Describe Your Favourite

In IELTS speaking part 2, you may be asked to describe your favourite of something. Here are a few examples:

Describe your favourite book (or film, website, song etc). Describe your favourite season in your country. Describe your favourite shop.

Look at these two examples and note the underlined vocabulary.

Describe a book you have recently read. You should say: what kind of book it is what it is about what sort of people would enjoy it and explain why liked it.

My favourite book is *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald. It is one of the most celebrated novels of the 20th century and I think it is a <u>masterpiece</u>. The novel tells the tragic story of Jay Gatsby, a self-made millionaire, and his pursuit of Daisy Buchanan, a wealthy young woman whom he loved in his youth.

I love this book because it is really <u>compelling</u>. The characters are quite mysterious and you never know what will happen next. It is a real <u>page-turner</u>. I think that anyone who enjoy novels would appreciate this book.

I found the story to be really <u>thought-provoking</u>. In my opinion, the main <u>theme</u> is that success can be <u>illusory</u>. Jay Gatsby is a very wealthy man who appears to have everything, but deep down he is unhappy and soon meets a tragic end.

<u>Masterpiece</u>: a work such as a film or book that is made with great skill.

<u>Compelling</u>: a work of art that has great power to hold your attention.

<u>Page-turner</u>: a book that is so exciting you want to read it quickly.

Thought-provoking: making you think a lot about a subject.

Theme: the main subject of a book, talk, film, etc.

Illusory: not real.

Describe your favourite season in your country. You should say: when that season is what the weather is like at that time of year how that season is different from other seasons and why it is your favourite season.

My favourite season in England is summer. A <u>typical</u> English summer lasts around 4 months between May and August, but when I say that I like the summer, I'm really thinking about the hottest month or two each year. At this time, the temperature is between 20 and 28 degrees. It is warm without being uncomfortably hot.

Obviously the heat is what <u>differentiates</u> summer. Also the trees have leaves and the flowers are in full <u>bloom</u>. It feels that everything is full of life. The <u>landscape</u> looks beautiful when everything is illuminated by the sun. It is my favourite season because most of my favourite memories are of summer. For example, my best family memories are of holidays at the seaside, relaxing and eating ice cream.

<u>Typical</u>: showing all the characteristics that you would usually expect from a particular group of things.

<u>Differentiate</u>: to show or find the difference between things that are compared. <u>Bloom</u>: when a flower blooms, it opens or is open, and when a plant or tree blooms it produces flowers.

<u>Landscape</u>: a large area of countryside, especially in relation to its appearance. <u>Seaside</u>: the area near the sea, especially where people spend their holidays and enjoy themselves.
