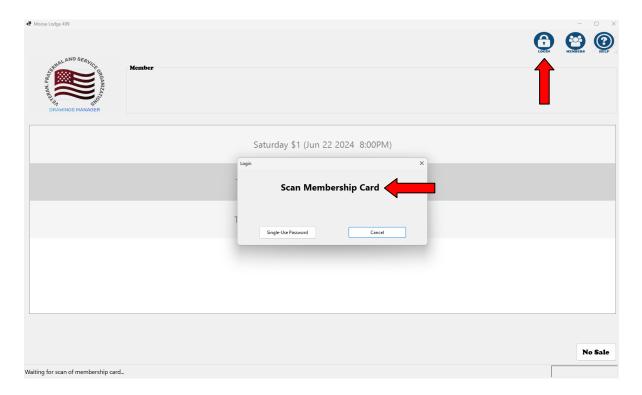
# **Assigning Profiles**

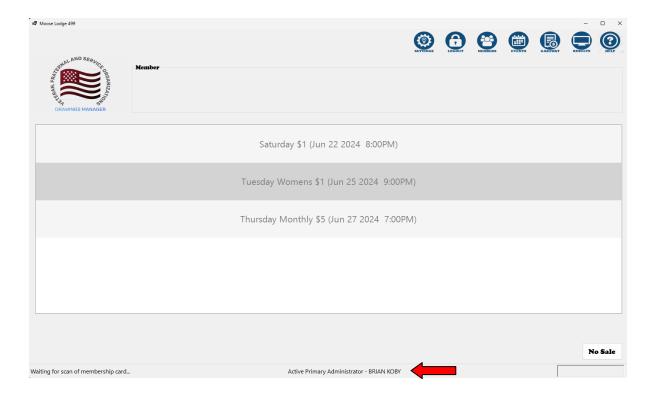
<u>Note</u>: Profiles are used by the Drawings Manager to limited what is displayed on the screen for certain users. For example, Drawing Operators won't see icons for importing a member database or assigning profiles.

1. If administrative permissions are enabled on the tablet then you will need to login first; click on the LOGIN icon then you will be prompted to scan your card (or swipe):

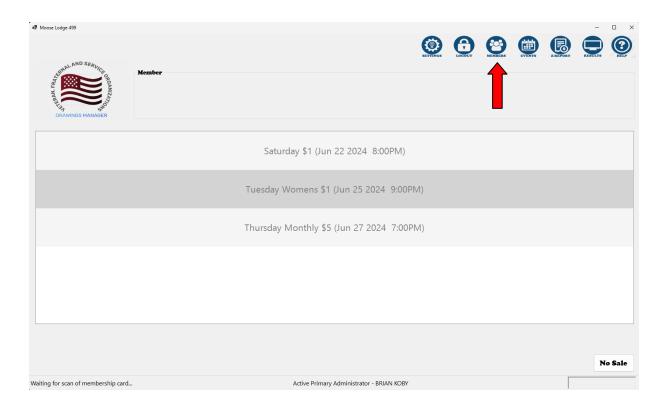
**Note:** you must scan or swipe a membership card that has administrative privledges.



2. Once you are logged in as an administrator you will see the a message at the bottom of the window showing you are logged in as an administrator:

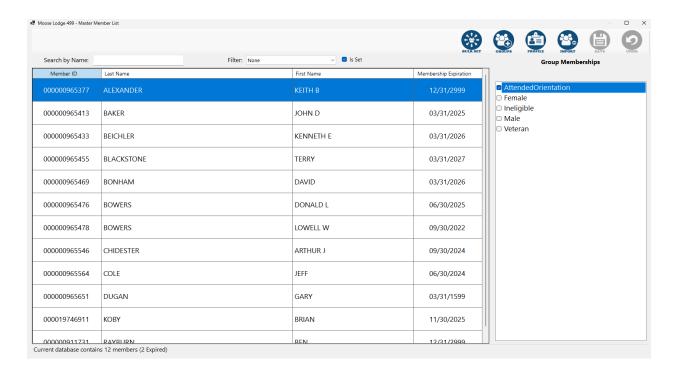


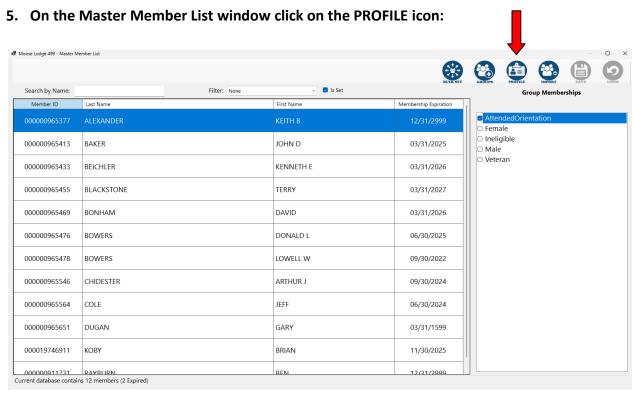
## 3. Click on the MEMBERS icon:



