- **Limited Classifications**: Unlike physical health classifications that are based on a detailed number of diagnoses, procedures and groupings, mental health lacks currencies that are diverse and appropriate enough to compare costs of treatment in a meaningful way.
- **Co-morbidity**: Many patients have overlapping physical and mental health conditions, complicating diagnosis, and assessment.

Data Collection and Quality:

- Inconsistent Data Recording: Variation in how mental health data is recorded across different NHS Trusts, GPs, and mental health services. This is reflected in national cost collection results where Mental Health Providers struggle to make their data fit into the required formats and data structures, often leading to unreliable results to benchmark against.
- Fragmented Systems: Mental health data is often siloed across primary care, secondary care, and social services, making holistic analysis difficult.
- **Incomplete Datasets**: Many patients drop out of treatment, leading to gaps in longitudinal data.
