## Treatment Risk Assessment for élégant nails (Southsea)

This Treatment Risk Assessment has been carried out to assess if it is safe to offer the treatments listed below during the Covid-19 pandemic and is in addition to the standard Business Risk Assessment completed by élégant nails..

Objective:

Treatments where the technician is required to be within the 'Highest Risk Zone' of the client (defined as the area in front of the face where splashes and droplets from the nose and mouth, that may not be visible, can be present and pose a hazard from the client to the technician and vice versa), for the entire duration or the majority of the time the treatment is being provided (such as eyelash extensions), should not be resumed unless they can be adapted in line with the current Government guidelines to make them safe (for example, by moving out of the Highest Risk Zone and wearing a Face Shield/Visor). The Government have updated their guidelines to allow facial treatments from 15th August 2020.
