












"Undocumented letters that reveal a great deal about Union naval operations during the war." - Civil War Books. A most attractive set of books with a white vellum spines and gray boards stamped in gold. First edition, interiors clean and tight, white vellum, spines darkened as with all sets, the limitation numbers don't match, per usual, in original shipping boxes, which have tape repairs – no big deal – "shipping boxes" are meant to be discarded - versus slip cases. The Naval History Society which published this set jumbled the volumes together and never were able to match up limitation numbers. One time I purchased 100 plus sets and didn't find a single pair of matching volumes. \$100.00

The War Department contracted with Bachelder for a history of the battle, which he delivered in 1886. The work comprised 2500 pages and was accompanied by excellent maps. It was never published, and languished for over 100 years until publication of this edition, transcribed, edited, and annotated by David L. and Aubrey J. Ladd. This set belonged to Lt. Col. Luther M. Davis of Company K, 5th N.C. Regiment. On the front fly of Volume I and Volume VI, Davis's scripted in pencil in a clear hand

"Property of Luther M. Davis, Capt. ____ Co. K 5th NC Regt. Promoted to Maj. & Lt. Col. Surrendered July 4, 1818 [?] San Antonio, Texas Returned Home, Salisbury, NC September 5, 1818 [?]

[At the end of the war Davis was serving in the Trans-Mississippi Department. Some discrepancy on dates here but the San Antonio reference may have been the date of his capture in 1865 (not 1818) as he was listed as a POW in San Antonio, Texas until his release August 14, 1865.]

Luther M. Davis's 82-page service record indicates he was a Prisoner of War and paroled in San Antonio, Texas, August 14, 1865. A printed copy of his service record will accompany this set.



Volume IV, North Carolina, has copious and lengthy first-hand battle account notes correcting and adding information on many major battles, Mechanicsville, Malvern Hill, Chancellorsville, and Gettysburg.

Referring to Gettysburg, Davis writes:

"The writer was not with his company having been wounded at Chancellors. But his Lieut. J. C. Irwin was in command who was wounded and captured. No braver troops in the Confederate Army than the 5th N.C. Regt. State Troops. L. M. Davis, Co. K."

"This proved conclusive that Genl. Iverson was a Coward and not at the Front."

In North Carolina volume IV, referring to the events at Mechanicsville, Davis writes:

"Garland ordered the charge and the writer commanded the 5th Regt. After Maj. Sinclair was wounded fired 'on a Penn.,' Regt. charging our Flank. The Col. Fell from his (killed) Horse & the Regt. Retreated. I was promoted for this to 1st Lt. – L.M.D."


In South Carolina volume V, referring to the battles of Seven Pines and Fair Oaks, Davis wrote:

"Col. Jenkins crossed the Williamsburg Road. Just below the Natl. Semetary and charged. I think Sedgwick Corps. The writer was in the 5th Regt. D. H. Hill's Division. We remained on the right of the Williamsburg Road. – L.M. Davis. *This battle won Col. Jenkins a Brigadier's Commission. He was Killed by our <u>own men through mistake</u> at the <u>Wilderness</u> in 1864."