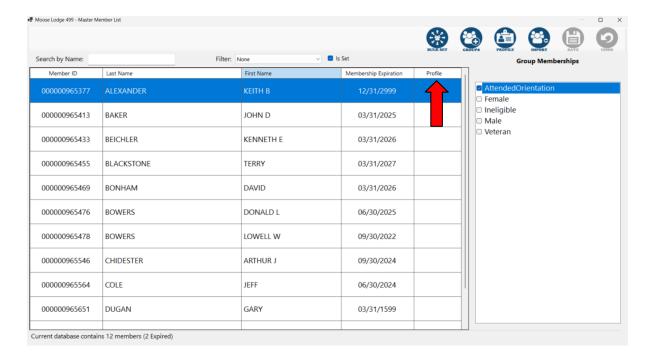
#### 4. The Master Member List will be displayed as a new window:

<u>Note</u>: the actual window displayed may look slightly different then the example below, depending on what features are enabled.

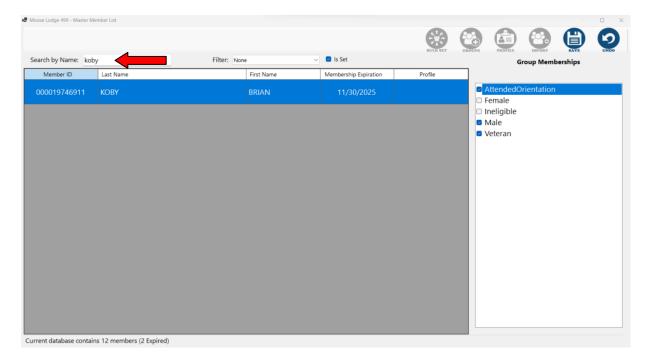




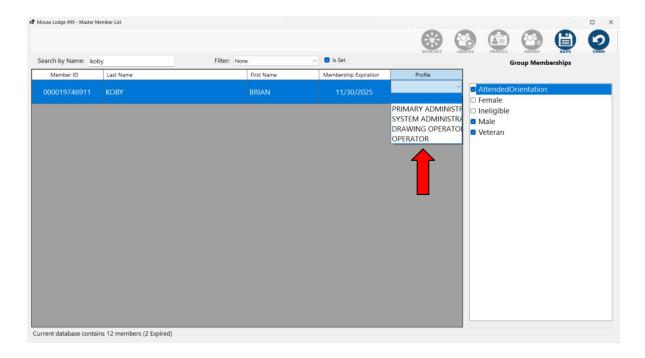
### 6. A new Column will appear for Profile



7. Type the name of the member you want to give administrative priviledges to in the search box:

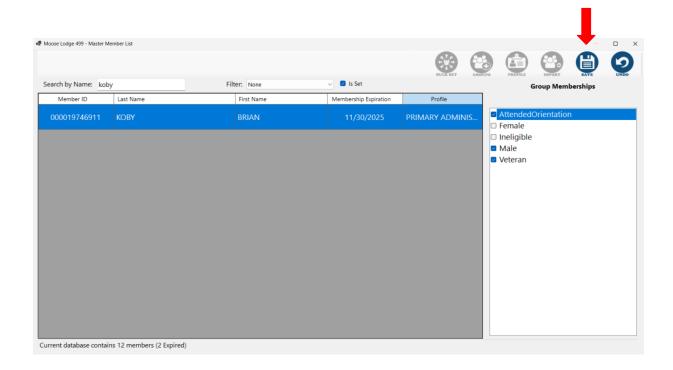


8. Touch the top part of the box under the Profile column until you see a drop-down menu



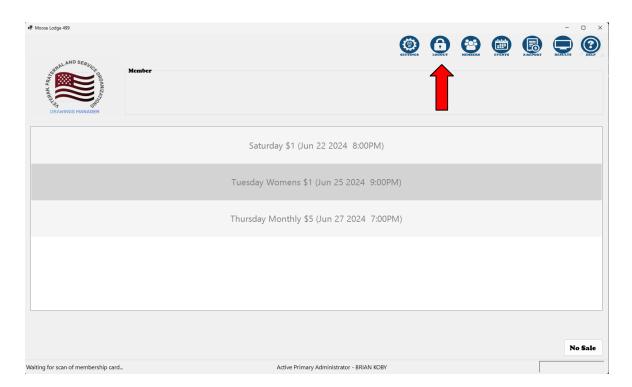
Member Profiles do the following by default (these functions can be updated in settings):

- **Primary Administrator** is able to perform any function with the Drawings Manager program
- System Administrator can do anything the Primary Administrator can do except assign profiles
- Drawing Operator can be used to allow a user to run a drawing
- Operator can be setup to signup members for a drawing; by default this user isn't used
- 9. Select the type of profile you want to assign to the user then click on any other box under a different column that is highlighted in blue then click on the save ICON:



10. When finished assigning profiles click on the X in the upper right corner of the window.

## 11. LOGOUT AS ADMINISTRATOR (if applicable); click on the LOGOUT icon



12. Verify the "Active Administrator - <NAME>" message at the bottom of the window is no longer present.
