## What Matt wants you to know about the Gators

Despite seven trips to Omaha and one national championship, Kevin O'Sullivan hasn't led the Florida Gators to the College World Series since 2018. Welcoming their arrival, the Virginia Cavaliers. This journey is going to be a fun one to watch the Gators navigate. With the fire power they bring on offense in Langford, Riopelle, and crew, they should have no trouble hitting it out of this park.

The biggest question mark for me and it's been the biggest question mark for me all season is their pitching. We've seen some very clutch performances by Sproat, Waldrep, and other guys from the bullpen. This will be a tough test to see if the Gators can continue to keep everything clicking and make a run to the Championship Series.

Their toughest test on their side of the bracket is hands down Virginia. The Cavs have the best pitching staff in this bracket, so we'll find out very early on if Florida brought the bats with them to Omaha.

Finally we get to see this team back in Omaha after a 4 year drought. This Virginia team and fanbase has just been incredible to watch all postseason long. ## What Matt wants you to krow about the Frogs

I feel like TCU got by Indiana State in what was one of the quietest of the super regional matchups, taking game one 4-1 and then game two 6-4. Their offense wasn't nearly as hot as it was in Fayetteville, which might be why we didn't pay much attention to their 2-0 sweep of the Sycamores.

That said, I'm going to back TCU in game one and will continue to back them until they lose. The Frogs are riding an 11 game win streak into Omaha, including a 5-0 regional and super regional sweep, with a run differential of +36 runs in a five game span!

While the bats have stolen the show, it's been TCU's pitching that has impressed me. Arkansas struggled to hit the majority of their guys, Indiana State did as well. Another benefit is that the Frogs have had plenty of rest, being the beneficiary of one of the three teams coming into Omaha having only played 5 games over the last two weeks. The other two being Wake Forest and LSU. TCU should be rested and ready to beat on an Oral Roberts team that struggled with Oregon, who has a very mediocre offense.

## What Quentin wants you to know about the Frogs

If you asked me mid-year what I thought of this Horned Frog team, myself, and many others would've told you this team is dead in the water from injuries and poor play. Fast forward to June and we have witnessed a Frog rebirth. TCU blew through the Big 12 tourney, mauled Arkansas in the Regionals, and made quick work of Indiana State in the Supers, playing scorching hot baseball. Fortunately for TCU, they aren't matched up with Wake Forest, Tennessee, or LSU, but they do have to deal with tough Florida and Virginia teams. If you keep up with myself and Matt, you know we aren't as high on this team as others may be; sure they've played extremely hot and smashed every pitch they've seen of lately, but we both feel this team will regress a bit and come back down to earth once facing elite competition in Omaha. I think this team can at least get through Oral Roberts but I can't see them beating both Florida and Virginia to advance any further.
