Dear Disciples at St. John's,

We are now completing our 2023 Budget process. Here are some of the details:

- The vestry members submitted their goals and line item dollar figures for the new budget.
- At the recent Annual Meeting you saw a very preliminary budget of those submissions.
- We have held a meaningful and helpful stewardship campaign, and have received a number of pledge cards for 2023.

In December, the vestry will vote on a budget submitted by our wardens and based on our mission and the goals of our ministries, with the expectation that it will be made available to you.

All of this is done under the umbrella of mission and ministry. This is what drive us as disciples gathered in this place: God's mission for us to embrace and lived out through our ministries. Each task we do, each ministry we lift up, each dollar we receive are to fulfill the goals we make toward the vision God has for us.

If you have not pledged yet, please consider doing so to enable St. John's to grow in fulfilling our mission and meet the increased opportunities now ahead of us. We are very happy to receive them so we can have a fuller picture of where we will be in 2023. Please place yours in the offering plate, mail to the church or bring them to the church office. Also consider where you wish to serve. Announcement pages, e-signs, this newsletter and our vestry who chair the ministries are wonderful places for you, disciples at St. John's, to learn how to share your talents, energies and time and voice your desire to participate. See and listen, then prayerfully ask.

Always there are questions about our commitment to the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia. Where is the money going? Why don't we feel like we receive back as much as we give to the diocese? Our gift to the diocese each year are determined by several factors, including attendance, membership and offerings. This is to consider the circumstances of every parish.

How is the gift to the diocese used? Yes, for the support of our parish. So much comes to us from our diocese in terms of information, spiritual awakening and physical support (as we experienced in our bishop's visit to us on December 13 and still receive from Canon Roy Hoffman in this time of transition). I encourage you to log onto the diocese's website and take a look.

Looking Ahead

January

Outreach

As I reflect on my time serving on the Vestry for two years as the Liaison to the Outreach Committee, one thing is very clear to me. There is a very dedicated and passionate group of parishioners who serve St. John's Church by giving freely of their time, talents and often donate their own funds. Their purpose is quite simply stated "to help others."

We have had a very busy year as the world has reopened after the Pandemic and revealed so many more needs. A lot of people have found themselves in dire circumstances needing food, housing and recovery from nature's disasters this year. We responded to so many demands through our support of other well established charities as well as direct donations of items, services and monetary funds to our local partners in outreach to the community.

It is not an understatement to say that our committee members step forward when they are called. **Teresa Duncan** has a special place in her heart for the CARITAS program in Richmond. In January she headed the effort to provide backpacks with notebooks and pens for participants of a back-towork program offered by CARITAS. Again in July, Teresa saw a solicitation for another essential need and only Teresa would shop for boxers for the men in need! Now that is dedication!

Sue Whiteman and Susan Kalanges work together to recognize our local Chesterfield County Police Officers during Appreciation Week in May each year. Sue also collects clean towels and blankets for the County Animal shelter to make their stay in their pens a bit more comfortable. Another project she engages in is the collection of aluminum can pop tops for the Richmond Ronald McDonald House. They turn in the metal and use the funds to support family's needs while their children are being treated at VCU Medical Center.

Another recipient of a great deal of support is Beulah Elementary School. There is a long standing connection between this school and our church from a prior parishioner. **Llewellyn Slayton** has graciously picked up the mantle and keeps in close contact with the staff and administration to identify ways in which we can assist the children with their educational goals. She heads up a school supply drive and collects paper rolls, boxes and tops for the STEAM program. Additionally, this year we donated for a child whose family suffered a house fire and lost everything. Llewellyn keeps in close touch with the teachers and the Principal at Beulah who express their appreciation often.

Nancy Fast wears many hats at St. John's. Before Covid 19, she used to attend graduation at Jackson-Feild School in Jarrett, Va and presented the Madeline Mumfort Scholarship to the recipient in person. Nancy holds a special interest in the two Mumford awarded scholarships. The second one goes to the Boys Home of Virginia in Covington. Another Outreach project that she leads is the Baby Bottle Fund Drive for the Chesterfield Pregnancy Center. She also puts in volunteer hours there when her busy schedule permits.

The Chesterfield Food Bank has continued to stretch their resources this year. **Thea Shoop** volunteers at the Food Bank and sees up close the needs of the families in our community. She is passionate and lets the Committee know any time she feels we need to deliver more support. This past summer, she ran a dry food drive and the congregation responded generously. We donate funds regularly rather than to run a food pantry or develop a food program of our own.

Pat Robinson was the project leader for a community health program held in the St. John's Parish Hall in July. Lifeline Screened 57 patients which is a good exposure for St. John's to the community. It was well organized and very well publicized. Pat also did a great job on the USO at the RIC Airport toiletry/gift card project. In April we delivered new toilet articles to the USO for the troops who come through the airport. The generosity of the parish

was greatly appreciated by the USO staff.

FOOD AND TO SO AND TO A

We participate annually in well established community programs that benefit the underprivileged. **Tamara Evans** lead the effort with help from **Chris Day** to provide 25

Thanksgiving meal bags to CHHASM this year. As the members of the congregation know, we shopped at the store and packed bags of food to be given to families for their Thanksgiving dinner. It is a true act of sharing to provide a meal to another family. Thank you to everyone who shopped and to everyone who wrote a check so we could finish out our obligation of bags and gift cards for fresh items!

Christmas Mother was such a big success under the direction of **JoAnn Maher** last year, she decided to undertake it again this year! She has two elf helpers, **Susan Kalanges** and her daughter **Susie Kalanges**. They have decorated a tree with the names of the recipients



of the gifts. As the gifts are purchased and turned in, the Committee will wrap the gifts and JoAnn and Larry will deliver them. JoAnn has retired from her job this year, but has been very busy helping out in so many ways. She designed and ordered the signs for the Blessing of the Animals service. She decorated and manned the Outreach table at the Stewardship Fair. She lends a hand whenever asked and always comes to Outreach meetings to offer her valuable input.

Some of our Outreach Committee members also do other things at St. John's like **Valerie Paredes**. In addition to being a valued member of Outreach, Valerie is active on the Altar Guild and assists with Parish Life. This year she volunteered to revamp the bookcase in the Parish Hall. She reviewed the books, made new signs and generally improved the appearance of the bookcase. It had been neglected since the Parish Hall had been closed due to Covid. The proceeds from the sale of the books go to Alzeimer's Research.

We are excited to have a new member of the Committee. We welcome **Robin Eckman** and hope to discover her passions for projects in the coming year. We would like to extend a warm welcome to anyone interested in joining us to help with the Committee's work. I anticipate that we will continue many of our traditional projects, but

would appreciate new suggestions or exploring opportunities for additional projects. Please join us on the 4th Tuesday of every month at 6:30 p.m. in the Armstrong Room.

I have enjoyed my time working with all of the members of the Outreach Committee. Thank you for your time and dedication to make a difference in the lives of others.
