybrid deliver on the flares! The flowers open mostly orange and slowly the orange fades and only remains at the tips of the petals and sepals. The rest of the petals and sepals fade into rosy pink. The pink then fades to a creamy white. At

the end of the color change, the flowers have a base color of creamy white and the petals and sepals are tipped with a golden orange.

Unfortunately, this hybrid isn't fragrant.

This was the first blooming from this plant. I purchased it from Sunset Valley Orchids.
