## The Second Lesson

*2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17*

As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you

in any way; for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?

But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. For this purpose he called you through our proclamation of the good news, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word.

Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus and asked him a question, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her."

Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive."

## **The Nicene Creed**

**Celebrant** We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. 

## **Major General Donald R. Gardner, United States Marine Corps (Retired)**

Major General Donald R. Gardner, United States Marine Corps (Retired), is a native of Memphis, Tennessee. While in high school, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps Reserve in 1955, rising to the rank of Sergeant. Upon graduation from Memphis State University in 1960 with a Bachelor of Science degree in History, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps Reserve.

After completing The Basic School at Quantico, Virginia, he was deployed as a member of Battalion Landing Team 2/6 to the U.S. Sixth Fleet and again during the Cuban Contingency Operations. In January 1963, he was assigned to the 2d Reconnaissance Battalion, where he served as the Assistant Operations Officer (Assistant S-3) and as a Company Commander. In August 1963, he integrated into the Regular Marine Corps.

Ordered to Marine Barracks, Bermuda, British West Indies, he was promoted to Captain and served as the Executive Officer until transferred to the Republic of Vietnam in May 1966. There he participated in combat as a Company Commander and later as the Logistics Officer (S-4) of the 3d Reconnaissance Battalion. Following his return from overseas, he reported to Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, Washington, D.C., where he was promoted to Major. Completing a second tour in Vietnam, General Gardner was awarded a scholarship to Memphis State University, where he earned a Master of Arts degree in History in 1973. He then served for three years as the Marine Officer Instructor at Vanderbilt University.

He subsequently attended professional military education at the Marine Corps Command and Staff College and the Naval War College, rising to the rank of Colonel. His later assignments included Assistant Chief of Staff, III Marine Amphibious Force, and Deputy Director, 1st Marine Corps District. Promoted to Brigadier General, he was assigned as Assistant Division Commander, 2d Marine Division (Reinforced), Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. In June 1988, he assumed duties as Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune. He was later promoted to Major General and served as Commanding General, III Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF) and Commanding General, Marine Corps Bases, Japan.

Major General Gardner's personal awards and decorations include the Navy Distinguished Service Medal, Silver Star Medal, Legion of Merit with Combat "V" and Gold Star, Purple Heart Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with Gold Star, Air Medal with Numeral 2, Joint Service Commendation Medal with Combat "V", Navy Commendation Medal with Combat "V", Combat Action Ribbon, Order of the Rising Sun, Third Class (Japan), Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star, and the Armed Forces Honor Medal, First Class. The Order of the Rising Sun, Third Class was presented to Major General Gardner by His Majesty the Emperor of Japan for his dedicated service to the security of Japan and the mutual cooperation between Japan and the United States.

Major General Gardner retired from active duty in 1994 after nearly forty years of faithful and honorable service. Following retirement, he served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Intrepid Sea, Air & Space Museum in New York City, and in 1999 became Chief Executive Officer of the Marine Corps University Foundation. In May 2004, he was appointed the President of Marine Corps University, becoming the first civilian to hold that position, and retired in 2009. He subsequently served on the Veterans Services Foundation for the Commonwealth of Virginia and as Director of the Senior Leadership Development Program for the United States Marine Corps.

Major General Gardner and his wife, Elaine, have two children: Lisa and Thomas (recently deceased). Their daughter, Lisa, is married to Daniel W. O'Connor. The Gardners' spiritual home is St. John's Episcopal Church in Chester, Virginia and have been faithful members for more than 30 years.
