President's Report Season 2024/25

Well, what a fantastic season 24/25 turned out to be, with success for the club both on and off the field. This season marked the 31st junior and 46th senior season for this illustrious club. Being my first season as Club President, it would be amiss of me not to thank Morris lemma, who held this position for many years prior to myself. Morris has been made a Co-Patron of the club to recognise his contributions. Morris left the club in a strong financial position and grew player numbers in the junior and senior competitions, making us one of the larger clubs in the association. As with many things, COVID has had an impact, but I endeavour to return the club to its 'glory days'.

Although small in number, the success we had on-field this season needs to be recognised. Our U/11B team celebrated a Premiership, with many players also receiving association awards. Richard (recognised as Club Person of the Year), his team, and the parents and helpers need to be congratulated on such a strong season. As well as this, our 2nd Grade team also became Premiers. This team has progressed through lower divisions with success and, with some new blood in the squad, culminated in their first and the club's third premiership in this division.

We hope for the day when their friends and new girls become involved, and we can have a stand-alone Kingsgrove Girls team in a competition. We also had many Blast skills and competition participants. I wish all of these young boys and girls return to the club to further progress their skills or join competition cricket as they develop. On this, I would like to thank Michael Venn for his continued involvement in the Blast program, and those who assisted him and Cricket NSW in the implementation of these programs.

The club also had an 11s non-comp, 13s, and 1st Grade team. I would like to thank the players, managers, and parents involved with these teams. We can only get kids on the park with the assistance of volunteers. Your contribution to your child's team and club does not go unnoticed, and on behalf of the committee, I would like to thank you wholeheartedly.

As previously mentioned, the club had one of its biggest off-field seasons in many years. Young Sam Konstas, who commenced and played most of his junior cricket at KCC, became Australian Test player number 468 at the tender age of 19! Less than 10 years ago, Sam was like many of our current juniors—batting in the nets at Beverly Hills Park and playing in the local Saturday competitions. Yes, there is no denying he is a talented young man, but his rise from humble beginnings at KCC shines light and gives hope to current players that the Baggy Green can be a realisation of their own. Sam's swashbuckling knock-on debut against the world's best Test bowler was a breath of fresh air and invigorated the Australian team to win the series. Speaking of the digital age, I would like to highlight the role Sasha Scott played this season.
