Close the loop project is centred around the feeder network in Jaipur. It takes the support of feeders (a.k.a puppy farishtas) to vaccinate all street puppies against parvo, distemper and rabies. And subsequently catches the mothers and surviving pups for sterilisation by Help in Suffering (HIS). This project is done in collaboration with Go Nirvana and HIS.

INSTITUTIONAL OUTREACH

Following the Supreme Court order on 7th November directing removal of dogs from educational institutions among other places, we started reaching out to schools and colleges primarily to make sure that the institutions understand the order and that they cannot get the dogs removed till the shelters are in place and other conditions are met at the institution.

21 Institutions approached

13 Colleges **08** Schools

11 Institutions have dogs in or around their campuses

Of which only 04 institutes expressed having a problem with them





EQUINE BASELINE PROJECT

At present, other than a few treatment camps, no work is happening in Jaipur **for the welfare of working equines** (horses, mules, donkeys). We have started the project with a baseline activity and till date, we have identified a total of **718 equines** (639 horses, 79 donkeys and 1 mule) **in 25 different sites** in Jaipur and surrounds. Our baseline report is expected to be ready by mid-January after which we will plan interventions to improve equine welfare.

ADVOCACY

In November, we leveraged the recently formed Legal Assistance group, a group of lawyers willing to assist us. One of the lawyers and Maitri Bhavna submitted a detailed representation to the Deputy Registrar of Manipal University, Jaipur when it came to our notice that over the last few months, there had been repeated cases of cruelty to and relocation of resident dogs on campus.

Some of the students, at significant risk to themselves, raised their voice against this cruelty which led to a social media backlash against the administration. That together with our representation helped stop the cruelty but we are closely monitoring the situation and hope to do sterilisation and vaccination at the University as soon as possible.

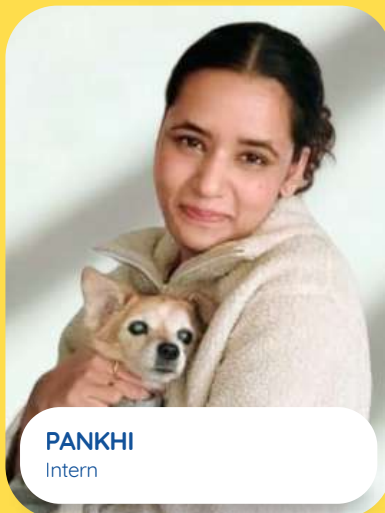
